

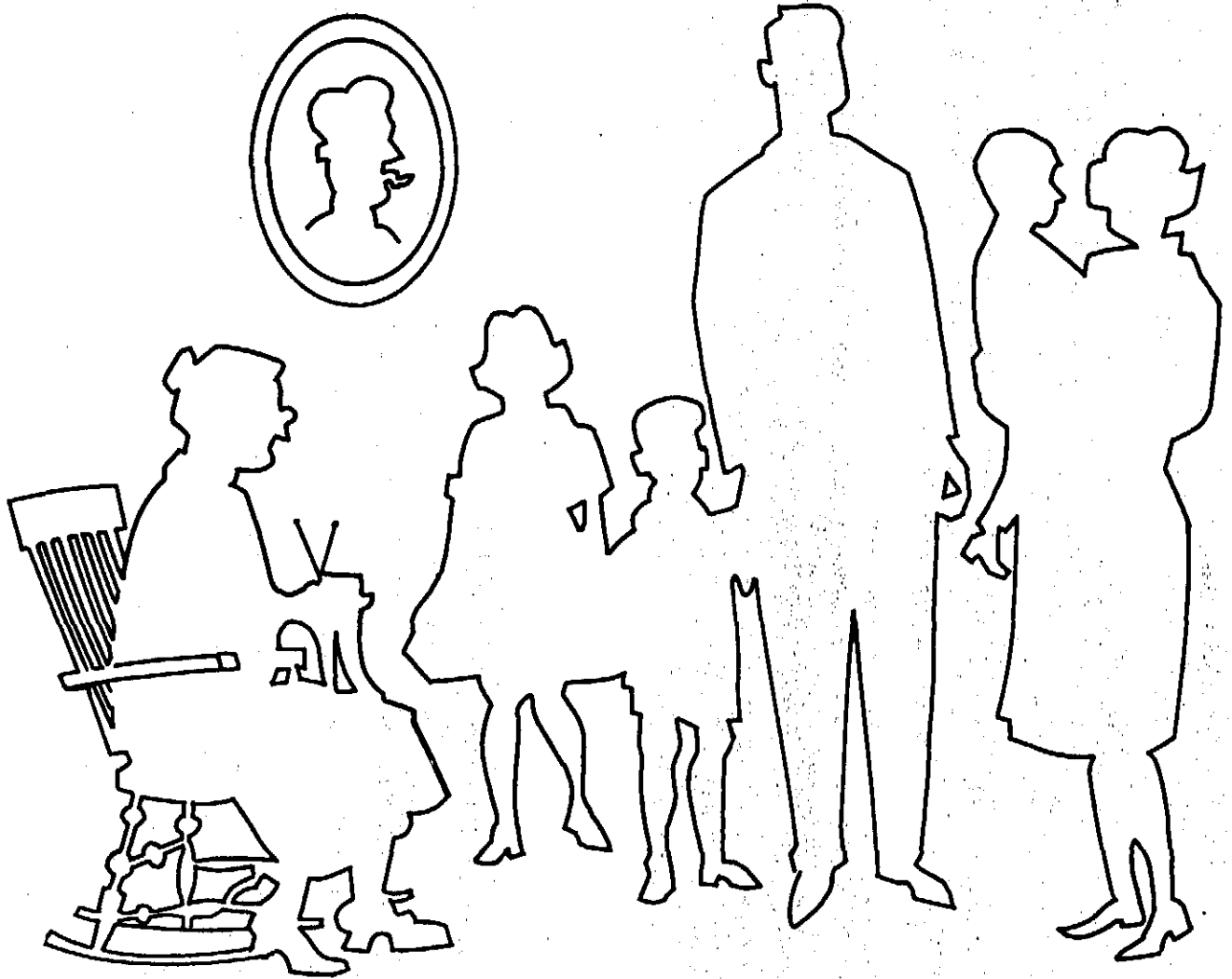

JOHNSON FAMILY  
by  
Eunice Bishop Johnson

Dr. James Randolph Johnson, born May 18, 1773, was the son of John and Jane Johnson of Randolph Co., N. C. On Feb. 8, 1797, he married Sarah Needham, daughter of John and Susannah Needham. Sarah descends from Christopher Needham who was in Maryland before 1640. The following is from Bible records of Wincy Ann Johnson Shelton, youngest child of Dr. James and Sarah Johnson:

Dr. James R. Johnson, d. March 11, 1836, and is buried at Mt. Olive Church, Harris Co., Ga., beside his granddaughter Sarah Ann Elizabeth Johnson, daughter of Major John D. Johnson

Sarah Needham Johnson, wife of Dr. James R. Johnson, born in North Carolina on the 15th day of August, 1779, died Dec. 14, 1872, age 93. Buried at Unity Grove, Pickens Co., Alabama.

Susannah Needham, mother of Sarah Needham Johnson, is also buried in Pickens Co., Ala. She was born Feb. 20, 1743, died July 27, 1841, age 98.

The following record is taken from the Bible of Jesse Johnson, born Jan. 1, 1800, in Randolph Co., N. C.: Children of Dr. James Randolph and Sarah Needham Johnson:

Mr. A. F. Shelton, Montgomery, Ala., furnished data on the families that settled in Pickens Co., Alabama:

- I. Major John D. Johnson, b. July 3, 1798, Randolph Co., N. C., d. Jan. 16, 1871, in Pickens Co., Ala., m. Sept. 12, 1822 to Jane English, dau. of John and Sarah B. English. Major John taught school in N. C. two years, moved to Georgia ca 1827, taught school in Jones and Harris Co., then moved to Pickens Co., Ala. ca 1837. Served in state legislature in 1843-44 and 1853-55. Children: James Randolph, John Forsythe, Julius Caesar Boneparte, Felix English, Sara Ann Elizabeth, Mary Jane and twins Wincy Ann and Cynthia Ann.
- II. Jesse Johnson, b. Jan. 1, 1800, Randolph Co., N. C., d. July 14, 1885, Hempstead Co., Ark., m. Mar. 29, 1825 to Olive Pugh, dau. of Robert and Alcey Kinman Pugh, in Clarke Co., Ala. She was the granddaughter of Jesse and Elizabeth (Stewart) Pugh of Wilkes Co., Ga. Children: James Pugh, Alcey Elizabeth, Sarah Jane, John Elijah, Martha Ann, Armintha L., Wincy Rebecca, Olive Alabama, Jesse, William Meredith and Almedia.

- III. Susannah Johnson, b. Sept. 8, 1801, Randolph Co., N. C., m. William Whittle in N. C. They lived in Pickens Co., Ala. in 1850. Children: John D., Jane, James W., William E. and Jesse T.
- IV. Thomas D. Johnson, b. Dec. 12, 1802, Randolph Co., N. C., d. Feb. 3, 1881, in Ala. Married Cynthia Callicott. Children: Sarah A., Elias C., Adlena, William, Cynthia, John D. and Martha Jane.
- V. Jane Johnson, b. Dec. 25, 1804, Randolph Co., N. C., m. Elliott Lowdermilk, son of John H. and Mary Elliott Lowdermilk. They were married Nov. 7, 1826 in Tuscaloosa, Ala. They were living in Pickens Co., Ala. in 1850, moved to Hempstead Co., Ark. and lived at Old Moscow. Children: James B., Emoline, Sarah A., John E., Jane R., Elizabeth and Randolph.
- VI. James Johnson, b. Dec. 14, 1806, Randolph Co., N. C., d. Sept. 28, 1858 of typhoid fever, buried at Fellowship Church near Reform, Ala. Married to Mrs. Sarah Johnson Bray in Hancock Co., Ga. on Jan. 4, 1826. They were in Pickens Co., Ala. by 1850. Census records show all their children were born in No. Carolina. Children: Hannah S., John Wesley, Sophia, Sarah Fannie, William H., James G. and Julius R.
- VII. Sarah Johnson, b. Apr. 1, 1809, Randolph Co., N. C., m. John W. Guyton. They lived in Pickens Co., Ala. in 1850. Children: Sarah Frances, Mary Anna H., and John D.
- VIII. Elizabeth Johnson, b. May 31, 1811, Randolph Co., N. C., m. Joseph Shippy. They were living in Gwinnett Co., Ga. in 1828 and Muscogee Co., Ga. by 1836. Children: Joseph J. Mary A., Sarah V., John H., Elizabeth C., Missouri F. and James R.
- IX. Enoch S. Johnson, b. Mar. 14, 1813. Only record of him is from the diary of Sarah Needham Johnson and that is his address which is Austin, Texas. From another diary by Nancy Spinks Johnson (wife of Julius Caesar Boneparte Johnson) dated Feb. 17, 1874, Liberty Hill, Texas.
- X. Charles Wesley Johnson, b. Mar. 31, 1815, Randolph Co., d. 1893 in Hempstead Co., Ark., m. --- Rogers. Their children were born in S. C.: Mollie and William Preston.
- XI. William Needham Johnson, b. Nov. 16, 1817, Randolph Co., N. C., d. Aug. 4, 1898 in Hempstead Co., Ark. Married Sept. 12, 1843 in Chatham Co., N. C. to Amy Brady Johnson, dau. of John and Mary Johnson. William and Amy Johnson moved to Hempstead Co., Ark. in 1846, bought a farm on the Old Military Road three miles east of Washington, Ark. Children: Sarah Elizabeth, Mary Jane, Lucy Ann, Frances Loueaser, Roxanah Amelia, John Atlas, Henry Jesse and Eros Belle.
- XII. Martha C. Johnson, b. Nov. 19, 1820, m. Elbert McGowen. According to an old letter written Mar. 31, 1895, by a granddaughter of William Needham Johnson to a daughter of Wincy Ann Johnson Shelton, Martha McGowen was living in Hempstead Co., Ark. at that time. "Aunt Martha is living with her son Preston. She has four living children, three girls and one boy."
- XIII. Wincy Ann Johnson, b. Oct. 10, 1822, Randolph Co., N. C., m. in Pickens Co., Ala. to Jeremiah Freeman Shelton. She died July 20, 1916. Children: Julius C., Cornelia Jane, Sarah Frances, Jeremiah Freeman, Ella Ann and Zuela J.

\* II. Jesse Johnson went to Clarke Co., Ala. at an unknown date. He married Olive Pugh, daughter of Robert and Alcey Kinman Pugh on Mar. 29, 1825. Olive Pugh descends from James and Jean Price Pugh who came from Wales in 1682 and settled in Pennsylvania.

Jesse and Olive Pugh Johnson moved to Hempstead Co., Ark. ca 1841 and purchased a tract of land located about five miles west of what is now the town of Prescott, Ark. He was a gunsmith, blacksmith and wagon builder and he built a shop on the main road from Arkansas to Texas. He had a large farm and there was a prairie ten miles wide which provided plenty of grass for the livestock. He raised race horses, mules, cattle, hogs and sheep and was very successful in his efforts.

In 1855 he donated 30 acres of land to be used as a site for a Masonic Lodge, a Cumberland Presbyterian Church, a cemetery for people of color and a cemetery for white people. However, there was a clause in the deed which stated that "no thief or murderer shall be buried there" (Recorded in Nevada Co., Ark. Deed Records, Book "G", pages 100-167). He owned a number of slaves and in 1863 he loaned the Confederate States of America a sizable amount of gold and silver (Original receipt in my files). He died on July 14, 1885, and his wife, Olive Pugh Johnson, died on Aug. 1, 1864. They are buried in Artesian Cemetery (land donated by them) in marked graves. Their children were:

- A. James Pugh Johnson, b. Dec. 24, 1825 in Clarke Co., Ala.; m. Sept. 11, 1849 to Sarah Calhoun.
  - B. Alcey Elizabeth Johnson, b. July 12, 1828, Clarke Co., Ala.; d. Nov. 24, 1873, m. Jan. 29, 1846 to John M. Whiteside, b. June 28, 1822, d. Mar. 22, 1886. They are buried in Oakland Cemetery at Camden, Ark.
  - C. Sarah Jane Johnson, b. Nov. 7, 1830, Clarke Co., Ala., m. --- Cravens, moved to Texas. No other record.
  - D. John Elijah Johnson, b. Jan. 10, 1833, Clarke Co., Ala., m. Aug. 27, 1857 to Elizabeth Cobb. They went to California during the gold rush, both had yellow fever; she died and he was left a cripple for life. He died Dec. 30, 1909, is buried in Artesian Cemetery near Prescott, Ark.
  - E. Martha Ann Johnson, b. Dec. 30, 1835, Clarke Co., Ala., m. July 5, 1854 to Dr. Henry Holcombe. Both are buried in Childress, Texas. Children: Annie Elizabeth.
  - F. Armintha L. Johnson, b. Nov. 28, 1837, d. Dec. 5, 1837, Clarke Co., Ala.
  - G. Wincy Rebecca Johnson, b. Mar. 14, 1839, d. Jan. 3, 1841, Clarke Co., Ala.
  - H. Olive Alabama Johnson, b. Dec. 12, 1843, Hempstead Co., Ark., m. Feb. 14, 1866 to William T. Stevenson. They lived in Hugo, Oklahoma.
- \*\* I. Jesse Johnson, Jr., b. June 28, 1846, Hempstead Co., Ark. (See information next page)
- J. William Meridith Johnson, b. Oct. 13, 1850, Hempstead Co., Ark., m. Sally Bryant. They lived at Athens, La. Children: Prather, Jessie (girl) and Bennie.

K. Almedia I. Johnson, b. Jan. 13, 1853, Hempstead Co., Ark., d. May 17, 1909, m. in 1869 to Samuel Cantley, son of William and Martha (Tyree) Cantley. Samuel Cantley was born Sept. 6, 1843, d. June 2, 1930. Both are buried in the cemetery at Old Moscow Church near Prescott, Ark. Children: Laura, Willie J., Ollie, Annie, Bertha, Pearl, Exa and Luther.

Jesse Johnson's first wife, Olive Pugh Johnson, d. Aug. 1, 1864. He married second Sarah Ann Holcombe Smith on Feb. 19, 1865. She was the widow of David Christopher Smith and a sister of Dr. Henry Holcombe, who married Jesse's daughter, Martha Ann Johnson. Children born to Jesse Johnson and Sarah Ann Holcombe were:

- L. Joseph Johnson, b. Dec. 18, 1865, d. Aug. 24, 1894.
- M. Henry Holcombe Johnson, b. Nov. 26, 1867, d. May 5, 1936. Lived in Louisiana.
- N. Rufus Garland Johnson, b. June 22, 1870, d. Oct. 18, 1881.

\*\* I. Jesse Johnson, Jr., b. June 28, 1846, Hempstead Co., Ark., son of Jesse Johnson and Olive Pugh Johnson. He served 1863-65 in Co. A, 10th Reg., Ark. Cav. He married first Aug. 19, 1866 to Sarah Frances Stidham, who died in 1886. They had one child:

- 1. Willie Belle Johnson, b. Dec. 7, 1868, d. Jan. 29, 1942, m. Aug. 18, 1904 to Thomas Jefferson Hallman, b. Aug. 9, 1856, d. Nov. 21, 1926. They lived at Olney, Texas. Children: Bryan.

Jesse Johnson, Jr. m. second on Mar. 27, 1888 to Nancy Elizabeth Dickson. She was born May 12, 1860, d. May 1, 1909, the daughter of Jefferson Josiah Dickson and Sarah Frances Timmons, and the granddaughter of Josiah Dickson and Mary L. Walker, and of William Everette Timmons and Arcena Moore. Jesse Johnson died May 1, 1925. He and his wife are buried at Waldo, Ark., where they lived and where all of their children were born:

- 2. Byron Everette Johnson, b. Oct. 13, 1889, d. Feb. 1, 1956, m. Aug. 28, 1923 to Olive Wallace. Children: Lora Olive.
- 3. Ethel Maude Johnson, b. Aug. 28, 1892, m. Feb. 28, 1937 to G. C. Cleveland. He died March 1941. No children.
- 4. Marvin Dickson Johnson, b. Feb. 18, 1895, d. Mar. 3, 1967, m. July 4, 1923 to Grace Samuelson, b. Aug. 20, 1900 at St. Croix Falls, Wis.; they live at Conway, Ark. Children: Marvin Dickson, Jr., Anamarie, Walter Calvin, Idalee, Estelle Sylvia, Dorthy Ruth, Carolyn Higdon and Betty Fate.
- 5. Reed Gillespie Johnson, b. July 25, 1897, m. May 26, 1923 to Eunice Julia Bishop, b. June 7, 1898 in St. Clair Co., Ala. They live at El Dorado, Ark. Children: William Reed Johnson.
- 6. Jesse Meredith Johnson, b. Sept. 25, 1900, m. Aug. 23, 1922 to Rubye Shoemaker, b. Aug. 19, 1901. They live at Ferriday, La. Children: Winnifred Jean (daughter) and Jesse Hugh.
- 7. Floyd Lafayette Johnson, b. Apr. 21, 1903, m. Jan. 6, 1935 to Louise Higginbottom. They live at Springfield, Mo. Children: Floyd Lafayette, Jr., Iris Annette and Janice Marie.

REVOLUTIONARY WAR PENSIONERS WHO LIVED IN ARKANSAS

ADAMS, Francis (widow, Mary)

South Carolina service

Francis Adams was born Nov. 24, 1763, place not stated. He enlisted July, 1778, age 14 years and six months, from Washaw (or Waxsaw) Settlement, in what is now Lancaster District, South Carolina, and served until Nov. 1781. On Nov. 27, 1812, he married Mrs. Mary Ryan, daughter of William Farrell, all of Lancaster District, S. C. They were married by James Witherspoon.

The soldier applied for a pension based on his military record on Dec. 18, 1832, age 69, from McDonough, Second District, Henry Co., Ga. One of his affiants was General David Adams of Jasper Co., Ga., who stated that he was a near neighbor to the soldier in Waxhaw Settlement, now Lancaster District, S. C. General Adams said he knew the said Adams to be "an honest man and as brave as anyone of that part of the country". Other affiants were Ivy F. Stegall, clergyman, and William L. Crayton, both of Henry Co., Ga.

On Jan. 5, 1843, the veteran transferred his pension payments from Ga. to Noxubee Co., Miss. He gave as his reason for moving: ". . . leaving poor land under high rent to go where I can get better land". Affiant was Abram Adams of Noxubee Co., Miss. (A letter enclosed in his file, dated Jan. 26, 1843, from Mason, Miss. and written by the veteran to "Dear Sis" told her of his move to Miss.)

The veteran died Sept. 12, 1846, in Noxubee Co., Miss. His widow, Mary (Farrell) Ryan Adams, applied for a pension Nov. 21, 1853, from El Dorado, Union Co., Ark. Affidavits for her were given by William R. Cowser, James H. Cowser and Elizabeth Cowser, all of Union Co., Ark. William N. and Elizabeth Cowser testified that they knew the couple when they lived in Noxubee Co., Miss. Also enclosed in the file was a letter written Apr. 25, 1859, on behalf of the widow Mary Adams by F. M. Adams, relationship not given.

ANGEL, Lawrence (or Laurence)

North Carolina Service

S 31519

Lawrence Angel was born in Rowan Co. (the part that is now Surry Co.), No. Carolina, in the year 1760. He was drafted July, 1776, while a resident of Surry Co. He volunteered in Aug., 1780, while still a resident of Surry Co., again in May, 1781, and again in Oct., 1781, serving this time as a substitute. He resided in Surry Co., N. C. until 1812, "since which time he has lived in the States of Kentucky and Tennessee, and now resides in Neneveh township, Johnson Co., Indiana".

On Nov. 12, 1832, age 72, from Johnson Co., Indiana, he applied for and received a pension based on his military service. Affidavits for him were given by: John Thompson, Richard Perry and Elijah Bowling, a clergyman. All were of Johnson Co., Indiana.

The veteran transferred his pension payments from the Roll of Indiana to Arkansas Territory to take effect Sept., 1833. On Mar. 18, 1834 he lived in Independence Co., Territory of Arkansas, where "he has lived the two months and a half past". On this date affidavits were given for the soldier by James Angel and Polly Angel of Independence Co., who identified the soldier to William Arnold, J. P. The Judge stated that he knew James and Polly Angel personally.

The soldier moved from Arkansas Territory to Jefferson Co., Mo. before Nov. 25, 1836, the date of his death. It was stated that he "left no widow and only two sons, both of lawful age". Final payments from the veteran's pension were claimed for James Angel and Jesse Angel, his "lawful Heirs" by their attorney, Gabriel Jones Johnson of Jefferson Co., Mo.

**BAGLEY, Asher**  
New Jersey Service  
S 46367

In 1828 the veteran, Asher Bagley, applied for a pension based on his service in Captain Aaron Ogden's New Jersey Line. Affidavits on his behalf were made by Alexander L. Walker and Sam C. Roane, both residents of Big Rock twp., Pulaski Co., Territory of Arkansas.

Asher Bagley died Nov. 16, 1840 and mention was made that he left a widow and several children; no names given. On Apr. 16, 1841 a final payment voucher was paid to his widow, Catharine Bagley of Benton, Saline Co., Ark. Affidavits for the widow were made by Green B. Hughes and David Dodd.

**BALLEW, Joseph**  
North Carolina Service  
S 31541

Joseph Ballew was born in 1757 or 1758 in Buckingham Co., Va. "from there my father moved to Burke Co., N. C., near Morganton, there I continued to live for several years after the War was over; I moved from Burke Co. to Kentucky, Knox Co., and I lived in Kentucky until about seven years since; moved to Alabama and lived there two years and moved to Tennessee, Shelby Co., where I now live".

He entered service from Burke Co., N. C., before the Battle of King's Mountain, campaign of 1782.

On Oct. 16, 1832, while resident of Shelby Co., Tenn., age 75, "on 17th of March next", he applied for and received a pension based on his service in the Revolutionary War. Affidavits on his behalf were made by Eppy White, John K. Balch, both residents of Shelby Co., Tenn. Also an affidavit was made on his behalf, Oct., 1832, from Hardeman Co., Tenn. by William Walker, a lieutenant in the Revolutionary War. An affidavit was made by Ashael Dancer, a clergyman, resident of Shelby Co.

On May 3, 1834 from White Co., Ark., where he moved to "reside with his children, some of whom have settled in said county", he made the request that his pension applications be transferred to the Arkansas Agency. Affidavits were made on his behalf by R. J. Ballew, son of Joseph, and John Humphries.

**BLACK, William**  
Pennsylvania Service  
S 31554

William Black was born July 18, 1755 in Lancaster Co., Pa. (Record of his age taken from his father's Bible.) On Nov. 21, 1776 he was commissioned captain of Pennsylvania militia while a resident of Cumberland Co., Pa.

The soldier testified that in 1784 he moved to Washington Co., N. C.; in 1804 to Knox Co., N. C. (Tennessee?); and from there to Madison Co., Ala.; and in 1819 to Limestone Co., Ala. On Dec. 10, 1832 while a resident of Limestone Co., Ala., he applied for and received a pension based on his service in the Revolutionary War. Affidavits were made on his behalf by Robert Donnell, clergyman, and Thomas Maclin, both residents of Limestone Co.

He moved to Hempstead Co., Territory of Arkansas, in March, 1834. In that year he stated that he had a brother and son who were living in the Territory of Arkansas. (Mention was made that William Black "resides near one hundred miles from any post office.") Affidavits on his behalf were made by Patrick Landefer; Absalom Mading, J. P.; Allen M. Oakely, clerk of the court; all residents of Hempstead Co., Territory of Arkansas.

BOYD, William  
North Carolina Service  
\* R 1094

William Boyd was born Aug. 11, 1760 in Southampton Co., Va. He enlisted in April, 1777 while a resident of Rowan Co., N. C. After the War he lived in Montgomery Co., N. C.; Warren Co., Tenn.; Lauderdale Co., Ala.; McNairy Co., Tenn.; and Washington Co., Ark.

On Dec. 11, 1832 while a resident of Washington Co., Territory of Arkansas, he applied\* for a pension based on his service in the Revolutionary War. An affidavit was made in his behalf by N. L. (or S.) Lafferty, a clergyman. References were made to his neighbors: Stephen Stricklin, clergyman; Sebron G. Sneed; James Byrnside; John W. Caurch (sp.); Reuben W. Reynold; Abel Oxford; Lewis B. Tully; all residents of Washington Co. in 1834.

In 1836 affidavits were made in his behalf by William Loften and William M. K. Ball. (William Loften referred to his father and grandfather, one of whom may have been Colonel William Loften of North Carolina.) In 1837 reference was made to "persons residing in my present neighborhood", namely: Rev. William T. Larrimore; Sibron G. Sneed; Byron H. Smithson, clerk of the court; the Honorable Archibald Yell; Lucius C. Pleasant; and Thomas Wilson. In 1837 the applicant signed himself as William Boyd, Sr.

In June, 1854, it was stated that William Boyd was dead and reference was made to his heirs, but no names were given.

\* His claim for a pension was not allowed as he failed to furnish proof of his service as required by the pension laws.

For the soldier's complete service record, including engagements, battles, injuries received in line of duty, names of officers, etc., write to the National Archives, Washington, D. C. 20408, and request Form NA-288. Fill out this form, using only the three lines that precede each abstract (as above), enclose one dollar per each request, and return to the National Archives. Orders take about three weeks.

DID YOU KNOW?

The oldest family in the United States is believed to be the Solana family of St. Augustine, Florida. Their records in St. Augustine go back to 1594 and they are believed to be the oldest documented family with continuous residence in this country. There are other Spanish families in the city whose ancestry can be traced back even further, but it is believed that none of these stayed in St. Augustine as the Solanas did during the English occupation (1763-1783), and there is therefore a break in their history as residents of this country. Records of the Solana family are preserved in the Catholic Cathedral at St. Augustine.

Genealogy now ranks third in the United States as a do-it-yourself hobby, surpassed only by stamp collecting and coin collecting.

## THE SIPES FAMILY

John Mitchell Sipes, an early settler of Craighead Co., was born in Buchanan Co., Mo. on July 18, 1840. His father, Eli Sipes, had been born and reared in Pennsylvania. Eli's mother was a Powers (of the Black Dutch family who made quinine famous in Philadelphia).

Eli Sipes married Christinia Ryan or Rhyan, who came from South Carolina. They were married in Uniontown, Perry Co., Mo. In addition to their son, John M., they had a son, Shepherd C., and two girls, Mary and Ann or Nan. The sisters married Joe and John Smith, early settlers in Greene Co. You can read about them in Goodspeed's History of Greene Co.

Eli and Christinia Sipes helped to settle Buchanan Co., Mo. They later moved to Greene Co., Ark. Both died in that county and we know that Christinia is buried at Pruitt's Chapel Cemetery near Paragould.

After Eli died, John M. entered the Confederate Service in 1861, enlisting in Greene Co. in the Eighth Ark. Inf. and served until the final surrender. He took part in the Battle of Shiloh and the battles at Perryville, Murfreesboro, Chattanooga and many smaller ones. He fought under Gen. Albert Sidney Johnston.

After the war, John M. met and married Nancy Smith, a young girl living with a family by the name of Armstrong in Sharp Co., who had been reared by the family of Henderson Renfrow. John M. and Nancy moved to Mud Slough in the edge of Missouri on the Poke Gist place. They remained there for about a year, when John bought a farm in the edge of Arkansas. He then moved his family down the St. Francis River and across the Cynacee Slough to a lean-to built on the highest spot. Some of his gr-grandchildren still live on this spot.

To the marriage of John M. and Nancy were born the following children: Joel, Serena, George W., Rose Ann, Julia C. and Henry.

Joel married Rhoda Hollis and their children were: Little John and Little Henry. Little John married Lela Fuller and their children were Joel, Lavada, Phoebe and John Elvin (Baby Jack). Little Henry married Elmira Dodd; their children were Alice (m. Roy Anderson), Rhoda (m. Homer Summerhill) and two boys born dead. Elmira m. 2nd Lonnie Harris.

Serena married John Henry Rule; their only child was Vinnia, who married Mitchell Baldrige. After Serena died, John Henry remarried and Vinnia had a half-brother, David.

George W. married Josie Gist and they lived together about a year and were divorced without any children having been born. He then married Della Mary Ashby. Their children were: Lawrence; Alvie (died age 21, unmarried); Gracie; Lula (died while a baby); Flora; Mary; Elsie (died at age 8); Eugene; Ruth; Ida; Aaron and Lucille (died in infancy).

We know little about Rose Ann. She was a deaf-mute and I suppose she died young.

Julia C. married Craven C. Fort. Their children are: Jessie, Reah, Roy, William, Johnny and Alieta. Reah married Pinkey Taylor.

Henry married Molly Dodd. Molly's people had been early settlers in the Walcott area. Their children were: Catherine, Charlie, Elbert, Marlin, Newton, Bernice and Jack.

John M. Sipes began operating a grist mill and cotton gin in 1881, which burned down in 1887. He then put up a steam saw-mill and cotton gin.

One of the first school houses in that area was built on land donated by John M. Sipes in 1889. It was called the "Sipes Schoolhouse", John M. being one of the directors along with John H. Baldrige and Frank Newcom.

In 1893 John M. deeded land to F. M. Newcom, H. F. Ball and J. L. Gist, Trustees of Jonathan Lodge No. 115, I. O. O. F., so that this community organization might have a permanent place to meet. The lodge was later moved to Monette.

## THE CLINGAN CLAN

A few of us "Clingan Cousins" have compiled a rather extensive history on The Clingan Clan. We have over 100 typed pages of Clingan history, but I want to give only a brief outline of the older generations here.

There are several versions as to the origin of our Clingan family to America, so I'll give the one that has been handed down in my own family. The first known ancestor is George Clingan. All we know about him is his name. We don't know who he married nor how many children he had. We do know of at least three sons. About 1768 three of his sons, William, John and Edward settled in Pennsylvania near where the town of Sharon now stands. This is in Mercer Co. which borders Ohio.

Our branch of the family descends from Edward Clingan, who was born June 3, 1750, Old Style, which was June 14, 1750, by our calendar. From his book of records, we find:

"Moved in this book October the 26th day, 1806. Edward Clingan, son of George Clingan, was born June the 14th day in the year of our Lord 1750. On June the 3rd Old Stile 1750. Jennet Kinkaid, my present wife, was born March the 26th day 1774. This is my book of records. If I lose it and you find it, return it to me. Look up to the head and you will know my name. 1806 -

Edward Clingan and Elizabeth Patton was married February the 15th day 1774, and the same Elizabeth Patton my wife departed this life April the 15th day 1792.

Mary Clingan my daughter was born November the 25th day early in the morning 1774.

Margaret Clingan my daughter was born March the 20th day early in the morning 1775.

Elizabeth Clingan my daughter was born April the 2nd day about sun rise 1779.

John Patton Clingan my son was born Mary the 17th day, about two o'clock in the afternoon, 1786.

George Washington Clingan my son was born October the 26th day about an hour of up sun at hight 1789.

Edward Clingan and Jennete Kinkaid was married October the 11th day 1792.

Thomas Kind Clingan my son was born August the 26th day, about an hour of up sun in the evening 1793.

William Davidson Clingan my son was born July the 4th day, about sun rise in the morning 1795.

Edward Clingan my son was born February the 16th day between daylight and sun rise 1797.

David Clingan my son was born February the 2nd day between dark and midnight 1799.

Alexander Adams Clingan my son was born February the 20th day about breakfast time 1801.

James Cowan Clingan my son was born May the 6th day between sun down and dark 1803.

Matilda Clingan my daughter was born February the 20th day about 10 o'clock in the morning 1805.

Edward Clingan my son was born January the 17th day 1808."

Since Edward Clingan, the father of these children, died June 17, 1807, then the birth of his last child must have been entered by his wife.

The children of Edward Clingan, Sr. and Elizabeth Patton must have been born in Virginia, because my gr-grandfather stated that Edward Clingan moved to Virginia about 1774. Elizabeth Patton Clingan must have died in Tennessee, and the children of Edward Clingan, Sr. and Jennet Kincaid must have been born in Tennessee, because my gr-grandfather stated that Edward Clingan moved to Tennessee about the year 1790 and settled in Rhea Co., Tennessee.

On some of these lines we have a good history and on other lines we have very little or absolutely nothing more than is given here. My line of descent is from the youngest son of Edward Clingan, Sr. and Jennet Kincaid, Edward Clingan, Jr. who was born Feb. 17, 1808, in Rhea Co., Tenn.

In Rhea Co., Tenn., he married his first wife, Frances Caroline Tims, on May 23, 1833. They must have moved almost immediately to Bradley Co., Tenn., where the following children were born:

1. Nancy Jane Clingan was born March 21, 1835.
2. William Jasper Clingan was born June 5, 1836.
3. Darfus Alexander Clingan was born October 17, 1837.
4. Matilda Clingan was born April 14, 1839.
5. Thomas Jefferson Clingan was born Feb. 4, 1841. He is my gr-grandfather, and it is from him that we have learned a lot of extra details on the family.
6. James Polk Clingan was born December 16, 1842.
7. Andrew Jackson Clingan was born September 6, 1845.

Edward Clingan, Jr. and Frances Caroline Tims moved from Bradley Co., Tenn. to Clark Co., Ark. in 1847, in a big four-horse wagon, and settled seven miles west of Arkadelphia. He homesteaded the northwest quarter of Sec. 8, Township 7, Range 20. Their last child was born in Clark Co., Ark.

8. George Washington Clingan was born May 1, 1848.

Frances Caroline Tims died Dec. 23, 1848. Edward's mother came to live with them until her death. Edward Clingan, Jr. married second in Clark Co., Ark., Feb. 2, 1860, to Mrs. Zillah Ann Witt, nee Harrington. She was born Jan. 24, 1829, and died at Fulton, Hempstead Co., Ark., July 22, 1892. To Edward Clingan, Jr. and Zillah Ann Harrington Witt were born:

9. John Edward Clingan was born October 26, 1860.
10. David Howell Clingan was born June 11, 1862.
11. Robert Lee Clingan was born September 11, 1864.
12. Julia Tennessee Clingan was born March 1, 1866.
13. Milton Henry Clingan was born April 23, 1868.

These last five children were all born in Clark Co., Ark.

We have a rather extensive history of most of the children of Edward Clingan, Jr., but of one or two, we only know who the particular child married. We are in the process of compiling a "Clingan Clan" history, and if anyone who reads this outline descends from this family, I would certainly appreciate hearing from him. I would be happy to share what I have on any of these lines and request others to also share with me.

## WAYLAND ARBOR CEMETERY

Henry Wayland was concerned that the families had no place to worship so he donated land for this purpose and a brush covered arbor was built; later a more substantial arbor covered with shingles was needed.

The early settlers were English people of Anglo Saxon descent and chiefly Methodist. The settlement or community was called Iuka.

Henry Wayland and his second wife, Mary E. (Matthews) deeded the land on Feb. 12, 1872 to the Methodist for the Wayland Arbor Cemetery. The trustees for the church were: Thomas Hively, T. H. Wayland, F. R. Noe, Alford Swaffur and W. H. Swan.
