

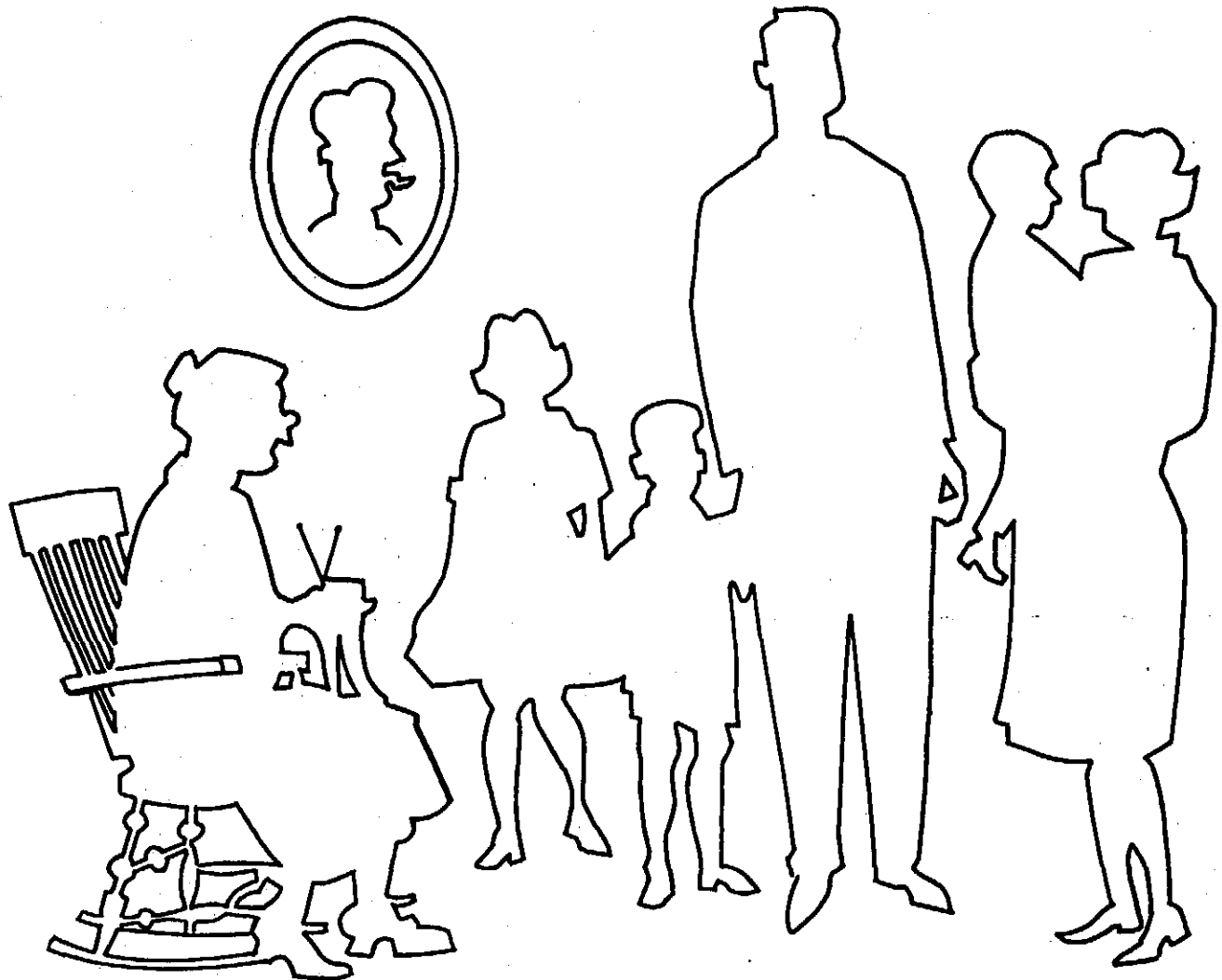

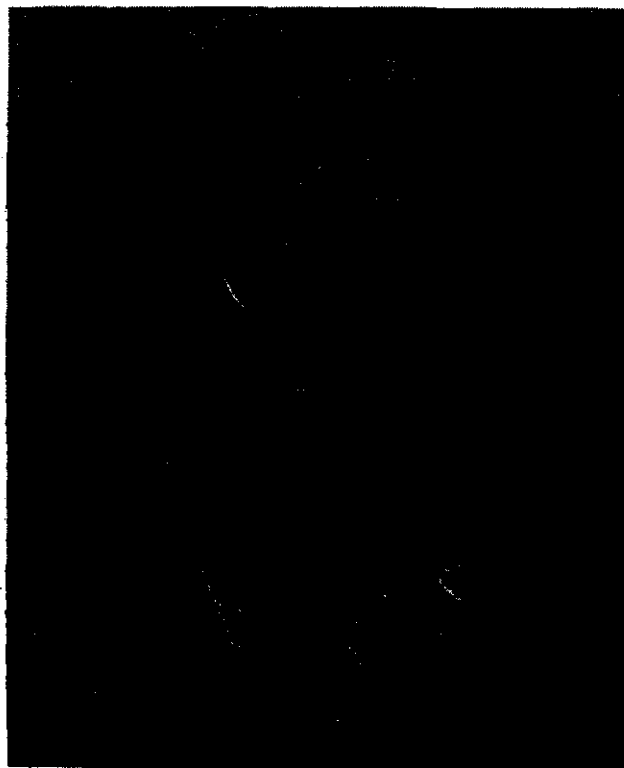
AGS BOARD MEETING

## CASH - MARKHAM FAMILIES

Isham Cash was born in Granville Co., N. C. ca 1815. He married Nancy Haley in Granville Co. in 1835, and together with either his brother or cousin, James Cash, Jr. and wife, Amanda Bledsoe (married in Granville Co. in 1826), moved to Tennessee ca 1847. They resided in Tennessee until shortly before 1860 and were living in Clark Co., Ark. in 1860-80. Isham and Nancy Cash had the following children:

1. John Cash.
2. William Cash.
3. Addaline Cash.
4. Alfred Albert Cash, died in POW camp in Illinois during Civil War.
5. Anderson Cash, m. Missouri Elvira Johnson, daughter of Thomas Johnson and Peggy Bassett, both from Alabama, and had the following children:
  - (1) Lucy Cash, m. Bart Findley, had children: Cora, Etta, Mittie, Carlos, Winfred, Velva, Lemmick and Roy.
  - (2) Charles Cash, m. Versie Findley, had children: Cussie, Coy, Anderson, Emery, Clarence, Oddus and Virgie.
  - (3) Nancy Cash, m. William Finney, had children: William, Tommy, Nancy, Dixie, Linnie, Lela, Dellia and Nobia.
  - (4) Floyd Isham Cash, m. Mildred Fidelia Markham (my parents).
6. Jane Cash.
7. Cyrus Cash, m. Alla A. ---, had children: James L., John H., Thomas L., and Cyrus F. He later married Isadora Mitchell, but had no children of this marriage.
8. Martha Cash.
9. Sarah Cash.
10. Milton B. Cash.

Thomas J. Markham was born in Kentucky, Mar. 10, 1813, married Sarah Sullivant (or Sullivan), daughter of Joseph Sullivan(t) and Frankie Reeves of northern Arkansas, had children, Charles Carter Markham (my grandfather), Lydia, William, Thomas S., Sarah, Mary Francis, Martha, Josephine and Elijah.

Charles Carter Markham m. Mary Francis Anderson, daughter of James Anderson and Mary Williams of Montgomery Co., and granddaughter of William (Billy) Williams and Mary Locke (or Loque) who, legend says, were married in Canada and moved to Montgomery Co. Mary Francis Anderson was first married to Henry Dickhard in 1868. Charles Carter Markham and Mary Francis Anderson had the following children:

- (1) Mildred Fidelia Markham, m. Floyd Isham Cash (my parents).
- (2) Joseph, died in 1880 at age 1 year.
- (3) W. Frank Markham, m. Charlotte Johnson, had children: Willie (daughter), Ira, Jake, Alta, Francis and Charles.
- (4) Charles Markham.
- (5) Clara Markham, m. George H. Spears, moved to Tahoka, Texas.

I have a great deal of information on the Virginia and North Carolina beginnings of the Cash family back to the late 1600's, and would like to exchange information with anyone interested in the Cash, Markham and allied families listed above.

SIMPSON - REID

Richard Simpson, Sr. in 1727 was granted 300 acres of land on South Run of Pohick Creek in Halifax Co., Va. He died between Sept. 19, 1761, when his Will was written, and December, 1762, when it was probated. His widow, Sarah, was dead by August, 1766. Their children were: Moses, George, Elizabeth, Sarah, Richard, Jr., Mary and William (as named in his Will).

Richard Simpson, Jr. died in 1789 and was survived by his widow, Mary, eight daughters and one son, Richard III. Mary, who was born in 1718 in Richmond Co., Va., was the daughter of John Kincheloe, Sr. and Elizabeth Canterbury of Stafford (now Prince William) County, Va. After John's death in 1746, his widow, Elizabeth, married Edward Emms.

Elizabeth Canterbury Kincheloe was the daughter of John Canterbury, who died in 1716, and Ruth Williams, who was born in Rappahannock Co., Va. Ruth was the daughter of Roger Williams and Joane "Jen" Frith. Jen married first Roger Williams and they resided in Northumberland Co., Va. before 1665. After his death, she married 2nd, Samuel Wills, and 3rd, Lewis Lloyd. Jen was the daughter of Nathaniel Frith, who died in 1676.

John Kincheloe, Sr. was son of Cornelius of Richmond Co., Va. John's children were: Cornelius, Daniel, Elizabeth, Mary, John, Jr., Wileman (a daughter who married John Hoskins), Margaret and Sarah.

Mary Kincheloe married Richard Simpson, Jr. and they were living in Essex Co., Va. Feb. 8, 1767 when their daughter, Keziah, was born. In 1857, Keziah Simpson Reid told the following to her granddaughter, Annie Maurice Smith, an 18-year-old girl:

When Daniel Boone was enlisting settlers to move to Kentucky, Richard Simpson, III, Keziah's older brother, decided the future would be more profitable if he moved his family to Kentucky. Their sister Sallie had married Nathaniel Hart in 1760 and the Harts had lived at their country seat "The Red House" in Caswell Co., N. C. from 1760 until their removal to Kentucky in 1779. Nathaniel Hart and William Henderson bought Kentucky from the Cherokee Indians in 1775. Captain Nathaniel Hart was killed by Indians in sight of Fort Boonsboro on Aug. 19, 1782. Children of Sallie Simpson and Nathaniel Hart were: Susanna, 1761-1833, who married Isaac Shelby, first governor of Kentucky; Mary Ann; Keziah; Chinoe; Nathaniel, who married Susanna Preston; John; Simpson; Cumberland and Richard Green.

Keziah Simpson went with her brother and his family to Kentucky and in 1783 married William Buchanon, who was killed by Indians soon after their marriage. Keziah's siblings

were:

- Sallie Simpson, who married Nathaniel Hart;
- Bettie Simpson, who married Jesse Oldham;
- Richard Simpson, III, who married Henrietta Williams;
- Lydia Simpson, who married Richard Tate;
- Eda Simpson, who married William Nunn;
- Nancy Simpson, who married Waddy Tate;
- Frankie Simpson, who married Jerry Poston; and

Mary Ann (Mollie) Simpson, who married Tyree Harris as his second wife. Tyree Harris was born Apr. 8, 1728, son of Major Robert Harris and Mourning Glenn. Tyree married first, Elizabeth Chapman. He was born in Albemarle Co., Va., but moved to Caswell Co., N. C. He and Mary Ann had a daughter, Lydia Harris, who married Robert Brown. They were parents of Tyre (called Tary) Harris Brown, who settled in Tulip, Ark. Tyre H. Brown married Martha Bethel, daughter of John Pinkney Bethel and wife, Sarah Smith (died 1858), natives of North Carolina, but resided in Shelby Co., Tenn. many years. Tulip was first called Brownsville for Tyre Brown.

John Reid, a Major in the Revolutionary War, was born Apr. 16, 1748 and resided on the Holstein River in Washington Co., Va. He was appointed ensign in the Third Regiment commanded by Lt. Col. John Montgomery. He immediately raised his quota of men, joined the Regiment at Long Island on the Holstein, and served there from Jan. 9, 1779 to January, 1781, during which time he acted as Adjutant and then as Quartermaster. He also carried Expresses from Col. Evan Shelby, Arthur Campbell and David Smith. He was under Col. Campbell in the battle of King's Mountain and served as quartermaster with Col. William Campbell in the battle of Guilford. (This information given on John Reid's widow's application for a pension. File No. 26946)

John Reid had known Keziah Simpson before her marriage to William Buchanan, and he and Mrs. Keziah Simpson Buchanan were married on Mar. 22, 1784 at Boonesborough, Ky. They moved to Caswell Co., N. C. where six children were born to them:

1. Nathaniel Reid, born Oct. 5, 1794.
2. John B. Reid, born Sept. 16, 1796, died 1816.
3. William Buchanan Reid, born May 15, 1799, died Jan. 1847 in Fayette Co., Tenn. One of his children, John Reid, went to Tulip, Ark. in the 1850's.
4. Thomas Jefferson Reid, born Sept. 5, 1801.
5. Amelia Reid, born Sept. 15, 1803, died in infancy.
6. Clarissa Harlow Reid, born Apr. 11, 1806.

John Reid died June 23, 1826 in Caswell Co., N. C., and Keziah personally managed her estate for many years after his death. During her latter days she drew a Revolutionary War pension for his service. "King's Mountain Men" by White, page 243, says "John Reid enlisted in Washington Co., Va.; served as an express; was at King's Mountain and Guilford and died 1826. His widow Keziah was allowed a pension in 1844. In 1849 she lived at Tulip, Texas, age 82. Her only surviving child was Mrs. Charles H. Smith."

Mistakes in the above: She lived in Tulip, Arkansas and her child was Mrs. Clarissa H. Smith.

Clarissa Harlow Reid, born Apr. 11, 1806, Caswell Co., N. C., married Maurice Smith April 28, 1830 as his second wife. Maurice Smith was born June 10, 1801, son of Samuel Smith and Elizabeth Harrison, married first Mrs. Martha (Williams) Hays and had two children, Cornelia and Samuel. His children by Clarissa were: Elizabeth K.; Annie Maurice; Lockie Lenore; Olin Derbin; Ashbury Warren; John Reid and Mary K. Smith. Records of this Smith family are given in "Webb Smith Kin of Dixie," a book at the Arkansas History Commission in Little Rock.

When Maurice Smith moved his family from Tennessee to Dallas Co., Ark. in 1844, he brought Keziah Reid with him. They came in ox-drawn "Carry All" wagons. She died at Tulip in 1858 at age 92. The family Bible says she died Aug. 9, 1858, but her tombstone gives her death as June 26, 1858. Maurice Smith died May 14, 1871, and his wife, Clarissa, died Sept. 29, 1874. All are buried in Tulip Cemetery.

Thomas Jefferson Reid, fourth child of John Reid and Keziah Simpson, did not come to Arkansas until 1854, ten years after his sister and mother. He was born Sept. 5, 1801 and was married Feb. 5, 1833 to Fanny Lightfoot Edwards, who was born in 1814 in Person Co., N. C. She attended college at Salem, N. C. She was living with her son, Dr. T. J. Reid, Jr. in Chicago in 1890 and it is presumed she died and was buried there. Thomas J. Reid, Sr. died June 11, 1880 and is buried in Tulip Cemetery, Dallas Co., Ark. Thomas and Fanny had twelve children, all born in Caswell Co., N. C., except Lula, the youngest.

41. Mariah C. Reid, born 1834, married John A. Baird, farmer of Person Co., N. C.
42. Margaret Keziah Reid, born 1835, married Edward W. Gantt.

Edward W. Gantt, born Mar. 17, 1829 in Tenn., died June 10, 1874 in Dallas Co., Ark. and is buried in Tulip Cemetery. He was a lawyer. He first joined the Confederacy and became a General, but after the surrender at Vicksburg, Miss., he changed sides and on Oct. 7, 1863 he issued "An Address to the People of the State of Arkansas," in which he advised the State to rejoin the Union. He met with President Abraham Lincoln at Washington City and was appointed Attorney General of Arkansas 1865-66, also Director of the Arkansas Southwestern Division of the Freedman's Bureau, 1865-68. He made a law Digest, living all his latter days at Tulip just south of his father-in-law's home. He was a much despised man when he died.

Edward married Margaret Keziah "Maggie" Reid, Oct. 31, 1855, and they were parents of four children, all born in Dallas Co., Ark.

421. Lula Gantt, born Sept. 3, 1857, Washington, Ark. "Louie" was killed at 16th & Louisiana Sts. in Little Rock, June 22, 1899, when the horse drawing her buggy ran away, throwing her against a utility pole. She was buried in Oakland Cemetery and her husband gave a beautiful stained-glass window in her memory to the First Methodist Church. Her husband was Judge Thomas Bolling Martin, born Mar. 1, 1852, died Jan. 19, 1908, was buried beside her in Oakland Cemetery. They were parents of five sons and two daughters, including:

Robert, who lived in Dallas, Texas.

Mary.

Lula.

Edward Gantt Martin of Fort Worth.

Melbourne M. Martin, b. Aug. 13, 1890, died Mar. 28, 1959 at Little Rock, married Berniece Whitelaw of Pine Bluff, had one son, M. M., Jr.

422. Cora Gantt, born July 23, 1859, died Dec. 25, 1884, married Banks.

423. Reid Gantt, born 1864, Representative from Garland Co., 1903 and 1905; found dead in his office in Hot Springs, July 22, 1906.

424. Edward W. Gantt, Jr., born 1867, died Dec. 11, 1929 in Oklahoma City.

43. Thomas Jefferson Reid, Jr., born 1837, obtained his medical training at Philadelphia, Pa. and Richmond, Va. He was a Colonel in the 12th Ark. Ing. in the War Between the States; later settled in Chicago, where he was a well-known doctor.

44. Fannie Reid, born 1839, married Thomas J. Martin.

45. Lucy Ann Reid, born 1841, married William Harrison Martin, April 12, 1860. William was a nephew of Colonel Robert Martin. He enlisted in Co. C, 2nd Ark. Cav. as 2nd Lt. He was in the Battle of Shiloh, but was given a disability discharge in April, 1862 and died in August, 1864. Lucy died June 1, 1872, leaving two children:

451. Frances "Fannie" Martin, 1861-1931, married Jan. 1, 1880 to Dr. Wiley Blount Barner, 1856-1929. Both died at Wynne, Ark., left descendants.

452. William Harrison Martin, Jr., b. Feb. 20, 1863, married Apr. 30, 1889 at Hot Springs to Mary Keeley, daughter of Thomas Keeley. He studied law under his kinsman, Judge Tom Martin of Little Rock. Settled in Hot Springs where he served three terms as U. S. District Attorney. He ran for Governor, but was defeated. Mary died Sept. 17, 1910, leaving her husband and three children, Thomas Keeley Martin, Mary and Elizabeth Martin. William died June 14, 1929 at Memphis, age 65.

46. Infant, died at birth.

47. William Henry Reid, son of Thomas Jefferson Reid and Fanny Lightfoot Edwards, was born May 21, 1844 in Caswell Co., N. C., married May 1, 1872 to Alice Beckham, daughter of George Beckham and Elizabeth Caston. Alice was born in South Carolina, Aug. 25, 1849; died in Tulip, Ark., Apr. 2, 1915. William joined the Confederate Army in June, 1861 in Co. I, 3rd Ark. Inf., but soon was transferred to the 12th Ark. Inf. where his brother, Thomas, was the Colonel in command. William was taken prisoner at Port Hudson, confined at Johnson's Island nearly two years, taken to Fort Delaware and pardoned by President Johnson, through the influence of his brother-in-law, Edward W. Gantt. He helped Gantt prepare his Digest. He was Assessor of Dallas County in 1874. He died May 5, 1913 at Tulip, where he is buried.
471. Gantt Reid, born Apr. 19, 1874, died June 21, 1953 at Malvern, married Feb. 9, 1898 to Louise Elizabeth Rice, daughter of Thomas Jefferson Rice and Elizabeth Amelia Vanderslice. Louise was born July 15, 1874 in Dallas Co., Ark., died May 13, 1949 at Little Rock, buried at Malvern where they had lived since 1925. Gantt Reid was in the insurance business in Malvern.
4711. Lillian "Della" Reid, born Sunday, Jan. 22, 1900 at Leola, Ark. in Grant Co., married June 24, 1925 to Clyde White of Wichita, Kansas.
47111. Emma Lou White, born Jan. 30, 1931 in Wichita, died May 20, 1943 in Wichita.
4712. Nancy "Adgie" Reid, born Sunday, Apr. 13, 1902 at Leola, Ark., married June 1, 1928 at Malvern, Ark. to Alton Solon Williams, son of Isom G. Williams and Susan Elizabeth Clements. Alton was born Jan. 10, 1904 in Faulkner Co., Ark., retired as a teacher at Central High School in Little Rock, June, 1966.
47121. Alton Gantt Williams, b. June 5, 1932, Seattle, Washington, married Dec. 28, 1957 in Chicago, Ill. to Germaine Theresa "Jerry" Sautter, daughter of Alton Frederick Sautter and Bernice Martina Germain. Jerry was born June 15, 1934 in Chicago.
471211. Kevin Michael Williams, b. July 20, 1959, Fayetteville, Ark.
471212. Mathew Reid Williams, b. Mar. 5, 1961, Fayetteville, Ark.

## CARTER - THE GEORGIA SEARCH

Seeking information concerning the parents and lineage of William Carter, born ca 1791. He was said to have been born in Georgia, and to have been an only son. He married Mary Williams of Franklin Co., N. C. on Jan. 20, 1825. She was born ante 1800, the daughter of Henry Williams of Franklin County and, probably, the granddaughter of John Cheves of Franklin Co. William and Mary Carter had one child, Henry William Carter, b. Jan. 12, 1826 in Louisburg, Franklin Co. About 1840, William Carter, with his wife and son, left North Carolina and went to Mississippi. After a few years he traveled to Plain Dealing in northwest Louisiana, where he sojourned for a while. He crossed into Lafayette Co. (Ark.), where his wife died in 1845. He and his son finally settled in Pike Co., Ark., where he died about 1850. His son died in 1906, leaving a large number of descendants.

\* \* \* \* \*

The foregoing "Query" was inserted several times during the past few years in each of several genealogical quarterlies in different parts of the country. It brought no results. The following pages deal with the procedure that finally brought results. It involves answering the appeals of others and an attempt to help other searchers.

My wife, Pauline Booker Carter, and I have worked on our family histories as a team. She received some very sound advice early in her genealogical studies from a DAR sister of years of experience. "Always trace the movements of groups. People that lived together usually migrated to the same vicinity, and intermarried as they did at their old location."

In this era of census transcriptions one should consider the importance of the order in which an area was enumerated by the census-taker of earlier days. Examine the original census (on microfilm) and note the names of the persons who lived next door, down the road, but were near neighbors of your ancestor. Who were they? Often they were cousins, brothers, sisters or parents. Or, families who had shared migrations from far distant states, and were found together for generations. This was the "constellation" in which your ancestor lived his life. His movements were often made in conjunction with others of his kin or friends. When you lose him, you can occasionally relocate him by tracing the motion of those kin or friends to a new area.

We know that groups of families traveled together into new lands. Often they had sent a man ahead to scout the new area, perhaps to purchase or apply for land. When he returned with a favorable report, the neighborhood packed up and moved. And it can be noted here that family names en masse disappeared from the old location.

In the case of William Carter, he moved east from Georgia to Carolina, against the tide of migration. Why did he do it? The most obvious answer was, on account of family ties, or to secure or inherit property at his former domicile.

When we started trying to search for the ancestors of William Carter, we had the following bits of information to start with:

William Carter was born in Georgia (Goodspeed's History of Southwest Arkansas; also the 1880 census of Pike Co., Ark. of his son.)

William Carter married Mary Williams in Louisburg, Franklin Co., N. C. in 1825. (Marriage Bond)

Mary Williams was the daughter of Henry Williams of Franklin Co., N. C., who died ca 1849. (Will, Franklin Co., N. C., filed 1852).

Mary Williams' maternal grandfather was John Cheeves (Will dated 1809, Franklin Co., North Carolina)

William Carter had one son, Henry William Carter (Family Bible, various biographies.)

In initiating the Georgia search, we had only a few words to guide us. Goodspeed wrote "he came from Georgia." That was the Dead End.

Searches were made at different times over fifty years by many of different descendants in the Property and Marriage records of Franklin County, North Carolina. We found the Marriage Bond of William Carter and Mary Williams. We also found the will of Henry Williams, her father, and of John Cheeves, her maternal grandfather.

We found nothing at all that would connect with the known data on our William Carter. We could not find the reason for William Carter to move to Franklin Co., N. C.

To return to our Georgia search, numerous and expensive searches were made, over a period of several years, and several hundred pages of notes assembled, to find a family for William in Georgia. We were unable to connect our known data with any of the many William Carters of these time periods of our ancestor.

The orthodox instruction from the expert is to clumb up the family tree. At this point, there was no family and no tree. We decided to get an overall picture of all the larger family groups of Carters that came from Virginia and the Carolinas and trace their descendants when we could find a group that went to Georgia.

This method can be designated "Dropping in the top of the tree and descending all the branches." It is not as difficult as it sounds, as there are not too many trees, and not many of the branches are documented. It is based on a fundamental, logical conclusion, "find where to look and look in that place" even if your family records do not emphasize it.

In analyzing the results of our search for groups, we happened on a large piece of Luck, the genealogist's best friend. In my correspondence with Mrs. W. L. Davis of Dumas, Texas (a Carter descendant), I tried to figure out some answer to her problem. She was searching in Georgia for records of Josiah Carter and Judith Asbury. In an effort to assist her on her Carter search, I began the examination of Josiah's family and other families in Wilkes County, Georgia, and other counties excised therefrom.

Josiah Carter was a Revolutionary soldier of Georgia; his wife was Mary Anthony of Virginia. Their children included two sons, among others. The names appear on DAR lineage 194758 of Mrs. J. A. Purse of Dallas, Texas. One son, Christopher Anthony Carter, married Sarah Whitehead Battle. Another son was William Carter. There was no indication that he would have North Carolina connections. I borrowed a "Battle Book" from Mrs. Purse and began a study of the Battles. I found that they were extensively rooted in Franklin Co., North Carolina at that time. I also found them intermarried in Georgia with Chivers (Cheves) and Williams from the vicinity of Franklin Co., N. C.

It now appeared that William had a sister-in-law from the Battles in Franklin Co. that owned property and mills there and connected to the Williams family. The particular part of Georgia where William Carter was born was full of people from the vicinity of Franklin County, North Carolina.

I believe this to be the connection that moved William Carter from Georgia to North Carolina, where he married into this same family connection. His sister-in-law's brother, Lazarus Battle, married a Nancy Chivers (Cheves) in Georgia. Therefore, I concluded that William, son of Josiah Carter of Georgia, must have been my great-grandfather.

Further study of the "Battle Book" followed and is still being pursued. The book, besides being (in my opinion) a paragon in format and genealogical detail, is very readable and interesting. Let me say here that I am not descended from the Battles. My only connection is the connection of William Carter with his (indicated) brother, Christopher A. Carter, who married into the Battle family of Georgia.

In my study of the Battle family group migrations in the period from the War of 1812 to the start of the Civil War, I found numbers of them had migrated from Georgia, and even North Carolina, to northwest Louisiana, northeast Texas and southwest Arkansas. I began to find familiar names of families with whom my people had been friends and neighbors for years. Further study of the dates in the many families concerned showed that the Battles had migrated to this area before, during, and some after, my great-grandfather William Carter had come to this area, and to the same town at the same time.

I will note a single instance; there were many others. From page 438 of the Battle Book:

"Joseph John Battle, born Wake Co., N. C., July 12, 1811, moved to Jackson, Miss.; thence 1844 to Lafayette Co., Ark.; Judge in Lafayette Co.; d. 1876."

As shown in my introductory query, Goodspeed's Biographical Memoirs stated that my Carters resided in North Carolina "until about 1843, when they moved to Mississippi, and thence two years later or in 1845 to Pike County, Arkansas ..." And William Carter's wife, Mary Williams, died in Lafayette Co., Ark. and was buried there in 1845.
