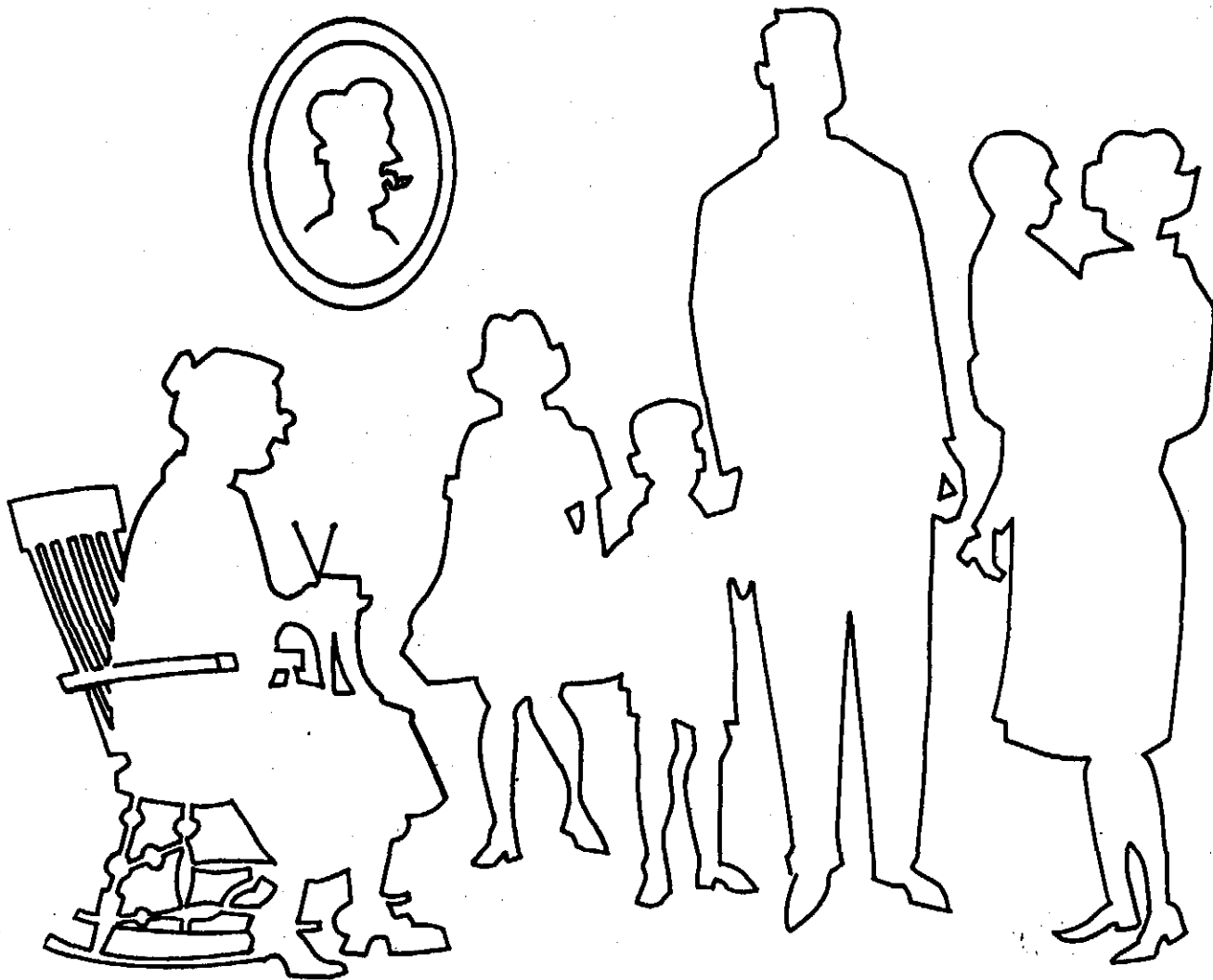

DR. WALTER J. LEMKE, FOUNDER OF
ARKANSAS GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY, DIES

Dr. Walter J. Lemke, founder of the Arkansas Genealogical Society and first editor of "The Arkansas Family Historian" died unexpectedly at his Fayetteville home, Wednesday, December 4, 1968. He was 77.

Dr. Lemke was Professor Emeritus of the Department of Journalism at the University of Arkansas, a department he began in 1928, coming to Arkansas from Chicago where he was employed as a newspaperman on the "Tribune".

Although not a "native-born" son of Arkansas (he was born in Wisconsin), Dr. Lemke was intensely interested in Arkansas history. In 1932 he began drawing a weekly cartoon for the "Arkansas Gazette" called "Men Who Made Arkansas". Then in 1936, the year of the Arkansas statehood centennial, he did a series called "This Day In Arkansas History" that ran in the Fort Smith and Fayetteville papers.

After his retirement from the University in 1959 he devoted an increasing amount of his time to historical research in Arkansas. He organized and founded the Washington County Historical Society at Fayetteville, and until his death was editor of its publication "Flashback".

In 1962 when the Arkansas Historical Association met in Fayetteville, Dr. Lemke called a meeting of those interested in family history and the Arkansas Genealogical Society was organized. He became editor of "The Arkansas Family Historian" and edited nine quarterly issues until he retired as editor in May, 1964.

At its quarterly meeting on December 14th, the Board of Directors of the Arkansas Genealogical Society voted to send a memorial to the Walter J. Lemke Scholarship Fund. Most of the amount sent was subscribed by the Board members personally.

W. E. BAILEY ELECTED PRESIDENT
OF SOCIETY AT ANNUAL MEETING

Mr. W. E. Bailey of Enola was elected president of the Arkansas Genealogical Society at its annual meeting held in Conway, October 13th. Mr. Bailey has served for two years as secretary-treasurer of the Society. He succeeds Dr. James S. Upton of Conway.

Other officers elected were: Miss Annie Laurie Spencer, El Dorado, Vice-president; and Mrs. Duncan B. Brown, Jr., Little Rock, Secretary-Treasurer. New members of the Board of Directors are Mrs. Hayle P. Hollis, Camden, and Mrs. Jerry P. Glover, Pine Bluff; Re-elected to the Board were: Mrs. F. O. Griffin, Sr., Helena; Mrs. Lawrence Newton, Hampton; and Miss Spencer. All Directors are elected for three-year terms.

Board members whose terms expire at the end of this year are: Mrs. H. Guy Gardner, Russellville, and Miss Mary Hudgins, Hot Springs.

Speakers for the meeting were: Mrs. Albert L. Waring of Hughes, Arkansas, author of "The Fighting Elder: Andrew Pickens, 1739-1817", published by the University of South Carolina Press in 1962, who told of her research on the life of Andrew Pickens; Mrs. Lawrence Newton of Hampton, Arkansas, who spoke on "Holderness, Arkansas"; and Dr. H. L. Minton of Conway, who spoke on "Routes of Immigrants Into Arkansas".

A welcoming address was given by Dr. Silas D. Snow, president of State College of Arkansas in Conway, where the meeting was held. Dr. James S. Upton, president of AGS, served as master of ceremonies. During intermission refreshments were served by Mrs. Upton. Approximately sixty persons attended the meeting.

AGS BOARD MEETING HELD IN LITTLE ROCK

Officers and members of the Board of Directors of Arkansas Genealogical Society met Saturday, December 14th, in the Little Rock Public Library. Fourteen Directors and one visitor were present.

Tentative plans were made to hold a regional workshop in Pine Bluff, Saturday, March 15. Dr. James B. Upton, president, appointed the following committee to make arrangements for the workshop: Mrs. Lawrence Newton, Miss Annie Laurie Spencer, Miss Jennie Belle Lyle, Mrs. Johnita Holmes Glover and Mrs. J. A. Billings.

At the conclusion of the meeting, Dr. Upton was presented with a plaque from the Society in appreciation of his service as president. The incoming president, Mr. W. E. Bailey, made the presentation.

DR. UPTON IS LIFE MEMBER

Dr. James S. Upton, retiring president of Arkansas Genealogical Society, has been voted a life membership in the Society by the Society's Board of Directors. Dr. Upton recently published a booklet 'Finding Arkansas Ancestors' at his own expense and has donated all proceeds from the sale of the books to the Society.

Life memberships are usually obtained by paying \$100. to the Society in one installment. The Society has one other life member, Mrs. J. Clifford Hill of Jonesboro.

AGS RECEIVES GIFT OF BOOKS

Mrs. Catherine L. Knorr of Pine Bluff, Arkansas, recently presented to the Society thirteen of her books on Virginia marriage records. Each book represents an index of marriages in a different county in Virginia during the early years of the state, some as early as 1747. A complete listing of the books by Mrs. Knorr and price of each will be found on page 141.

BLACKS OF ARKANSAS

The article "Blacks of Arkansas" which appeared in the last issue of 1967 brought so many letters on the Black family that time has been taken to fit as many as fit into this Black family. Many are not of this family, but whole branches of the family have been found since the first article appeared. These were in Arkansas, completely unknown to the compiler until then. MOSES JOHNSON, JR. -- A GENEALOGICAL PROBLEM

We are publishing below and on the next page some correspondence relating to a hunt for a lost ancestor who turned up in Arkansas. We found the story very interesting and we think it illustrates how revealing census data can be. Mr. Johnson located his ancestor, but solving that puzzle brought a new set of questions which Mr. Johnson lists in his letters. He would welcome correspondence with anyone who might have information for him on his ancestor.

The Arkansas Genealogical Society

For the past three years the writer has been researching and writing the family history. In the process of doing this I had easily located my gr-gr-grandfather, Moses Johnson Jr., as having been born in Putney, Vt. in 1804. In 1822 he came to Cambridge, Mass., married Sarah Robinson in 1825 and sired four children.

Sometime between 1837 and 1840, during the hard times following the financial panic of 1837, family tradition has it that he left his family in Cambridge and went West to reestablish himself and was never heard from again. No one in my family today ever knew where he went or what happened to him. In writing my family history I ended his career on that note.

Recently however I ran across some old letters in his father's Revolutionary War pension folder in the National Archives in Washington D. C. One of these letters is dated April 6, 1855 and is written by his sister, Mrs. Jane W. (Johnson) Hallenbeck. In it she applies for any back pension which may have been due her father after his death in 1835 and states that her brother, Moses Johnson, Jr. is living in Arkansas. Upon reading this my reaction was naturally "so that's where he went".

All this may tie in to three old letters written by the wife he left in Cambridge to one of her sons and which have been preserved in my family. All three letters are dated in July 1859 in Vicksburg, Miss. One has a sentence "Our business is a hard case and if we get anything it be in land." There is no other indication as to what she was doing in the South. She had returned to Cambridge by summer 1860. I cannot imagine anything which would have taken her so far from home unless it had something to do with her husband. I suspect he died either in Mississippi or Arkansas sometime between 1855 and 1859.

My reason for writing is to ask if you could suggest a source of information to which I could write to see if the name Moses Johnson Jr. is recorded in the period mentioned with regard to land, residence and death records or records of cemetery inscriptions in Arkansas. I have no idea in which town or county he might have lived.

Dear Mrs. Murphy:

As a result of your reply, July 17, 1968 to my letter of July 5, 1968, I wrote to Mrs. Gerald B. McLant of Hot Springs who is listed in your Researchers List and requested a search of the 1840, 1850 and 1860 Arkansas censuses to see if any evidence of my gr-gr-grandfather could be found. His name was Moses Johnson, Jr. The attached sheet is a copy of what she has send me. The data, I am convinced, is of my ancestor.

This is probably my ancestor but he has loped a few years off his age in order to bring it closer to that of the woman who is apparently his new wife. They have apparently had a child born in 1846 or 1847 and named after the James Wright who, we deduce, is a brother of Louisa's. Moses was actually 45 years old.

This data is revealing. It indicates that three daughters were born to Moses and Louisa, that Moses died between 1855 and 1858, that his wife remarried and had Moses' children with her. The names of those three daughters are significant; they are the names of Moses' three sisters back East.

There are several things I would now like to find out about him if possible, such as:
 Did he get a legal divorce from his Cambridge wife?
 When and where did he marry Louisa?
 Was it formal or common law?
 When and where did his death occur?
 Where is he buried?
 Did he leave a will and any probate records?
 What became of his four children by Louisa?

Perhaps I want too much and records of these things just do not exist. In any event I will probably be interested in Arkansas Genealogy for some time, so I am enclosing a check for \$5.00 for a membership in your Society and a years subscription to the Arkansas Family Historian.

In the meantime, the township of Surrounded Hill puzzles me somewhat. According to the 1850 and 1860 censuses it was in Monroe County, but in a 1906 map of Arkansas which I have, a Surrounded Hill is shown on the east bank of the White River in Prairie County, next to Monroe County. In my 1965 Atlas there is no such township listed in either county. Do you know what happened to the town?

THE CARR FAMILY

(These notes copied from Ford Barr Hanna's notes owned by his daughters. Most of this was compiled by Mrs. Annette Wilson Smith, assisted by her husband, Capt. M. O. Smith, USA. Copied February 16, 1968, by Jo Whitmore Dildy, Box 155, Nashville, Ark. 71852)

Thomas Carr, born ca 1651, is the first of the Carr family we have any knowledge of in America. He settled in Virginia and received many grants of land, among them one for 546 acres in St. John's Parish and another in King and Queen county, Apr. 24, 1701. He was the sheriff of King William Co. in 1708 and 1709. He was alive in 1724; we have no records of the date of his death. He had a son named Thomas Carr.

Major Thomas Carr of Bear Castle, Caroline County, was born in 1678 and died May 29, 1737. He also had various grants, one of which was for 25,000 acres in the counties of Louisa and Albermarle in Virginia. He married Mary Dabney of King William Co. in 1704 and had issue: John, b. 1706; William, b. 1707; Thomas, b. 1709; and Sarah, b. 1714.

John Carr was born June 25, 1706, died June, 1778. He named his county seat 'Bear Castle', probably after his father's place. It was situated in Louisa Co., Va. He was married to Mary Garland and second to Barbara Overton. His children: Thomas, b. 1737; James, b. 1740; Dabney, b. 1743; Samuel, b. 1745; Elizabeth, b. 1747; John, died young; Overton, b. 1752; John, b. 1753; Garland, b. 1754; Mary, b. 1756; and Sarah, b. 1758. Dabney, b. Oct. 26, 1743, married Martha Jefferson, a sister of Thomas Jefferson.

Thomas Carr, son of Major Thomas Carr and brother of John Carr, was born in Virginia in 1709. His children were: Thomas, b. May 15, 1742; William, b. 1745; McCager Carr, b. 1748; and Gideon Carr, b. 1752.

Thomas Carr was born in Virginia, probably in Albermarle Co. He married Ann Sanders, Jan. 27, 1770. She was born Feb. 6, 1750, died Sept. 10, 1826. He died in Tennessee, May 5, 1821. Their children were: Thomas, Gideon, Eliza, John, Walter, Nancy, Richardson, Betty, Susan, Sarah, Polly and Lucy.

Thomas Carr was born in Albermarle Co., Va. in 1771. He married Mary Harpole, who was born on the ocean in 1792. They were married May 2, 1811. He died May 12, 1858 and she on June 24, 1868. Their children were:

An extract from a letter written by Sally Ann Carr (married Houston) daughter of Thomas Carr, to her nephew, Richard Carr, Donaldsville, Ga., on September 22, 1889: "Leop, Clay County, Texas. Thomas was Father's and Grandfather's name. Your Grandpa Carr and Grandma Carr came from Wilson County, Tennessee in 1817. Your Grandpa Carr was born in Albermarle County, Virginia. Your Grandma was born on the Ocean but was raised in Tennessee. Your Grandpa Carr with several other men built a keel boat and brought their families down the Ohio into Mississippi, from Mississippi to Red River, up the Red River to Lo Pararie where they landed, sold their boat, scattered over southern Arkansas, which was then a wilderness. They could get all the land they wanted by simply filing for it. Most of the company got rich in the course of time. "

Elizabeth Dice Carr, daughter of Thomas Carr and Mary Harpole, married George Washington Stuart. A partial history of the Stuart family is also included in this issue.

STUART GENEALOGY

John Stuart and Sarah Fulkinson were married in Virginia. They moved to North Carolina and then to Kentucky. John Stuart was captured by Indians while hunting with Daniel Boone and others, but they managed to escape. He was killed by Indians many years later in 1769.

Children of John Stuart and Sarah Fulkinson were: Abraham, James, Elijah, William and Hulda. After the death of her husband, Sarah Fulkinson Stuart lived with her son, Abraham. Abraham Stuart moved with his family, mother and brothers to Hempstead Co., Ark. from Kentucky and settled at Mound Prairie about 1813 (or 1818). Sarah Fulkinson lived to be more than one hundred years old. She died near Columbus, Ark., Dec. 2, 1835. She was buried in Sec. 16, Twp. 11, Range 26 west.

SPRING CREEK CEMETERY, IZARD COUNTY, ARKANSAS

Since it was difficult to dig wells through the glade structure of the Ozark Mountain country, for generations a spring was the only water supply. Therefore, it was customary for the early settlers to choose a site for a school, a church or a settlement near a spring. One of the oldest communities in IZARD County is known as Spring Creek because of the beautiful, clear, rapid moving creek. The old spring house is still standing and the spring provides water for several families of the community.

In 1866 land for the church and the cemetery was conveyed by F. E. Staggs and his wife, Bethuna, to the group of men named as trustees, Thomas Clark, Elbert Benbrook and William Wood. In 1867 a church building was erected of logs hewn by men of the community. It was named Macedonia Church and stood until 1886, when the roof collapsed from the weight of a four-foot snow. In 1889 another church was built, which is still in splendid condition and used regularly. The original building was officially dedicated by Rev. James Jernigan in 1868. There seems to be no record of the first pastors, however these served in the early years: Rev. J. C. Carter, 1878-80; Rev. Charles Freeman, 1880-81; Rev. G. W. Register, 1881-82.

On April 25, 1888, additional land was conveyed by Perry and Marjorie Benbrook to trustees: Stephen E. Matthews, John H. Kidwell and Andrew J. Hutson. A. F. Wyatt was the Justice of the Peace who acknowledged the deed.

In 1941 Miss Juanita Hill, deaconess of the church, lead the movement to change the name of the church from Macedonia to Spring Creek because the people of the community were calling the settlement Spring Creek. The cemetery is located on a picturesque hill on the west side of the church. It is a well-kept, beautiful location, used today.
