

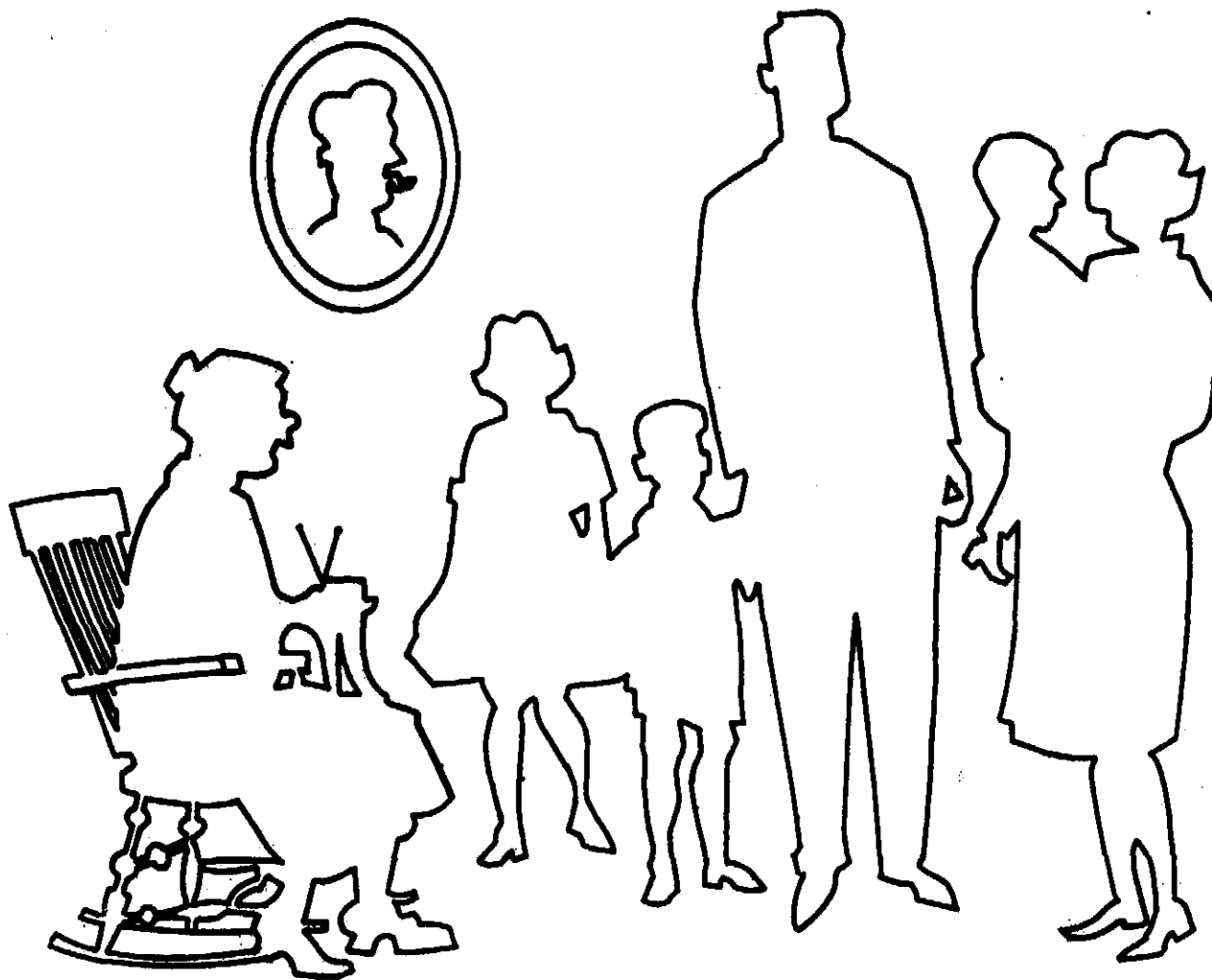

Preface

"For as much as many have taken in hand to set forth in order a declaration of those things which are most surely believed among us:"

We admire the beginning of the first chapter of Saint Luke's dialogue. It is our fixed opinion that modern day Biblical scholars, intent on updating the sentence structure of too much of our Holy Scripture and energetically eager to "tell it like it is," would do well to consider that amending the phraseology quoted above could leastwise remove the euphony therefrom but nowise clarify the meaning thereof. We mean to imply that we understand and prefer it "like it has been."

Our interest in genealogy would be the end result of an inherited instinct expressed in the observation, "It seems to be man's eternal quest to know all that he can." But most likely, now that we have time for it, it is just something we want to do.

Our efforts to set forth those things most surely known among us or to be learned began by communicating with older relations and friends who could help us. We should now acknowledge the generous assistance provided by Harold R. Heard, currently president of Panhandle Chapter, Sons of the American Revolution, address, RFD 3, Box 174-A, Amarillo, Texas, 79107. Harold is not of our particular lineage but has stated his opinion to be that the South Carolina Heards are remotely of kin to the Georgia and Virginia Heards. Harold probably has done more research of Heard genealogies than any other compiler of relative information. He has been a delightful correspondent. We are hopeful to have an opportunity to meet him personally. We are also fortunate to have made contact with Lawrence F. LeSturgeon, P.O. Box 641, Charlotte, North Carolina, 27201, another generous correspondent sincerely determined to pursue his distaff Heard lineage to an eventful beginning. It is particularly important to me that special credit be given to two long time friends, namely, Mrs. Sam Henry, nee Nana Harrison, for having the most information concerning my mother's parents, the Dials, and Mrs. Gertrude B. Atchison, nee Gertie Bowers, 707 Keith Street, Malvern, Arkansas, for vivid memories of her close contemporary friendship with the Heards of Lono. Gertie warmed the cockles of mine heart with accounts of party entertainment provided by families in the community. Several members of my grandparents family could make dancing music of one kind or another and offered their hospitality regularly and on short notice. The words, "You all come," got around quickly; everybody did, had a good time and nobody left hungry. One comment not overtly mentioned was her recall that sincere courtesy and politeness betwixt the immediate family was evident as a way of life and unfailingly bestowed upon all guests.

Several families are discussed in our project; many others comprising cherished friendships could be included and accorded high honors. We will mention one time only that older generations most generally stressed the value and importance of integrity, courage, and industry. Over-emphasizing the standards our ancestors and neighbors adhered to would not enhance the priceless heritage they willed to us. We realize that technology has changed the old way of life and has removed most of us from the togetherness that influenced the families living before our time. All of us now living, and considered to be the older generation, have lived through several replacements of social structures and in each instance the new concept was adopted to keep apace. It is hoped that future generations will make satisfactory adaptations to predictable changes certain to arrive. The winds of chance continue to blow; however, the new direction is not so obvious. Above all you must understand and manage transience.

Brief mention will be made of some of the most remarkable people ever to inhabit America. They are folks you already know--your parents and grandparents. Need we remind you they lived through our history's greatest depression, or that by their own efforts they survived by reason of determination to do so. Better things in life and eternal life have always been the primary goals of our ancestors and of yours, whoever you are. Their unselfish love and devotion made provision for us to become healthier, better educated and otherwise enabled us to achieve and hopefully enjoy a more abundant life. It is the hope of these two generations that you, "Look to your heart and may your wisdom grow to power of lightning and peace of snow." Surely, you won't accomplish anything by negative thinking or by any means other than courage, honest industry, and faith in Almighty God.

We would now divert attention to what we presently know about our Heard lineage. Perhaps you have adjudged our approach to this task as having been too slow. Never-the-less we still cling to the idea that solely statistical data is not all there is to be associated with a genealogical record provided the supplemental information conveys anything of interest.

We began our amateur research late in 1970 with the assumption that perhaps our ancestors came to America after the Revolution of 1776 ended and when conditions were purportedly stabilized. We supposed they entered through the port of Charleston, South Carolina and migrated southward in search of good homesteads made available after the Louisiana Purchase in 1803. Their logical route would have been a trek westward and crossing the Mississippi River at Memphis. Hereabouts, most everything west of Crowley's Ridge, running more or less north and south through Arkansas, was then unsettled country without marked safe trails. Better inducements lured them south via the Old Military Road.

It has been the definite opinion of all the older generations we have known or communicated with that our ancestry was English with an Irish or Scotch-Irish background. The oldest generations we have accounted for begin with William Hiram Heard, born 4-28-1807 in South Carolina. We don't know anything about him or his family between the time he was born until we found him living on the Black Warrior River in Fayette County, Alabama, not far from Tuscaloosa. In 1845 he brought his family to Hot Spring County, Arkansas and acquired land in the vicinity of Lono. The records, both

personal and public, prove this to have been a literate family that did not neglect the pursuit of all the education available to their children and grandchildren. They were landowners, industrious farmers, and cattlemen. We don't know whether the fact that quite a few of the Heard males were of small physical stature means anything. Stalwarts appeared in second and third generations and seemingly from their distaff ancestry.

It is a matter of record that Willis Henry Davis came from Hardeman County, Tennessee to Lono, Hot Spring County, Arkansas in 1857. The Davis papers contain information that William Hiram Heard was enroute to Texas. He arrived at Lono in poor health and decided to remain there after he recuperated. The Davis family would have known this as Adelee, the daughter of Willis Henry Davis, married Zachariah, the son of William Hiram.

We stated above the presumption that our forefathers came over after the end of the American Revolution. We will forthwith refute that allegation, and we might best delete it. However, we will leave it be, hopefully to demonstrate that a theory usually is abandoned after it fails to uphold the premise. The American Revolutionary War is dated 1775-1783. We have found that William Hiram Heard was born in 1807. Now folks, this is not long after George Washington became president in 1789. We therefore submit our later, more definite opinion that our progenitors might well have been American Patriots in 1776. Doubt ye not that our forefathers, mine and yours, whoever you are, "allus" had the courage to uphold their convictions.

Our research has revealed a much greater number of widely spread Heard families than we had expected to find. We have not yet identified the parents of William Hiram Heard, but hope that somehow, someday, somebody will succeed in doing so. We are not yet resigned to defeat and would inquire of you; how does one measure progress? We have amassed considerable information without recognizing the connection we are looking for. How-some-ever, this means that any successor can continue our project and with the benefit of what we have compiled be able to take up where we left off. Whether we eventually find kinship with illustrious ancestry is something to be considered as of no value to us, unless by our commendable stewardship we can show that we honestly represent their standards of excellence. We should hope to find them possessed of integrity, and toward this end result the omens are favorable.

How-some-ever, was it not John the Baptist who proclaimed, "What is to be, will be." Today nobody doubts that he knew whereof he spake. We must presently halt and do something with what we have afore time catches up with us. Already there are times when we suspect it might be later than we think. We hope to be able to arrange our files in proper order and on some much later date pass them on to subsequent generations.

Time caught up with Melvin L. Heard in the summer of 1973. The data which he compiled has been sorted and edited by Patsy Heard Melton, Route 1, Leola, Arkansas. Additional information has been obtained and is being sought. We would appreciate any assistance available as to new data or corrections to existing data.

(1) These names and dates of birth were copied from the Bible of Andrew Jackson Heard by Leona, wife of John Willis Heard. The list was dated 6-14-1914 and given to Mrs. Martha Allen Nowlin, 1511 E. Mill Street, Malvern, Arkansas.

(2) 1850 census record for Hot Spring County, Arkansas page 576

(3) Lono Cemetary is located on Arkansas highway nine approximately thirteen miles south of Malvern.

(4) A notation was found indicating Benjamin Carven and Dora M. Thomas were married 4-27-1873 by Rev. Leonard. Both taught in the Choctaw Indian Nation of Oklahoma. They also had a general store, Dora died about three years after Ben. Soon thereafter, Uncle Jack (Andrew Jackson Heard) brought the four surviving children to Arkansas and reared them near Lono.

(5) 1860 census for Clear Creek Twn., Hot Spring County, Arkansas

(6) All of the boys except Andrew Jackson were soldiers in the Civil War and all but Charles were Confederates. The records of each(except Charles) can be found in the archives, State of Arkansas. After it was decided that the Confederacy was a lost cause, it was agreed that Charles might be better off to join the Union Army which he did. He was a teamster under Captain Steele, was captured near Malvern, Arkansas and taken to a prison camp(called Island 10) in Texas. He was later released by reason of illness (dysentery) and died soon after enroute home. Place of death and burial is unknown but believed to be in Louisiana. A letter from Benjamin Carven to his father and mother, dated September 11, 1876, indicated that Charles died on the Bevil Road, six miles from Bevil. The men who lived were carried to a camp of retribution near New Orleans and exchanged.

John Thomas joined soon after Steel came into Little Rock. His wife Helen drew a pension.

William Hiram was a private in Company D, 20th Ark. Infantry under Colonel Johnson. He was paroled in December 1863.

Zachariah Loon was a private in Company D, 20th Reg. Infantry. He served from March 1862 to October 1864. He was taken prisoner and sent to Vicksburg, where he was released in October, 1864. His widow Zilpha Adelee Heard filed for a pension 10-2-1907. The application was approved for \$100.00.

(7) Martha Brent was previously married to a Downey and to a Deer before marrying Stephen Heard.

MOORE'S CHAPEL CEMETERY - Yell County -108-

Directions: Highway # to Waveland, Arkansas. At Waveland, there is a road that turns to the left, in the center of town, once on that road, it is about four miles to the Moore's Chapel Cemetery. Anyone can tell you the direction once you are in Waveland. Waveland is about 10 miles west of Danville on Highway 10.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Moore's Chapel Cemetery Readings were compiled by Mrs. Bettie Joe (Miller-Sammons) Abernatha, 110 East Kemper Street, Lubbock, Texas, 79403, off and on 1971, 1972, 1973.

"It has a small Chapel, fenced grounds, and Gates with name over one of the gates. It is taken care of by one of the Foster Boys, either Hoyt P., Orrester, or M. B., and some others help from time to time. Of course they have a Decoration Day. The graves are not in a direct line, and are sort of on a hill, so water will run off. I have tried to copy all markers, but it was impossible to do at one time. I copied each year since 1971. And copied a few each time we went on vacation. In 1972 I spent several hours on two different days. Then once I stayed over 6 hours. Some important ones may have been copied two times. There are som broken ones, unreadable, and there are many with Rock head and foot stones, that have been white washed. Also there have been some bodies and stones moved from this Cemetery, when the Blue Mountain Dam project was started. I have some Obituaries of some from Yell County Record Paper, since the last time I was there. I am willing to share. I am sure some were over-looked and not copied but not on purpose. I also have a few from Old Danville Cemeteries Danville, Arkansas. I can supply some of the maiden names of some of these.

STORY OF AN EARLY  
SETTLEMENT IN CENTRAL ARKANSAS

Russell White Benedict

Russell White Benedict wrote a manuscript shortly after 1880, concerning the settlement of the Standlee and Benedict families in Arkansas. This was published some years ago in the Conway newspaper, and portions reprinted in Faulkner Facts and Fiddlings, Vol. III Number 1, January 1961. The manuscript is said to be in the possession of Edgar B. Parker, and to have attached to it, some notes on genealogy. The author of this manuscript was my grandfather and I am one member of the Texas branch of the Benedict family who is still trying to collect family records on both the Benedict and Standlee (Stanley) families, and it is truly discouraging, as Russell White Benedict was born in Missouri Territory and we are unable to connect his father, John C., with other Benedict lines. Neither can we find sufficient information on John Standlee, father-in-law of John C., who explored and later moved into Arkansas as one of the earliest settlers.

This manuscript states that John C. Benedict died February 28, 1828, and was buried near Cantonment Gibson, then a newly established fort on Grand River, 125 miles above Fort Smith, in the Indian Nation, and known as the "Loveless Purchase". He also refers to the death of John Standlee, Aug. 21, 1820, buried about a mile above the mouth of Palarm Creek. A footnote states that this land has been eaten away by the Arkansas River. Is there a chance this burial site is still there? Are there stones with information for either of these men?

Arkansas History Books we have located refer to this manuscript of my grandfather's as written when he was elderly. He died in 1900 and was buried in Munday, Texas, my home town, a fact which is usually misquoted. We heartily agree with comments on his poor memory of facts and family traditions-- as we think it likely that John C. was John Curtis, born in Connecticut-- listed as living with wife and children in Missouri in 1816, his first wife having died and left this child in Connecticut. They were hatters and other children were named Russell White after the Russell White Hat Co. there-- part of which is family tradition. This manuscript lists John C. born in New York, which doesn't check out, neither does the German background instead of English.

In the many Benedict histories we are the only lines that can not be fitted into place with accurate facts -- but determination is what keeps our Societies going. I would like very much to obtain a copy of this manuscript.

CONFEDERATES TO BRAZIL

By Edison Dale Jeffus

Reading "Confederates to Brazil" by Inez E. Cline in the Arkansas Family Historian (Vol. XII, Number 1, January-February-March 1974) caused me to remember vividly an old letter tucked away in an even older family bible in a trunk in the attic of the house in Ouachita County, Arkansas, in 1858 by my great grandfather, Samuel Jeffus. One of my first cousins, Samuel Henry Jeffus, who presently lives in the old Jeffus home, lent the letter dated August 26, 1867 to me so that it might be copied, reproduced and shared by others that are interested in early Arkansas family history.

Unfortunately, I do not know whether my great grandmother's brother, Joel E. Butler, went to Brazil after the yellow fever epidemic subsided. His name was not listed among the old families named in Mrs. Judith MacKnight Jones' "Soldado Descansa (Soldiers Rest)." As a matter of fact, the letter which follows represents the extent of my information about J. E. Butler.

Very briefly, Joel E. Butler was one of Martha Catharine Butler's brothers: they were children of Thomas and Rachel Butler who reared their family in Orangeburg District, South Carolina. Martha Catharine was born on June 28, 1830 and married Dr. George Myron Adamson at Seminary, Arkansas (a settlement about 7 miles north of Stephens, Arkansas) on January 1, 1861. I believe that Martha Catharine lived with an older sister, R. A. Elizabeth Butler and her husband, G. W. Schoggin at Seminary, Arkansas, before returning to South Carolina about 1857 and then returning to Arkansas prior to her marriage to Dr. Adamson in 1861. Other available letters and a biographical sketch on Thomas W. Butler, Mars Hill Township, Lafayette County, Arkansas (page 353, "Biographical and Historical Memoirs of Southern Arkansas", The Goodspeed Publishing Company) suggests that his father, John C. Butler, Martha Catharine Butler and R. A. Elizabeth Butler and her husband G. W. Schoggin and possibly Joel Butler arrived in Ouachita County in 1850 from Alabama. Apparently Joel Butler later moved to Milam County Texas, where he was living when he wrote this letter.

Dr. George Myron Adamson and Martha Catharine Butler had three daughters; the second oldest daughter, Martha Lee Adamson married Daniel Green Jeffus on September 16, 1886. Daniel Green Jeffus was the youngest child of Samuel Jeffus and his second wife, Catharine (Durham) Davis and inherited the old Jeffus house about nine miles southwest of Camden, Arkansas, off the Mt. Holly Road.

The pleasures derived from sifting through the many letters, memorabilia and other art treasures in the attic of this home in attempting to piece together the JEFFUS-ADAMSON-BUTLER and related family histories can not be adequately described but can be appreciated by family historians and genealogists.

Please let me know if anyone finds a trace of my ancestors in Brazil. The letter is as follows:

Milam Co Texas August 26, 1867

Dr Adamson and Sister Martha

You will be surprised to see Thomas come back and learn that we have not yet gone to brazil We didnt get off untill the yellow feave commenced and when we got to Milican the hearded that the emigrants that had gone over were dissatisfied and the two together caused us to stop and wait untill we could hear from them for our selves and if they are satisfied we will go on as soon as the Yellow fever subsides and if

they are dissatisfied we will not go at all but I think we hear false report as coming from them. Jimmie has written and will tell you how they are Mattie has also written she has another girl baby. my health is very good at this time. I have nothing interesting to write at this time so I shall not write much as Tommey can tell you all that I can write. I would like very much to see you all but I dont know that I shall ever see you again but I may if I do not get off to brazil. I will write to you again as soon as I hear from the Old man Weaver and let you know what he thinks of Brazil give Mr Campbell my respects tell him I will write to him when I get some direct news from the colony I would have written to more of my friends but Tommey has just got his poney and will start in the morning so I have not got time to write to them Sister Martha kiss the children for me and tell them that I want to see them very bad. You and Dock must write to me and I will write again soon

accept the love of your brother  
/s/ J. E. Butler

Mattie has written to sister Ellen as we wrote to you but Tommie can tell you all that we have omitted to write.

THE 1900 CENSUS

The U.S. Census of 1900 is now available for research in the National Archives in Washington. Access to the census is restricted to "those certified by the Archivist of the United States as engaged in legitimate historical, legal, genealogical or other bona fide research." Prospective researchers must present evidence of their status and sign a data-use agreement form before access to the 1900 census will be granted.

A genealogical researcher is defined as one whose use of the census relates to the discovery of factual information about a particular person or family enumerated in the census. In establishing the legitimacy of the research the archivist will need to know if the researcher has a connection with the person or family whose records are desired, either by relationship or by authorization. Researchers must agree that "they will not publish or otherwise disclose in any manner any information about persons or families specifically identified in the stated scope of their authorized research.

The 1900 census schedules and the index may be used only at the Archives. No copies are available through the archives branches of the Federal records centers. Reproduction of the census or the index is prohibited, so the History Commission cannot buy microfilm copies nor can the National Archives search the census and send copies by mail. To see the 1900 census you must go to Washington, D. C.

I. A Quaker, William Horn, of Nansemond Co., Virginia, was the father of Henry Horn, b. November 21, 1716.

Constitution in 1776. John Battle, the grandfather of Elisha, had come to Virginia from England in 1654, settling on the Nansemond River. Elizabeth (Sumner) Battle was the daughter of John Sumner, who was related to General Jethro Sumner of the Continental Army. Elizabeth died 1-19-1794 in Edgecombe Co., N. C.

Some were born in Georgia as Henry E. Horne removed from Halifax Co., N. C. in 1817 to Putnam Co., Georgia. The lines of the second m. children have not been traced. It is known that Orran C. Horne was appointed Guardian of his brothers and sisters, May 2, 1842, and lived in Houston Co., Ga. Orran C., also served in the Confederate Army as Capt., Co. G, 10th Ga., Inf. Whitmell Horne appears on the 1848 tax book for Union Co., Arkansas, indicating he moved west. The Henry E. Horne family is recorded on the Putnam Co., Ga., U. S. Census for 1820. SILOAM CEMETERY, FAULKNER COUNTY, ARKANSAS  
By W. E. Bailey, Enola

Siloam Cemetery is located about two and one half miles north east of Enola, Faulkner County, Arkansas, and about a half mile off the main road which comes to a dead end when it reaches the cemetery, in Section 27, Township 7, Range 11 North.

The small cemetery dates back to the 1840s and at this time it has 230 graves with only 86 of them with markers. It is seldom used any more and has very few visitors, but it is kept in good condition by donations of the people in the area. In times past the road continued on past the place going north, and there used to be another road crossed there going east and west making the place at a cross-road. It was called Siloam Springs because there were two good springs down by the Curtis Branch, which was close by.

In the late 40s or early 50s a log house with two fire places, one at each end of the house, was erected, which was to be used by the newly established Mount Zion Baptist Church, the newly formed school and eventually the Enola Lodge No. 124.

Some of those buried in this cemetery still have people living in the community, while others, the names are forgotten except for being on records. It is not know for sure who was the first buried at Siloam, but this is the list of those who have markers.

Curtis, John F., was born in Virginia, Feb. 24, 1812, and his wife Elizabeth M. Caudle, was born Jan. 5, 1820. They were married Oct. 31, 1838, in Decature, Newton County, Miss. In 1845 or 1846 the Curtis family, along with the Heffington and Brady Families, traveled across country together until they reached Garland Springs. The Brady Family remained near Garland Springs, while the Heffingtons moved on to the west to Cross-roads, and the Curtis Family, came south, and more than likely, stopped his wagon at the springs near Siloam. It was here the Curtises homesteaded several hundred acres of land.

John and Elizabeth Curtis had four sons and three daughters. The sons were John, Will, Sam and Jesse. John and Elizabeth were buried at Siloam Cemetery, but no markers were ever put at their graves.

The Mount Zion Baptist Church had it's beginning about the middle of the month of August 1857, at Siloam Cemetery a short distance from where Enola is now located. A few years after the church was established, it became a member of the Caroline Association in 1860. The moderator of this new organization was G. W. Ford; W. H. Lendsey was the Clerk and S. E. Lamar was Treasurer.

One of the activities of the Church referred to the Masonic Lodge, which was the Enola Lodge No. 124. The Church members and the lodge members were about the same people.

The Charter of the lodge was issued to: Alex Connell, Worshipful Master; W. H. Woods, Senior Warden; and R. T. Harrison, Junior Warden. The mailing address of the people in this community is uncertain because of the locations of the two Post Offices at that time. According to the Post Office Department, Cane Creek Post Office, in what is now Faulkner County, was established November 3, 1858, with John Casey as Postmaster. Cane Creek Post Office was two and one half miles south of Siloam. McGlone Post Office was established June 3, 1867, with T. P. McGlone, first Postmaster. The McGlone Post Office was one and one half miles west of Siloam.

The Masonic Lodge, the school and the church, all at Siloam, ceased to function after the Civil War.

It was not many years after the Civil War that the old log school house was getting in very bad condition for Church, School and Lodge use. Neither group was in favor of erecting a new building, and they all had good reasons for not building a new building, as most of the people had begun to either move toward Enola or toward Mt. Vernon, and leaving Siloam about half way between the two communities. Mt. Zion Church came to Enola and Lodge No. 124 went to Mt. Vernon, and each place then built their own schools just like the one they had at Siloam. Enola opened up her school in the log house that one of our Arkansas; and well known educators was born in, Dr. John Hugh Reynolds. Mt. Zion Baptist Church was not pleased with the location of the building. It was over a mile away on Matthews Hill. It was a good Log House, but they wanted one closer to the town, which was then beginning to be formed. However they took the house for about one year while they could purchase a lot and put up a new Church building. Everything worked out pretty well.

The Church sold the Log House at Matthews Hill to Mt. Vernon to be used for a school and lodge building. They bought a lot from John Haley. In 1884 the Church became associated with the County Association. Stephen Lamar was elected Treasurer of the association. Some of the members of the Church at that time were: George and Nora Lane; S. E. Lamar; George and Adaline Dalton; Joseph and Sarah Matthews; T. R. Bryant; J. A. Milam; G. R. Brown; B. G. Muse; H. Sanders; J. J. Matthews; J. H. Cummings; Dr. J. H. Purefoy; R.H. Middletin; G. W. Ford; W. H. Lendsey, and many others.

In 1862, the Arkansas legislature appropriated funds to be distributed among the counties of the state for aid to families of Confederate soldiers needing assistance. (Prior to this, aid had been available to indigent families of soldiers under a variety of programs established by the various county courts.) Circuit clerks in the counties which participated in the state program compiled a "descriptive list of the families of indigent soldiers" to support their applications for the state funds. These lists contained: (1) the soldier's name; (2) the county in which he enlisted; (3) the regiment or military organization in which the soldier was serving or had served; (4) the soldier's service status (in service, dead, or discharged); and, (5) the names and ages of members of the soldier's family and the relation of each to the soldier.

The Randolph County Court issued on March 2, 1863, orders to justices of the peace in each of the townships to ascertain the indigent families of soldiers within each township. The townships and the justices of the peace appointed for that purpose were: Big Black, Gideon M. McNabb; Cache, Hammond W. Ratcliffe; Columbia, Francis M. Russell; Current River, Hiram A. Kelsey; Davidson, Michael Looney; Demun, James C. Winters; Little Black, William T. Johnson; McCoy, William J. Cleveland; Roanoke, John Hufstedler; Spring River, William B. Jones; Union, John F. Morris; and, Wiley, Andrew J. Collier. The list, as reported by the justices, was recorded in the county court record (Book B, pages 116-123) on April 6, 1863, and a supplementary list was recorded (Book L, page 135) on July 20, 1863. J. B. Kelsey, county and circuit clerk of Randolph County, distributed the funds apportioned to the families.

In the list below, the following items are included: name of the soldier, his regiment or other military organization, the information concerning his dependents, and the township in which his family lived. Unless otherwise noted, the place of enlistment was Randolph County. If the service status of the soldier was anything other than "in service," this information is shown in parentheses following his name.

"To our Mother Cynthis / Mother of J. S. Fish / Died Nov. 4 1871. Behold! My Mother / Age about 66 yrs." (Note: Her maiden name was McKance or might be spelled in South Carolina records McCants..

Jason Samuel Fish's father was Elias Fish, born New York State, came to South Carolina from Connecticut; after his marriage, moved first to Georgia, later to Alabama, then to Mississippi, back to Georgia and finally to Texas (vicinity Weatherford) where he died. Note: Weatherford, Texas, is County Seat of Parker County, created 1855 from Bosque & Navarro Counties. Bosque County, created 1854 from McLennan, Milam District, Meridian County Seat. Navarro created 1846 from Robertson, Corsicana County seat. Ann Eliza Goings was the daughter of Drew (or Drury perhaps) Goings or Goyen of South Carolina. Jason Samuel Fish, served in the Confederate Army, and was discharged at Marshall, Texas, May 5, 1865; served in Co. A. / 26-Ark Inf. / C.S.A.

The late Tom Newton, Newton's Chapel Church community, told me Robert M. Fish was the first person buried in Hickory Grove Cemetery. Cynthia McKance Fish died before the cemetery was established. Thomas Martin Newton, b. 12-15-1831; d. 10-16-1862, son of Rev. Thomas Newton, founder of Newton's Chapel, picked his place to be buried, which is Newton's Chapel Cemetery today.

Robert McConaughey, who died at Little Rock, while on a visit to his son J. W. McConaughey. (This was the first information I had found about the son J. W. McConaughey, as our old records had all been lost in fires and we did not have Robert's children). So I was indeed thrilled to find some records about J. W. McConaughey and also several records about his son, James D. McConaughey in those files. Through new bits and peices of information, I have discovered lately that the family is related to the Wassell Family and I believe that is through the marriage of a Bettie McConaughey (whom I believe to be a sister of James D. McConaughey--but as yet unproven). I found a written record on a Samuel McConaughey Wassell in the Centennial History of Arkansas, recently at our Genealogy Room here at Shreveport, La.

My desire is to find the facts about the J. W. McConaughey's death and who his wife was and the names of their children for sure. He is buried in the Wassell Lot in the Mt. Holly Cemetery, in Little Rock. I do have a photo of his Headstone and he did serve in the CSA and was Capt. Asst't Adjt. Gen. I almost missed the Headstone, as it was turned backwards and had a large bush planted in front of it. I have just viewed the 1870 Census records of Little Rock and could not find his family listed, however if the Bettie McConaughey that married Samuel Spotts Wassell, is the daughter, the article I found shows her birth place to be Searcy, so I will try to check those census rolls next.

My main concern with this Family, is in the papers, which I found at the Old State House, there is reffered to an old McConaughey Family Bible that Sam Wassell had viewed to verify the birth of James D. McConaughey and his age for the Court Records. As this Old Bible would probably list all the facts that I so desperately need. I would truly like to know who might have it at this time. It would be of tremendous help to obtain the names and dates of the old Family members and help in locating other parts of the family.

However, I would appreciate any known facts on any part of J. W. McConaughey Family of his son James D. McConaughey or the other members, who I do not know.

J. W. McConaughey b. Jan 9, 1821 (place unknown, maybe Vir.)  
d. May 13, 1872 (Buried Mt. Holly Cem.

Records I viewed, lost track of this young man after he became 21 years of age.

The other part of my trip was to locate my great grandfather JAMES DANIEL BAKER, who was supposed to be buried at Booneville, Ark., on July 31, 1898. I had no luck what-so-ever on locating anything at all on him. We searched Court Records at both Court Houses, at Booneville and Paris and found nothing.

This is a brief sketch on what I have on him. He was supposed to have owned a sawmill and also been a Circuit Rider Preacher. He had two children: Franklin James Baker, born in

Ohio and Helen Mary Baker, born in Ohio. His wife, Rosiana Barbara (Reiff) Baker, returned to Ohio after his death and was later buried there in 1917. The two children left the Arkansas area, one going to Texas to live and the daughter moved and married in Kansas. James Daniel Baker was born April 6, 1847 in Germany, and we had old Family information that he was buried at Booneville, none was fact, only family information.

Needless to say I was disappointed, but would appreciate anything that anyone could suggest,

As you can tell I am very new at research, but have been fortunate to have had beginner's luck on some of my families. I would be most happy to do whatever research here in our Library in exchange for any help.

First, I want to thank you for the queries which have come in this time. I did not receive any that did not include the address and the information included was very complete. To those who have written and are planning to write and ask for information on the Baker, Hart, Long, etc. families; you are not likely to get many responses. That is too general. Remember who, where, when and what you want to know.

Do you ever bemoan the fact that your ancestors did not bother to leave enough records for you to find a clear trail? Well, what are you doing? If my grandmother had written the family stories she told so well when I was a small child there would be a wealth of family information - but my grandmother wrote very poorly, spelled worse and did not use capitals or periods. She had a very limited opportunity for attending school and hers was an oral world and I am sure she never thought of writing a story.

What is our excuse? What are we doing with the material we are collecting? Are we putting it in notebooks and boxes and leaving it for someone to throw out as trash when we are gone? Share your material with others who are working on the same family and maybe their family will appreciate the information and save it. If you are not ready to write a book you can at least share Bible records and other documents or write articles for the Historian or to share with your local historical society.

The Arkansas History Commission is always anxious to receive material for their files. Recently I checked the biography file and found a file on my great-grandfather. Of course, I asked to see it and when I looked I found a few things I had given them. That was a disappointment but this reminder is the result of that for I realized I had failed to add important material I have collected. My files may be destroyed some day but there is a file at the History Commission.

The Genealogical Assistance Committee will answer all letters enclosing a SASE, and give suggestions on Arkansas material, researchers, etc. They do not offer free research. Because of family illness some of the answers have been slow. This is not just time but a numbness that that says, "I am not thinking, I will wait and I can give a better answer."

Scott, wrote my mother and with his letter sent the following newspaper clipping (June 21)'Scott Family owns Historic Old Document - Sheepskin Granting Patent to land on which Alma is located, is in Possession of Fort Smith Man - The man, Gano Scott. Joe M. Scott, son.'

Joe M. Scott was 87 years old at that time, his address then was 1217 South Seventeenth Street, Fort Smith. According to the Newspaper clipping- Nimrod Scott (1828) who obtained the land grant, was buried on the family homestead (marked by a Cedar tree) 8 years after his journey to Washington by horseback. The family homestead was on a site near where highway 71 leads toward Mountainburg and Fayetteville.

Joe M. Scott, was my Grandfather, John Scott's half brother. Their father's name was Joseph, Nimrod Scott was a brother of Joseph Scott.
