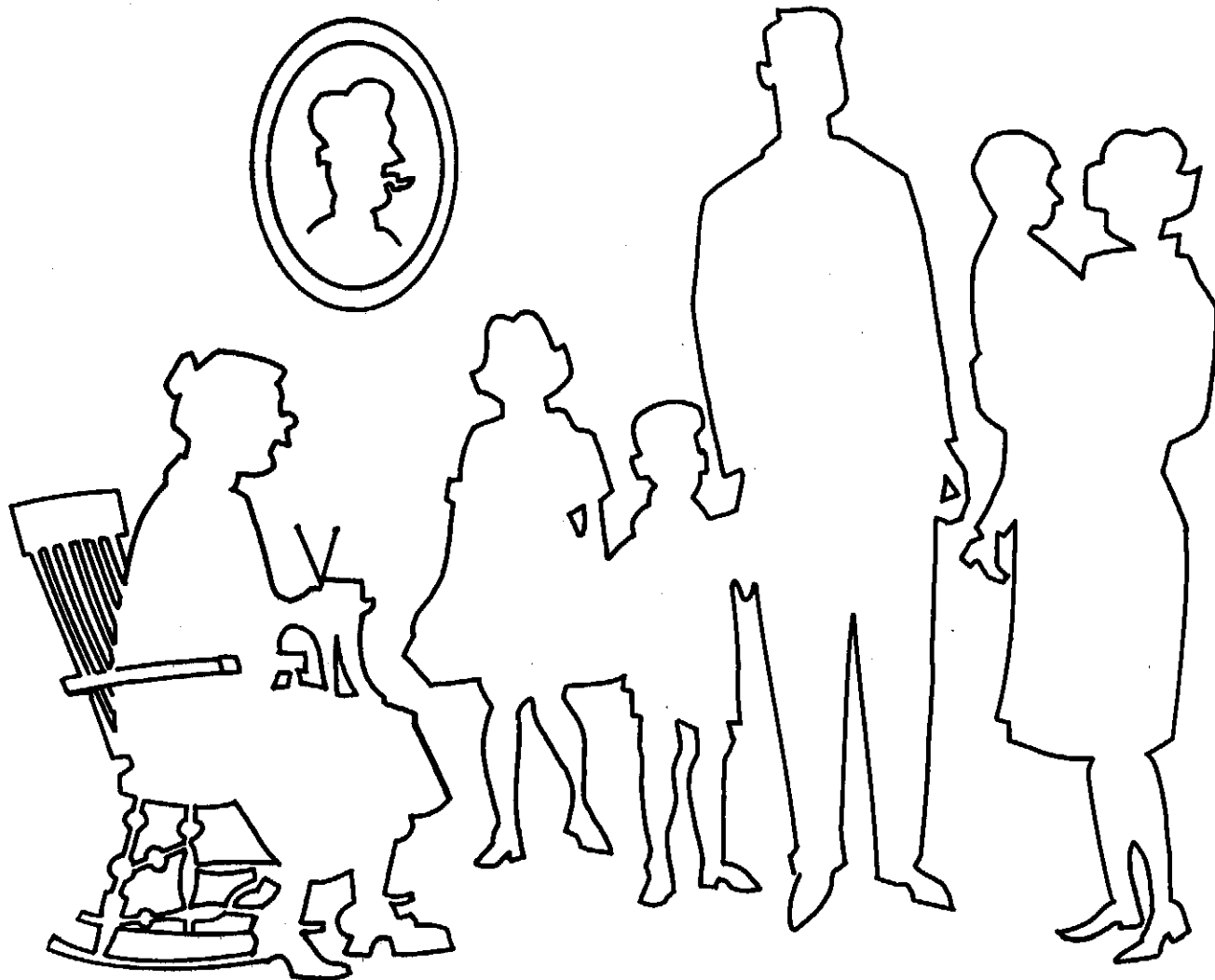

ARKANSAS' "FIRST LADY" OF GENEALOGY

Researchers in genealogy have increased in the past two decades. It is now in third place behind stamp and coin collection as the most popular hobby in the nation. Perhaps the affluence of present-day society and many retired people having free time has something to do with this increase.

For Mrs. Herman August Knorr "Miss Kitty" of Pine Bluff, genealogy is "the love" of a lifetime. She started as a young lady while tracing her own family tree. As she delved deeper into her own family history, she began to take an active part in many genealogical and historical organizations. Her study of genealogy has made it possible for her to help thousands in their search of family history. She still spends many exciting hours in her chosen field of specialization.

The Arkansas Genealogical Society is proud of the first lady of genealogy in Arkansas. Though her first interest is genealogy, Miss Kitty leads a many-faceted life. She is a charming hostess and has opened her home to friends near and far. Anyone who has been a guest in her home has known the warmth of hospitality there. The home reflects history, culture and beauty--and yet is most comfortable, a place where one would love to sit down and stay a long, long while.

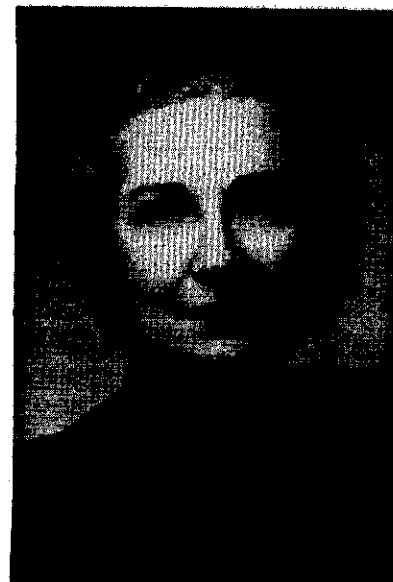
Her library is fabulous in genealogical treasures. These, too, she shares with her friends, near and far. She is a life-long Episcopalian and her husband now serves as treasurer of the Trinity Episcopal Church. As she has matured and mellowed in years, one activity she has not given up is serving in the local hospital as a Grey Lady.

She is a generous person. She gave original furniture out of her grandfather Bocade's home in Pine Bluff to help furnish the DAR room in the Old State Capitol in Little Rock. She gave the Bocade Home to the Optimist Club of Pine Bluff to become a Historical Restoration home of the first days of Pine Bluff. She has already given away many of her books and continuously is making plans to give away books even when she is gone on to Eternity.

Miss Kitty is a great story teller and a charming hostess. She has done much research and compiling. She has a photographic mind on genealogy. She never forgets a date or a family. Miss Kitty will not soon be forgotten by others. By her friends all over the United States, Mrs. Knorr is affectionately called "Miss Kitty".

Few people, if any, in the whole nation can equal Mrs. Knorr's membership in genealogical and patriotic societies. She has received membership in thirty-eight such societies. Many are very exclusive and difficult to meet membership requirements.

Mrs. Knorr is a member of the Society of Mayflower Descendants. Mrs. Knorr served the state organization as president in 1958. She is a descendent not only of Pilgrim William Brewster, but also of Captain Thomas Graves. Captain Graves preceded the Mayflower pioneers to the eastern coast. Graves was a delegate to the first House of Burgesses in America. It met in Virginia as early as 1619.

Mrs. Knorr is a member of the Order of the Crown in America. She has served this organization as Secretary General and President General for twelve years.

Mrs. Knorr was for more than thirty years on the national Board of Regents of the Daughters of the Barons of Runnymede. She served this organization as National Surety and Registrar five years and was First Vice-President for five years. This group traces its families back to the year 1215 and the inception of the Magna Carta.

She has served the Daughters of the American Revolution as State Regent. She served the John McAlmont chapter as Regent. She served the Arkansas state chapter as Corresponding Secretary, Genealogist, Vice Regent and Regent. She has the high honor of serving on National Speaking Staff.

Her Lindsey and Smith families settled in Arkansas before the territory became a state. She is a member of the Arkansas Territorial Pioneers.

One of the most coveted memberships in the United States is membership in the F. F. V. --the First Families of Virginia. This group is made up of families who lived in Virginia from 1607 to 1620, not just those families that were early settlers in Virginia. Mrs. Knorr belongs to this group. She has been Burgess in Arkansas for forty years. This is a very exclusive organization.

She is a member of Lords of Maryland Manors and was the national organization President. She is also a member of Descendants of Colonial Governors and served as the Reorganizing Governor General in 1955. She served as the Organizing President of National Gavel Club.

The most exclusive organization in the U. S. is the National Society of Colonial Dames. She has been a member of this society for 47 years.

Some of the other patriotic organizations of which she is a member are: United Daughters of the Confederacy; Daughters of Colonial Wars; Americans of Amorial Ancestry; Huguenot Society; Arkansas Genealogical Society; Virginia Genealogical Society; National Genealogical Society.

Truly, "Miss Kitty" is an honored lady and all of the honors are deserved.

Family History

Mrs. Knorr's mother was Flora Toinette Bacade (1856-1884). Her father was Willie Roswell Smith (1855-1918), a civil engineer. Her paternal grandfather was James Thomas Smith who married Prudence Ann Maxwell (1826-1894). Her great-grandfather was Thomas B. Smith (1791-1856) who married Clarissa Frost (1787-1849). Her great-great-grandfather was Peter Smith (1743-1843), a doctor in the American Revolution. He married Abygail Cleveland (1760-1820), who was a cousin of President Grover Cleveland.

In Pine Bluff and Arkansas, Miss Kitty's Bacade family is very prominent and well-known. Her maternal grandfather was Joseph Willim du Bacade (1819-1898). He was born on May 8, 1819 on the Island of St. Lucia of the West Indies. His mother, Marie Ann Bacade, was a niece of the famous French scientist, Antone Lavoisier. Lavoisier had invented the gasometer and oxygen. He was guillotined in Paris during the French Revolution.

Bacade came to the United States when he was three. He lived in New York City for a time until his mother died. He was reared by relatives in Wilmington, N. C. At the age of eighteen, he travelled through several states and arrived at Pine Bluff in 1837. He read law in the office of General James Yell and was admitted to the bar in 1840. In 1840 he married Miss Frances Stanford Lindsey, whose father was W. H. Lindsey. The marriage of Mr. Bacade and Miss Lindsey was the first marriage recorded by the Episcopal Church in Arkansas. They were parents of thirteen children, six of whom lived to be adults.

From 1844 to 1849 Mr. Bacade served the Second Judicial District as attorney. He served in the C. S. A. as Colonel in the Second Arkansas Regiment. He served as Mayor of Pine Bluff in 1889-1891. He served as the first Senior Warden of Trinity Episcopal Church. Judge Bacade died in 1898.

On her maternal side, Mrs. Knorr has a line back to the Calvert who was the first Governor of Maryland. Her great-grandfather was William Henry Lindsey (1773-1804) and his wife was Catherine Washington Lanford. Her great-great-grandfather was William Lindsey (1742-1792). He was a captain in the American Revolution. His wife and Mrs. Knorr's great-great-grandmother was Anne Calvert (1751-1822).

Miss Kitty can trace eleven of her family's lineages back to the American Revolution, but she is still researching her family lines and hopes to find the twelfth one--someday!

Mrs. Knorr has presented copies of each of these books to the Arkansas Genealogical Society. Any of the above books may be ordered from Mrs. Knorr, 1401 Linden St., Pine Bluff, Arkansas. They are priced at \$5.00 each (except "Marriages of Fredericksburg, Va." which is \$6.00.) The volumes of Virginia marriages by Mrs. Knorr are mimeographed, bound, and each contains a chart of the genealogy of the county itself as well as a map showing the surrounding counties. All men's names are in alphabetical order with the names of brides indexed. All witnesses and bondsmen's names are given and the relationship to contracting parties stated. Also listed are the names of the officiating ministers. Every discrepancy in spelling is noted.

Civil War Refugees Helped Develop Brazil;
Descendants Speak English

When refugees fled the United States after the Civil War, some of them went to Brazil. A few went to the Amazon North, to Santarem, but most, after a period in Rio de Janeiro, wound up in the State of Soa Paulo.

They brought with them very little except knowledge of how to farm a little better than the Paulistas of the time; and their only enduring contribution was the plowshare invented, or at least popularized, by Thomas Jefferson.

They became good farmers and, after a generation or so, good Brazilians, speaking Portuguese, inter-marrying with local families and, for the most part, disappearing into the mass of people.

A few of them, however, to this day, keep up the remembrance of the America of their forefathers, teach their mostly Brazilian children how to speak English, and band together in a tiny society called Descendants of Americans (Fraternidade Descendencia Americana)--about 60 people altogether, although others take part in the occasional gatherings.

In all Brazil, there are perhaps 10,000 people who by now have some trace of American ancestry, most of them with names like Goncalves, Ferreira, Barbosa and Lima, but others called Smith, Jones, Ferguson, Dodson and the like.

Some of them live in or near the bustling city of Americana, about 70 miles from the metropolis of Sao Paulo. Americana was named after the Americans who helped build up the area a century ago.

Sao Paulo travel agencies take touring Americans out to Americana, to show them streets named Cicero Jones and Jorge Jones, and a statue of Jorge Jones in the main square, in memory of his death in the short-lived revolt of Sao Paulo in 1932.

A few of the Descendants go along with the tourist thing and keep Confederate flags hanging on their walls or specialize in making Southern-fried chicken for the tourist to sample.

The English they speak is more Old Southern than the Southern of today, closer, perhaps, to today's Southwestern, carefully passed on from generation to generation. It has won many of them good jobs with U. S. firms in Sao Paulo, who value bilingual employes.

Americana, despite its name, is made up of at least 95 per cent Brazilians of ancestries other than American, but all the citizens know of the early ties with the Southern States and will recite the local history at the slightest urging.

The city is a center of the textile industry, has many new businesses and factories, and is surrounded by a rich farming district where sugar cane, cotton, rice, corn and beans are among the main crops. The wealth of the area today lies in industry. From the original plow introduced by the Americans has developed one of Brazil's main centers for production of farm machinery and machine tools.

INSURANCE RECORDS AS A TOOL IN GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH

(An address given before the Annual Meeting of the Arkansas Genealogical Society, October 11, 1970. Mr. Florentz is a member of the Board of Directors of the Society.)

Some people have the feeling that there is much history locked in the records of the insurance companies in this country, and that maybe these records could assist and shed light on our genealogical searches. Because of my years in the insurance business, I have been asked to prepare a paper to explore this possibility.

When a person applies for life insurance, he does so on an application form that gives his name, date of birth, place of birth, address, occupation and the name of his beneficiary. Of course, his beneficiary could be his wife, children, or father and mother or, if the policy were large enough, a combination of all. Then, he answers many questions regarding the condition of health of his parents and brothers and sisters or, if any are dead, the dates and causes of death. The applications are normally preserved throughout the lifetime of the policy. After the policy is terminated for any cause, such as death, lapse or surrender, the file is transferred to an inactive file and now, with the advent of microfilming, the records may be microfilmed and the files destroyed.

When an application is acted upon by the insurance company and a policy is issued, a number is assigned to the policy, and the application and all information pertaining to this file throughout the years is kept in this one file and the file maintained in numerical order. Of course, insurance companies keep a cross index to these files in alphabetical order.

INSURANCE RECORDS AS A TOOL IN GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH (continued)

The statistics that life insurance companies assemble consist of tabulating record cards, which may be manually typed cards or punch cards or, now that the computer is becoming so widely used, the records could be on magnetic tape. These records then furnish the basis for tabulating the amount of insurance at the age of issue for the year of issue according to the plan of insurance, and the amount of insurance under these categories is multiplied by a factor for establishing the amounts of the reserves to be maintained according to law. This constitutes the greatest portion of the company's liabilities.

When a death occurs, the policy information, together with the cause of death, is coded and tabulated. However, names are never used in any of these statistical records as all controls on the individual records are by policy number, and the various categories desired are grouped together in large totals.

As an example, insurance companies can know at the end of the year the total amount of claims they have paid by ages of the insureds at the date of death and the duration of the policy as well as the cause of death. These statistics are compared with the assumed cost of death that is contained in their tables that were used to create the tables of factors so that the company may determine whether they are having less mortality than assumed or more mortality than assumed. Comparison of this experience through the years gives the insurance company an opportunity to study the adequacy of the rates they charge as well as the reserves they set up as a liability in their financial statement.

At best, the only information that could be found pertaining to an individual or his family would be about his immediate family of which the family would already have knowledge, and as these records would be of little use in trying to trace one's ancestry, I can see no practical use in them for genealogical research. An insurance company's records are checked at certain intervals to see what files can be destroyed in order that the company can conserve on storage space. Census records are far superior to insurance company records in going back to prior generations.

Since a man's insurance record is what is known as "privileged information" in the law, a person would be required to have the consent of the insured to check his insurance record or, in the event of the death of the insured, only the beneficiary or the court could actually check a record.

There is one unusual service that is possible today in the insurance business, which is used to find if a man had insurance with a company where the insured had died and the family of the insured knew that he had purchased insurance on many occasions throughout life, and they were only able to find a few policies among his possessions. If the family's belief is sufficiently strong, an insurance trade association, known as the Institute of Life Insurance, will prepare a list of the known facts, such as name, date and place of birth, date and place of death, and the names of all states and towns in which he was known to have lived. This information is then circularized to all insurance companies with the request that they check their records and notify the Institute if they find this person had insurance in force with them during this period of time. Our company has received many such requests, but I do not know that we ever had a policy on any of the persons inquired about. Of course, this type of search has nothing to do with genealogy. I believe you can see that while insurance records serve as an excellent source of information on the health condition, or maybe I should say on the morbidity, in our country as a whole, they have no value whatsoever for tracing the individual's family tree. This was a good thought and certainly one to be explored.

Our main interest now is to locate Joseph Cossart, born ca 1820, as he may be a brother of our Henry Cossart. Old letters imply he was a brother. Joseph Cossart sold land located in the northwest quarter of Sec. 26, twp. 16 south, range 14 west, 80 acres lying on the east side of the Luter Road, bounded on the north by a tract of land known as C. F. Sargent's land, on the east by Archibald Johnston's land, on the south by Henry Cossart's land and on the west by the middle of the Luter Road. This land was sold to Henry Cossart and signed by Joseph and Nancy Cossart on Oct. 9, 1849.

QUERIES

BEAN - EARHART - QUISENBERRY - TOTTY - REEVES

I am a descendant of the Beans of the famous Bean Station, Tenn., but I have other families that were in and out of Arkansas that I would like to know about.

Jesse Bean, b. 1756, Pittsylvania Co., Va., moved to Tennessee, then to Arkansas in early 1820's. He was living in Mulberry, Ark. He was alive in 1819, but do not think he was alive as late as 1830. I have not been able to find where and when he died. He married Elizabeth Mitchell, b. 1758, Washington Co., N. C., d. Sept. 10, 1837. (Mrs. Vera Looney, in her Bean book, has Jesse died on that date, but that is the death date of Elizabeth Mitchell Bean.)

Jesse Bean and Elizabeth Mitchell Bean had a son Robert Bean, b. 1779, Tenn., m. Sallie Miller, June 10, 1803 in Davidson Co., Tenn., came to Arkansas with his father in early 1820's. He was in Batesville, Ark. and in Crawford Co., Ark., then I lost him and have not found him anywhere. I found a bill of sale in the courthouse at Batesville showing that Sallie Miller's brother gave her a slave ... "to my dear beloved sister Sallie Miller the wife of Robert Bean". This is the part of the Bean family that my grandmother, Eliza Caroline Bean Earhart, came down through.

Joseph Bonaparte Earhart, b. 1812, Pa., m. 1st in Athens, Ohio to Eliza Ann Gosline. They had one son, who died young in Ohio. Earhart and his wife went to Lafayette Co., Ark. His wife died there. (This record from Earhart's granddaughter who will be 100 years old in December, 1970.) Joseph Bonaparte Earhart then married Mary Ann Quisenberry Penn on Jan. 19, 1843.

Mary Ann Quisenberry was the daughter of William Minor Quisenberry and Elizabeth Ann Bean, daughter of Jesse Bean and Elizabeth Mitchell Bean. Mary Ann married first, Eliphalet M. Penn, record from courthouse at Ozark, Ark., will probated April 17, 1844, William Minor Quisenberry administrator of Penn estate.

The first child of Joseph Bonaparte Earhart and Mary Ann Quisenberry Penn was Eliza Ann Earhart, born Oct. 7, 1843, named for Joseph's first wife, born in Franklin Co., Ark. The next child was a son, Eliphalet Penn Earhart, born Dec. 18, 1845 in Grayson Co., Texas, named for Mary Ann's first husband.

Eliphalet Penn Earhart married Eliza Caroline Bean, the daughter of William Bean, b. 1804, son of Robert Bean and Sallie Miller.

My questions are: When and where did Jesse Bean and Robert Bean die? Who were the parents of Sallie Miller? She had one brother, Col. John Miller, who died in 1859. Where can I find records of Joseph Bonaparte Earhart and William Minor Quisenberry?

Robert Totty, b. Va. to Nashville, Tenn. in 1809, to Hickman Co., Tenn. in 1810, to Crawford Co., Ark. ca 1835. He married Sarah Sandal Andrews in 1793. Their daughter, Nancy Totty, b. 1799 in Tenn., d. 1860 in Texas, married William Steel Reeves, b. 1794 in Pendleton Dist., S. C., d. 1872 in Texas. They are buried in Georgetown Cemetery, near Pottsboro, Texas.

William Steel Reeves and Nancy Totty Reeves came to Crawford Co., Ark. ca 1835. They had three children in Arkansas: Matilda Jane, b. 1836; Nancy Tennessee, b. 1839; and Tilitha Ann, b. 1841. Their oldest daughter, Caroline Reeves, married William Bean, son of Robert and grandson of Jesse Bean. Their daughter, Eliza Caroline Bean, married Eliphalet Penn Earhart.

We are trying to complete a book about the family of William Steel Reeves. His parents were from Ireland. They died when he was three years old, and he was reared by an uncle in Nashville, Tennessee. I would appreciate any information as to whereabouts of records on William Steel Reeves and Robert Totty.

In the 1880 census they were in Hickman, Fulton Co., Ky. Our family tradition says that T. R. Bass moved to Missouri and then to Saline Co., Ark., where he bought a peach orchard, and that he had a son, James Henry Bass, who lived in Woodruff Co.
