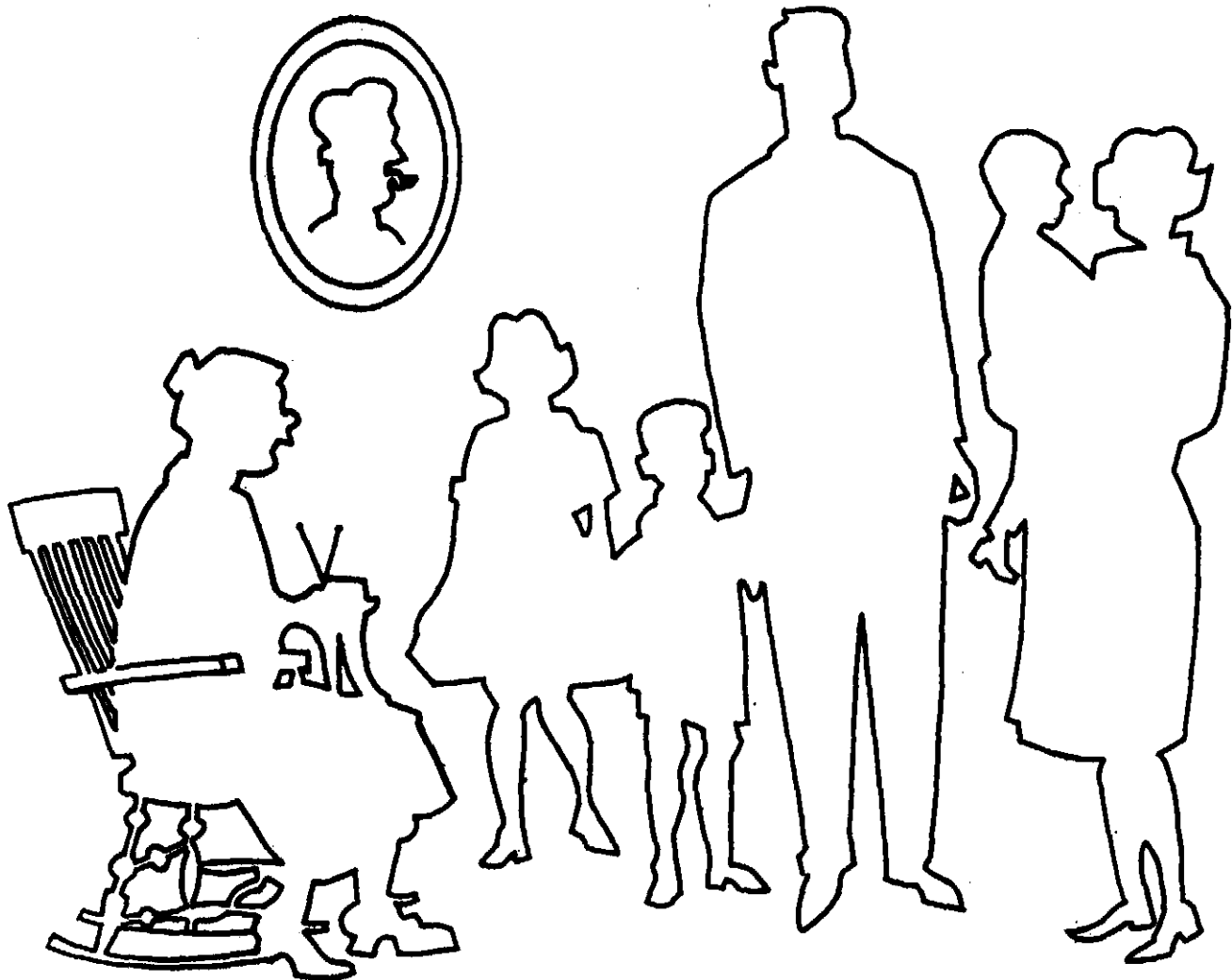

DR. ETHEL WILSON OF CONWAY DIES

CONWAY -- Dr. Ethel Wilson, aged 84, of Conway died Monday.

She was a graduate of Hendrix College, Vanderbilt University and held a doctoral degree from Northwestern University at Evanston, Ill. She was a former teacher at Henderson-Brown College at Arkadelphia and Birmingham Southern College where she also served as dean of women. She was a Methodist.

She was the daughter of the late Mayor B. G. Wilson and Mrs. Wilson of Conway. She had no immediate survivors.

Funeral will be at 11 a.m. Wednesday at McNutt Funeral Chapel here. Burial will be at Oak Grove Cemetery.

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## CLARK FAMILY INFORMATION

MAYFLOWER DECENT

## I RICHARD WARREN

Wife, Elizabeth (Jouatt) Warren. Came in the Mayflower. Joined the Pilgrims from London. He was one of the signers of the Compact in the cabin of the Mayflower, 1620. (Bradford's History)

## II ELIZABETH WARREN

Born in England; died in Hingham, Mass., March 9, 1670 married in Plymouth in 1635-36. Richard Church, who was born about 1608, died in Dedham December 27, 1688 (O.S.), buried in Hingham. (Mayflower descendants IV, 152. V. 118. Hingham Records 1-17. Town Records 1-20).

Richard Church was freeman in Plymouth, January 2, 1632-33. Served in the Pequot War, and was called Sergeant. In 1647 he exchanged his land at Eel River, Plymouth, given him by Mrs. Warren, and removed to Hingham. He made a deposition at Sandwich August 25, 1664, in which he gives his age as "about 56 years."

Born in Plymouth about 1643, died about 1722; married in Hingham December 10, 1667, Johanna Sprague, daughter of William and Millicent (Eames) Sprague, who was born in Hingham, December, 1645, died in Watertown July 11, 1678.

V CALEB CHURCH

Born May 29, 1703, in Watertown, died in Westerly about 1752; removed to Westerly, R.I., where he married September 16, 1731, Rebecca Brand of Westerly.

Caleb Church (V) was called Captain, and Deputy from Westerly 1750, 1751. In the Civic and Military Lists of R.I. Page 74, Caleb Church, Westerly Company, 1736. In 1752, Town's Committeeman, Westerly. Capt. Silas Greenman was appointed "in place of Caleb Church deceased", June 1752- page 158. He was in Westerly in 1746 and sells his rights in certain iron works in Watertown. (Cambridge Wills and Deeds). The descent of Isaac and Caleb can be demonstrated by deeds and administration papers at East Cambridge. (Arnold's V. R. Westerly, R. I., for marriages and births.)

VI CHARLES CHURCH

Born in Westerly, R. I. July 26, 1736, died in Charlestown, R.I. December 21, 1785, married in Charlestown January 12, 1758, Susanna Kenyon of Richamond, R. I., who was born September 4, 1741, died August 8, 1831, in Charlestown. She was a descendant of Jordan de Lanton, Lord of Kenyon in Reign of Henry III of England. Her father was Sylvester Kenyon, a Revolutionary soldier (Smith's Civil and Military Lists). Charles Church (VI) was a prominent man and held civil and military appointments. (Revolutionary soldier.)

CHARLES CHURCH, Ensign, Charleston Senior Class, Co. 1780 P-391, Smith's Civil and Military Lists P-405, 432. He died 1785, and his place was filled by William Kenyon.

## VII PENELOPE CHURCH

Born in Charleston, R. I., August 8, 1763, died in Otis, Mass., May 6, 1840 "age 76" years". Married, day and month not given, 1785-6, in Charleston, R.I., to James Clarke (8) (Joseph 7, William 6, Joshua 5, Joseph 4, Thomas 3, John 2, John 1.) James Clarke (8) was born in Charleston, R.I., November 22, 1764. His sister Dorcas married Asa Church, brother of Penelope Church, his wife. Removed to Loudon, later re-moved to Otis, Mass., about 1800, died there 1844, on January 16. He and Penelope, his wife, conveyed to Asa Church one-sixth of 98 acres of land, and five acres of salt marsh (this was left by Charles Church in his WILL to his daughter Penelope, and owned by him at the time of his death), by deed dated 1800, at Charlestown, R.I. He, James Clarke (8) received fifty acres of land at Loudon, Mass., from his father Joseph Clarke (7) (a Revolutionary soldier), by deed dated March 9, 1808, and recorded September 15, 1808, at Pittsfield, Mass. Administration of the estate was granted to his son James Clarke of Otis, April 1, 1845, and states that "he left no widow surviving him."

XI LAWRENCE EDWARD CLARK

Born in Berkshire County, Mass., June 15 1895, died in V. A. Hospital in Little Rock, Pulaski County, Arkansas, May 3, 1963, age 67, result of Heart Attach.

On July 23, 1919 he married Mary Lois Clark, who was born at Griffithville, Ark., on May 6, 1901. She was the daughter of Rev. James William Clark and Blanch Adelia Berry. Lawrence was called Larry by all his friends and family in Arkansas. He was stationed in the Army at Camp Pike during World War I, after he met and married Lois. He only returned to Mass., on vacations. He loved the hunting and fishing which is so plentiful in Arkansas.

To this union two boys were born, Russell H., and Larry Preston.

Lawrence Edward Clark divorced Mary Lois Clark and married Faye Barnes, probably the day after his divorce.

They had one son, William Edward Clark, b. Sept. 9, 1943.

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MICHAEL DODD - 1779  
-by Elva Pearl (Dodd) Merriott

The first of our line that I have anything on is:  
MICHAEL DODD, born in 1779 in Walker County, Georgia. Next we  
find him in Madison County, Illinois in 1814 according to the  
"History of Madison County, Ill." by BRINKS as Follows:

"MICHAEL DODD entered 317 acres of land in Section 5 on  
Sept. 13-1814 and NAT a blackman 17 years old brought in to  
the territory by Michael Dodd and by him registered to serve  
35 years from May 31-1816 to Sept. 13-1851."

The land entered by Michael Dodd was near Edwardsville,  
Illinois, which is near St. Louis, Missouri on the opposite  
side of the Mississippi River.

Next we find him in the Wayne County, Missouri. Edwards-  
ville is a little over 100 miles from Wayne County and apparent-  
ly when he left Illinois he went to Wayne County, Mo.

In the Census records 1830 Wayne Co., Mo., he is listed as  
follows:

Michael Dodd, Males up to 5 (2) 5 to 10 (1) 15-20 (2)  
30-40 (2) 40-50 (1); Females: 5-10 (2); 10-15 (1); 40-50 (1)

The numbers listed first represents age and in parenthesis

is the number of people in that age bracket.

MICHAEL DODD is believed to have been married at least 3 times, one wife was named Anna\_\_\_\_\_. In the 1830 Wayne County, Mo., census records show living in his household at that time 12 people. So far to date only three sons of that time have been located, these moved to Arkansas along with their Father, MICHAEL DODD, some time between 1830 and 1840.

These children are as follows, (Census records).

- (1) Jessie Dodd born 1806 in Wayne County, Mo., married in Wayne County, 1830 to\_\_\_\_\_. Evidently she was dead by the 1850 census records as she was not on the sensus rolls in 1850 Saline County, Arkansas.

In the 1830 census records: Males 20-30 (1) Females up to 5 (1); 20-30 (1): Two children born in Mo., and one in Ark.

- (a) Elizabeth, born 1832 in Mo.

- (2) William Dodd, born 1808 in Wayne Co., Mo. Married 1833 to Ruth\_\_\_\_\_? either in Illinois or Mo. Their children:
- (a) Michael W. Dodd, born 1836 in Mo.
  - (b) Sarah A. Dodd born 1841 in Mo.
  - (c) Ruth Caroline Dodd, born in Mo. 1846.
  - (d) William L. Dodd, born 1854 in Mo.
  - (e) Emily Dodd, born 1856 in Arkansas
- (3) Elijah Dodd born 1829 in Mo. Married first to Lotta\_\_\_\_\_? born 1830 in Arkansas. (She could be the wife mentioned in the Elijah Dodd Bible, now in possession of Mrs. (Betty Jean (Dodd) Burks) She was listed in the bible as Charolitty Temple Dodd and called Lotta or Lotty for short. This family added a Y to most of the names as: Mattie, Ruthie, Doshie, Freddie, Russie, etc.) She was born Dec. 27, 1830. Elijah Dodd married a 2nd time to Mary Catherine White (or Hefley?) born Feb. 6, 1831. Died March 18-1908 or 1917 (Two dates) in Saline County, Arkansas. Her parents were born in Tennessee. Their children:
- (a) James (Jimmie) Mikal (Michael) Dodd, born Oct. 4-1851 died 1917
  - (b) Nancy Elizabeth Dodd, born Jan. 1-1852
  - (c) Isadora Dodd born\_\_\_\_\_died, age 17 years.
  - (d) John Henry Dodd, born Sept. 24, 1854
  - (e) Drew Allen Dodd, born 1857 in Saline Co., Ark.
  - (f) Charollote Temple Dodd, born Feb. 1, 1862
  - (g) Isaac Monroe Dodd, born April 15, 1865, Saline Co., Ark.
  - (h) Anny Mary Mately Dodd, born Dec. 18, 1870, Saline Co., Ark.
  - (i) Sarah Emily Issabelle Dodd, born Feb. 3, 1874, died Oct. 15, 1938, Saline, Co., Ark.
- (Each child will be written up as it has been proven to be, in later pages.)

transferred to Field and Staff, same regiment. On April 16, 1887 Michael Dodd, Jr. applied for a pension due to the fact that in August of 1864 he was attacked with flux caused by exposure and Army dead and has ever since then been afflicted with chronic diarrhea and piles. Also that he was only treated at the Regimental hospital in Little Rock. He stated that when he enrolled in the Army he was a farmer; and that now his occupation is that of a Physician; age 46 years, 5' 8 height, complexion fair, Hair Black, eyes black; Pension apparently was not granted. His last wife Theadoshia Biddle Patterson Dodd received a widow pension until her death in 1928. She died in Devol, Oklahoma.

Military records may be obtained (copy from the: General Services Administration, Washington, D. C.)

Michael Dodd and his sister Lucinda, and brother Marion Dodd all attended Zion Baptist Church Sunday School. The Sunday School Minutes, kept by John S. ENGLISH while serving as Sunday School Superintendent, show them registered for Sunday School on Oct. 30, 1881. The minutes were kept from July 27, 1873. This will show that Marion Dodd was living in the year of Oct. 30, 1881, so he died some time after this date, Yell Co., Ark.

Michael Dodd, Jr., born Oct. 29, 1841, died Oct. 16, 1894 (Head Stone records) His head stone is made of solid iron with a glass inset, this inset has the paper record of date of death and birth and name). (Census shows him being born 1840) This glass inset is broken by a storm and needs repairs badly) Nancy M. Dodd (what does the M. stand for?) A great grand daughter Elve Pearl (Dodd) Merriott visited their graves for the first time June 29, 1969.

Michael Dodd, Berry Dodd, Peterson Dodd, Elijah Dodd, and Pleasant Dodd were listed in Walker Co., Ga. census 1840. (or Walker Co. Ala.?)

-Documents-

Michael Dodd, Jr. - when his first wife, Nancy Elizabeth English Dodd died, May 10, 1881, age 41; he married Theadashia (Biddle) Patterson, widow of Joe Patterson, they were married June 16, 1881, she died July 20, 1928, Devol, Okla.

Elmer Pemberton Dodd the last child of Michael Jr., was about 4 yrs. old when his mother died. His step-mother was not a good mother to the small children, and according to tradition she received all of the property and estate, leaving the children nothing.

In the 1860 Census of Yell Co., Ark, Post Office Lafore, Dwelling number 819 is listed: John English age 24 male born Tenn. and wife Mary age 24.

Michael Dodd remarried 1831 in Mo. wife's name not known. He married again in Saline County, Arkansas, the marriage record, Dec. 30, 1839 to Sally (Sarah) Price, a widow. (Sarah's first husband's name unknown to this date). She was born in 1793 in North Carolina. She had a daughter Mary (called, Polly) Price, born in Missouri. Polly died Sept. 17, 1917 and is buried in Salem Church Cemetery, Yell County, Ark. (one date gives her as being born Jan. 15, 1836). Polly was listed only as Mary - in the Michael Dodd census records, which has caused some confusion to researchers. She was known as Polly Dodd and Michael may have adopted (this has not been proven yet). She married John S. English, who was born Aug. 29, 1834, died April 29, 1898. (More on Polly in the following information).

MICHAEL DODD and wife Sally had one son:

Michael Dodd, Jr., born 1840, Yell County, Arkansas, died Oct. 16, 1894, buried at Salem Church Cemetery in Plainview, Arkansas. Married 1865 to Nancy Elizabeth M. English, dau. of John English, Sr. She was born 1840 in Arkansas. Died May 10, 1881, buried by her husband at Salem Cemetery.

(She was born July 4, 1840)

Michael Dodd Jr., and Polly, his half sister married brother & sister: John and Nancy ENGLISH. Michael and Nancy had six known children:

- (a) Marion Dodd, died 1881, unmarried (in late teens or early 20's, buried in Yell Co., Ark.
- (b) Emily Dodd, born 1870 in Ark., married John Willis Carden, first, then 2nd to a man named Rhea. They lived in Sparkman, Arkansas.
- (c) Theadoshia Dodd, born June 19, 1867, Yell Co., Ark. Died May 17, 1923 buried, Antioch Church Cemetery, Saline Co., Ark. First married George W. Caldwell. 2nd to Harvey Tillery.
- (d) Sarah Saphronia Dodd born May 30, 1870, died 1920 at age 50 years, buried at Carter Cemetery, Plainview, Ark. (Yell Co.) Married Bemister Waddie Dawson in Yell Co., Ark.
- (e) Lucinda M. Dodd born 1855, died \_\_\_\_\_, buried at Carter Cemetery in Yell Co., Ark. Married 1st Hugh Virden, born Feb. 11, 1857. Died April 12, 1885, age 32 yrs. She married a second time to George Bittle, born in Ala. (More on Lucinda M. Dodd, in following information).
- (f) Elmer Pemberton Dodd, born March 28, 1877. Died May 12, 1958, Hot Springs, Arkansas, (Garland Co.) Married Louanna Iona Tillery.

MICHAEL DODD, JR. was born in 1840 in Arkansas. Was in Dardan-elle, Yell Co., Ark., in 1860. Michael Dodd, Jr. enlisted in the Confederate Army, Feb. 28, 1862 at Dardenelle, Ark., for 12 months. He was 5th Sergeant Co. "D" 31st Arkansas Inf. On Feb. 28, 1863 he was listed as "AWOL" and dropped from the roll in April 1863. Michael Dodd, Jr. enlisted in the UNION Army Feb. 16, 1863 and was discharged June 1865; Served in Co. "E" 4th Rgt. of Arkansas Volunteers commanded by Capt. L. Gregg, was discharged at Little Rock, Ark., June 13, 1865. He served as Hospital nurse in Regt. Hospital in Little Rock from Oct. 9th 1864 to June 30, 1865. He was promoted to Hospital Steward and

In dwelling # 820 is listed Nancy English age 52 born in Ohio. It is assumed for the present that this is the mother of Nancy English, who married Michael Dodd, Jr. (need further study on this.)

In the 1870 Census of Yell Co., Ark. Darenelle Post Office Michael Dodd, Jr. is listed as being age 31, a dry goods merchant and born in Ark. His wife's name is not listed, but children Mary (?) age 3; and Emily 4/12 months are listed.

Recently, while researching my 'SCOTT' lineage in the Library of Congress, Jeffersonian room, I noted your excellent periodical, 'The Arkansas Family Historian.'

I am wondering if you have any information concerning the descendants of the emigrant, JAMES SCOTT, 1746 to Virginia Plantation, after the Battle of Culloden, Scotland, who married Elizabeth Pegram, of Prince George County, Virginia.

Their only son, I believe, Captain William Scott married Anne Mason, and were the parents of, Mary Mason Scott, who married Theodorick Scott, Lt-Gen. Winfield Scott, who married Maria D. Mayo, of Richmond, Virginia and Colonel James Scott (War 1812) who married Martha Pegram of Dinwiddie, Va., and others of whom I know, but do not bear 'Scott' surname.

According to my records as of 1918, Mary Mason=Theodorick Scott's son, James Daniel Scott moved to Arkadelphia, Arkansas, 'where some of his family live now.'

Another, DAR application, National Number 130335, gives, 'see affidavit made by Capt. C. C? Scott of Arkadelphia, Arkansas (1919) verifying applicats descent from Capt. William Scott (Rev. War) and Anne Mason. In Petersburg Daily Express (Va), 1-18-1859, I found an item concerning Judge C.C. Scott dying in Arkansas, and possibly he could be the father of Capt. C.C. Scott.

A Woman from Florida, in 1967 wrote that she was related, cousin-wise, to Lt. Gen. Winfield Scott and mentions she had cousins living in Forrest City, Arkansas and one name (she could not remember) was President of the Arkansas Power and Light Company.

Lt-Gen. Winfield Scott has no living descendants bearing 'Scott' surname. Colonel James Scott and Martha Pegram, had a son, Dr. Edward Pegram Scott who married Elizabeth Binn Wilkins of Greensville County, Va., and he died in St. Louis, Mo. Among their children were Elizabeth Scott who married the Rev. Patrick Gibson Robert, Rector of Christ Church, Little Rock, Arkansas from May 1st, 1866 to June 1st, 1869 according to his diary.

Another child was Captain E. P. Scott, Jr. who married M. A. Merrill of Arkansas, June 23rd, 1866, performed, again according to diary, by Dr. Robert. I wonder if Capt. E. P. Scott, had a brother William, who married Adele Hunter and who were the children of Capt. E. P. Scott and M. A. Merrill?

My grandmother, Floretta Scott, born in 1865, spoke of Lt. Gen. Winfield Scott, as her great-uncle. She was the daughter of William Scott and Adele Hunter. Her father, my great-grandfather, William Scott was killed near Pea Ridge, after Civil War, by 'marauders' which she remembered vividly.

I do not know who William Scott's parents were, but lineage must be from Anne Mason Scott-Theodorick Scott (my father's name was Theodore Scott Cole) or from Dr. E. P. Scott.

ESSEX, CAROLINE and CUMBERLAND COUNTIES, VIRGINIA

Jonas Meador was born in Essex County, Va., ca. 1696-1700 and was the oldest of four sons of John Meador by a second marriage of John Meador. His brothers were Job, Joshua and Jason. Here started the practice of using Biblical names beginning with the letter J or interchangeable I, followed by many descendants. Jonas was living in Caroline County in May 1749, when he purchased land in Cumberland County. In 1768 he died in the County and his widow died there in 1773. Her name was Frances. The ancestry of Jonas is: John, Thomas Jr., Thomas.

Jonas and Frances raised seven sons and two daughters: Joel, Jonas, Jr., John, Josiah, Jehu, Joab, Jesse, Mary and Frances. Some data is given about each with exception of Josiah and Joab. Joel moved to Bedford County where he became a large landholder, raised a large family with descendants in many States. John did likewise in Franklin County, Virginia. Jonas Jr., Jehu and Jesse remained in Cumberland County.

The latest edition includes some burials in Family Grave Yards, with their locations, also more than 500 Meador Marriages both in and out of the State and mostly prior to 1850.

Sources are cited, also a full index is provided.

This book covers a detailed account of a branch of the Meador Family that has not previously been treated extensively in print and within these limits may be of considerable value to such other descendants.

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QUERIES

Arkansas is a beautiful place and one of the very best views is the Old State Capitol, as you enter the gate. A very beautiful building, behind well kept grounds and fountain. The beauty of the place is worth a visit, but the Arkansas History Commission is housed in the west wing of the building and this is a real treasure house for those interested in genealogy.

When you enter the door of the reading room you will be met by the most helpful people you would ever dream of finding. They are very busy and you may have to wait a few minutes but you will find they will give full attention to your problem whether you are a beginner or a professional searcher. Do not expect them to have a history of your ancestor, to hand you, for that seldom happens, and they do not do your research, but they will make every effort to help you find the material you need. You must know enough about the family you are seeking to tell them the name, time and location. If the location is not known, that will be your first problem to solve.

There is a card index of biographies which would be the best place to start. If you do not locate your subject you may at least find the location of families of that surname and that would be a clue to begin your search.

The 1830 and 1840 Census has been transcribed and indexed. There is a surname list for the 1850 census and many of the counties have been transcribed and are available in book form. If your family was in Arkansas early they may appear on these. All Arkansas Census records are available on microfilm but this will be a lot of reading unless you locate the county or at least the general area.

There are microfilm copies of early county tax lists and miscellaneous county records. The amount of records available from any county, depends upon the interest that has been shown by the county in contributing their records to the History Commission.

Other records available there include Military records, newspapers, almost all released census records of all states (all of Arkansas), Indian Records, Cemetery lists, diaries, and many more, but my space is running out, as your time will, long before you cover a small part of the above information.

When you have spent your time and must leave, you may have found much on your family, or you may have found nothing! Anyway, you will have had a pleasant day, and do not give up--some of us have been searching for years for an elusive ancestor and some day-----.
