

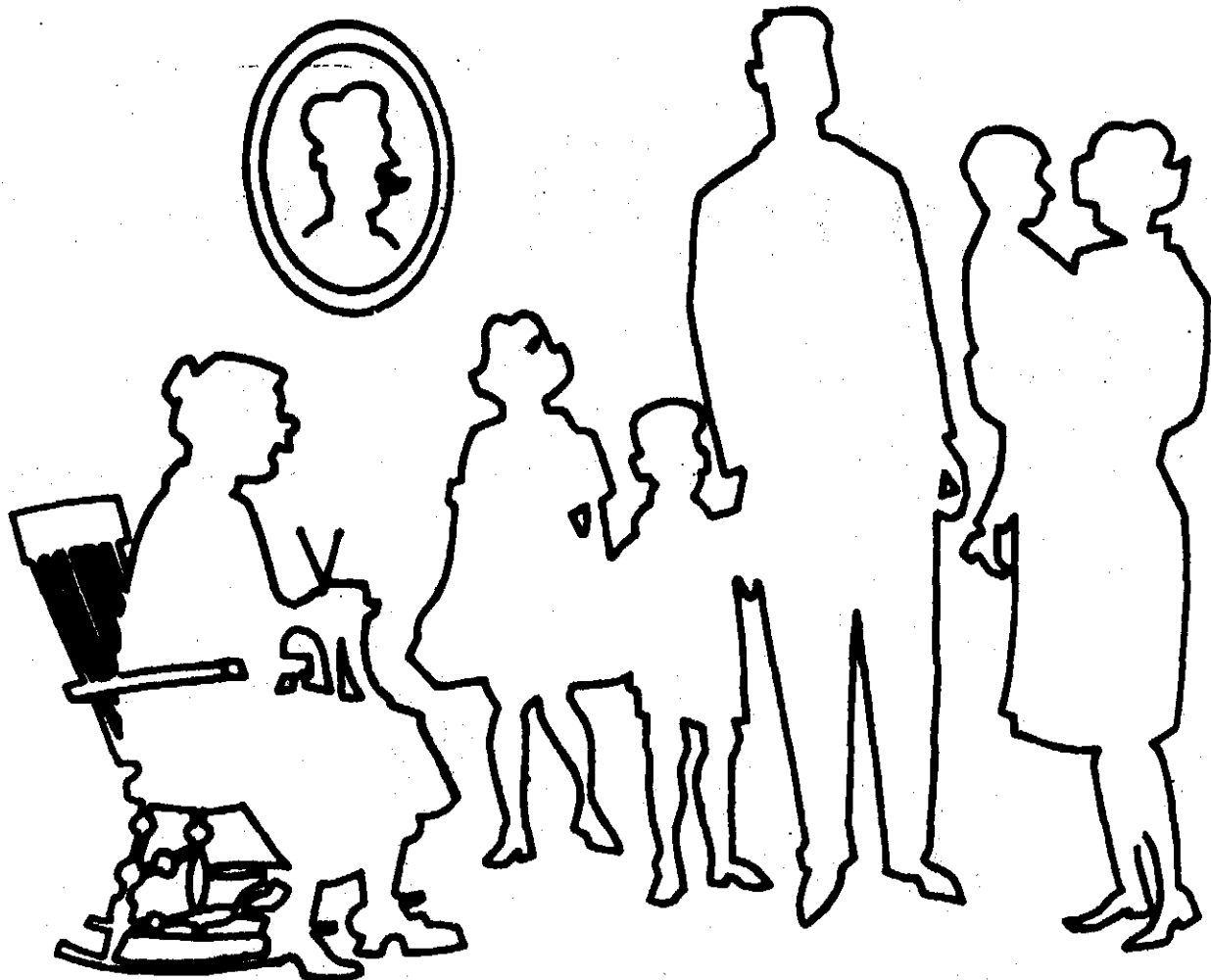

NOTES FROM YOUR EDITOR

DEAR MEMBERS AND READERS OF OUR ARKANSAS FAMILY HISTORIAN:

Just how proud can any EDITOR (or anyone else) be of 1500 people!!!! By the mailing date, which was about February 15th 1980, almost 1300 of our members had already paid their 1980 (or more) Membership fee...WITHOUT EVEN ONE STATEMENT (or invoice or bill) being sent! That is a large statement alone, but when anyone would stop to think, just how much TIME, POSTAGE, ENVELOPES, the Society was helped. When the metal plates are all correct (spelled exactly correct, with the EXACTLY correct address, and zip code) and in the proper zip code spot, in the file cabinet...then your EDITOR is in business to send your Quarterlies, fast as possible to your mail box.

The special members who need a small reminder, really cause your EDITOR problems...first there is no time to send reminders...all the time needs to be spent, trying to get enough Quarterlies printed for a number (not yet decided...when the printing must be started...then the paper, ink, and many other supplies run short, and the excuses the various companies come up-with are some-time unbelievable. "The purpose of the History of Medicine Division is to document the history of medicine in Arkansas. There are three categories of materials in the History of Medicine Division: The Historical Collection, the Schlumberger Collection and the History of Medicine Archives.

The Historical Collection is a collection of medical classics and Arkansas medical books. The nucleus for this collection was donated to the library in 1924 by the Drs. Edwin and Carle Bentley. Garrison and Morton's A Medical Bibliography and other selected bibliographies are guides for selection of books to be added to this collection.

The Schlumberger Collection is a collection of books centered around the subject of Pathology but containing books on many other subjects. The collection was donated to the library in 1961/62 by the widow of Dr. Hans. G. Schlumberger.

The History of Medicine Archives includes medical materials not included in the UAMS, institutional archives. The materials in these archival groups will be directly related to health care in Arkansas. Occasional publications of state agencies less directly related to health care will be added to the Small Manuscripts Collections.

The purpose of the collection is to preserve the materials which document the history of medicine in Arkansas. The collection includes books, photographs, personal papers and related materials. These materials are presently being

solicited from local historical groups, the Arkansas Genealogical Society members, as well as the area medical societies. Persons interested in using the materials, or donating materials to the collection should contact archivist Edwina Walls at the Medical Sciences Campus Library, Slot 586, 4301 W. Markham, Little Rock, Arkansas, 72205."

BOOK REVIEWS

"COLUMBIA COUNTY, ARKANSAS, 1860 Census", compiled by the Southwest Arkansas Genealogical Society members, Magnolia, AR 71753. This was the first Census for Columbia County.

There is a map of the county with political townships clearly marked as they were in 1860. A surname index is included. Slave inhabitants are listed separately. The 1860 Mortality Schedule is also given. This publication is clear to read and is well organized for use as a source of information. This new census is valuable to our library and we appreciate it as a gift. (please order from the above address, \$9. prepaid).

"A GENEALOGY OF THE MOUSER ANCESTRY, Including the BEST and other Families" by Lafrona Foshee Mouser - 1978. This gift is from the compiler.

This work begins with a very scholarly discussion of the Mouser origins in Europe. As far back as 1630 families with various spellings of this name came to America in Massachusetts. Later they came to Maryland, Virginia, North and South Carolinas.

The ancestors of this particular family came to the Missouri Territory in 1803 and on to Hempstead county, Arkansas, in 1826. Some went on to Texas. So this volume is about the descendants of George and Phoebe Best Mouser's thirteen children and his brother David and Margaret Best Mouser.

This family history is very well documented and organized. It is full of historical events and the continuity is so even-flowing that my interest was maintained throughout. This hardback book of 528 pages including index, may be obtained for \$25, postpaid, from Mrs. Ben Mouser, P. O. Box 378, Spode, Texas 79369. "RECORDS OF STEVENS FUNERAL HOME, St. Francis County, Forrest City, Arkansas 72335 (July 19, 1897 - Oct. 27, 1913).

This is a listing of deaths of all persons to whom funeral services were performed by this funeral home, complete with date of death. This is a valuable record which gives needed information, which cannot be replaced for people in unmarked graves or whose marker has been destroyed. It is compiled in a way that makes it easy to read, and has an index. (May be ordered from Kathleen S. "JOHN ADAM PLESS FAMILY OF POPR COUNTY, ARKANSAS", 1975 - Revised 1980, by Elaine Weir Cia.

This is a very pleasant family history. It is certainly documented as to factual information, but it is told like talking to a friend. By the time I had read three pages I fell in step with the narrative and felt at home with the details as if one of the family.

A brief history of the John Adam Pless Family shows he came from North Carolina to Pope County, Arkansas, in the late 1860's. One or two generations before that Christopher and Hannah Pless came to Pennsylvania from Germany. Of their three sons, Peter went to North Carolina, Henry is believed to have gone to Montana and Joseph to Illinois.

The story of the family living in Pope County, Arkansas, is inter-laced with receipes, newspaper clippings, pedigree charts, ancestor charts, and family group sheets. Family names most frequently used are: BLACKARD, BROWN, CASEY, HICKEY, JOHNSON, JONES, MALONE, MARTIN, MILLER, MOORE, NIEMEYER, NORDIN, PACK, PETRAY, PITTMAN, SMITH, STEUBER, SUDMEYER, TAYLOR & WHITE. "THE SMITH-WOMBLE & Related Families - A History" by Letha M. Smith Williams 1977.

This is a collection of very personal information about related families. Each begins with an ancestor chart and ends with the person comiling it showing four generations of their family and that of their spouse. Then a detailed family history narrative is accompanied by diplomas, pictures, military records, favorite songs, poetry, prayers, essays, etc.

"RECORDS OF YAKIMA COUNTY, WASHINGTON, Volume V, 1979". The information was abstracted by members of the Yakima Valley Genealogical Society and compiled by J. W. Helm & Mrs. Elodie Town. Volume V is from newspaper abstracts of 1884-1907 period. It includes births, Adoptions, Deaths, Marriages, Divorces, Probates, Naturalizations, Homesteads, and Reunions.

This Book is part of the on-going program of that Genealogical Society to make records of their ancestors more readily available to genealogists and historians. The first four volumes were published in 1975 as a part of the American Bicentennial celebration. Each section is arranged in alphabetical order and is easy to use. There are 211 pages and a full name index. Although no exact address of the Society is given, they state that a photocopy of any newspaper article listed will be furnished for \$1. plus a large stamped and addressed return envelope. "OBITUARIES AND MARRIAGE NOTICES from the Tennessee Baptist: 1844-1862" by Russell Pierce Baker, 1979 (Address: 322 Laurel St., Mabelvale, AR 72103)

The Tennessee Baptist was a weekly publication which was widely read in neighboring states and had a loyal following. It reflected Southern religious life of its time. The deaths and marriages totaling approximately 2,700 are listed alphabetically and there is a surname index for cross references. We appreciate the donation of this book of two types of information. "ELLIS COUNTY, TEXAS, NATURALIZATION RECORDS", compiled by Ellis County Genealogical Society, Box 385, Waxahachie, Texas 75165 - Mrs. Charles Kirk, President.

These records date from 1878 to 1929, at which time the naturalization proceedings were put in the hands of the District Courts, rather than the County. The records were found packed in boxes in a storeroom in the basement of the courthouse. Thanks to the District Clerk, this was reported to the Genealogical Society and these valuable old records were saved and now preserved.

Although naturalized persons came from 14 counties, 79% were from the Austria-Czechoslovakia area in Europe. A total of 457 persons are represented in this record, which is listed alphabetically. In most cases the genealogical information is very complete. There is a surname index. Many thanks for this book. (Please order from the above address, \$10.)

"ANCESTOR SURNAME LISTINGS" - Tulsa, Oklahoma, Genealogical Society. This is a listing of the ancestors of members of this Society. The ancestors are listed alphabetically and by the name of the state in America they came from to Oklahoma. Also given is the date they arrived from abroad. Lastly a letter and number code is given by which you can identify the name and address of the member to whom they belong, by a membership list in the back of the book.

"THREE MAUNEY FAMILIES", by Bonnie Mauney Summers (Mrs. F. R.), Box 506, Kings Mountain, North Carolina, 28086 - 1967. This is a gift by H. T. Mooney, Jr., Rt. 2 Hardy, Arkansas 72542. Thank you very much.

This is the history of three Nauney brothers who came to Tryon County (now Lincoln) North Carolina between 1760 and 1770 from Pennsylvania. The first members of the family arrived in America in 1750.

The information is well documented and logical conclusions are drawn. There are many family listings and Family group sheets and ancestor charts to bring the families down to the present day.

R. W. Dhonau (our Book Reviewer) has recently published an "Addendum To - "STILLWELL HERITAGE in ARKANSAS -1798-1976" which was published in 1976.

HIRAM LEBOW AND SARAH BLEDSOE FAMILY

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following is from Mrs. LaVena LEBOW WILSON, P. O. Box 684, Camp Verde, Arizona 86322 - "I am enclosing some information, a little more detailed than the FAMILY GROUP SHEETS. I am preparing a more detailed outline of my Grandfather, Richard Daniel LEBOW and his family".

Hiram LEBOW and Sarah BLEDSOE Family

- I. Hiram LEBOW, b. 1821 in Claiborne Co., Tn., m. Sarah BLEDSOE, b. 1822 in Blount Co., Tn. 24 Dec., 1839 in Blount Co., Tn. They moved into Southern Illinois - Saline or Jefferson Counties in the early 1840's where two of their children were born, one, the oldest was b. in Tn., likely Claiborne Co., and the last two were b. in Ar., and Sarah d. in Polk Co., Ar. in 1853, possibly childbirth was the cause. Both Sarah and Hiram LEBOW are buried in Cecil Cemetery east of Vandervoort, Ar. (Only relatives buried here). Hiram was shot and killed while riding the range in Polk Co., Ar. 8 Mar., 1880.
- IA. Mary Elizabeth LEBOW, b. 29 June, 1840/41, in Claiborne, Tn. (?), m. James CECIL ca. 1859. Mary d. 6 May, 1917, b. in Cecil Cem., east of Vandervoort, Ar. As I suppose James CECIL is, too. These are their children, but don't know much about them.
1. Sarah J., b. ca. 1860 in Polk Co., Ar.
  2. James W., b. ca. 1864 in Polk Co., Ar.
  3. John R., b. ca. 1866, m. Martha E. in 1881
  4. Mira E., b. ca. 1868
  5. Thomas, b. ca. 1869, m. Dora
  6. Rhoda A., b. ca. 1873
  7. Levi O., b. 12 Sept., 1875, d. 25 May, 1895, buried at Cecil's Chapel - Old Rock, Vandervoort.
  8. Mary L., b. ca. 1878
  9. Agnes Martha, b. ca. 1879, d. 1949
  10. Joseph N., b. 19 June, 1881, d. 8 Sept., 1898, buried Cecil's Chapel Cem - Old Rock, Vandervoort.
- IB. Sarah Evelyn LEBOW, b. 7 May, 1843 in Southern, Ill., m. Nathaniel O. ALLEN ca. 1868. Sarah died 29 Nov., 1878 and is buried in Cecil Cem., Vandervoort, Ar., as I suppose Uncle Nat ALLEN is, too. These are their children:

In 1911, the Public Acts of Arkansas No. 353 provided that an enumeration or census be made by the tax assessor of each county, of Confederate veterans residing in Arkansas. This 2nd volume in the series lists surnames E through Mc., in the 44 counties represented in the original questionnaires - no records are found for the 31 remaining counties. The 1751 questionnaires list the full name of the veteran, his post office address, date and place of birth, date, State and County of enlistment, full name and place of birth of subject's parents, grandparents, maiden name of wife, with date and place of marriage, names of her parents, and full list of children, with spouses.

VOLUME I has been in print for some time, and VOLUME II has just been completed.

There will be a VOLUME III, as soon as time will permit. VOLUME III should complete this valuable source information.

LITTLE ROCK BIRTH AND DEATH RECORDS  
1871 - 1903

From R. P. Baker, Archivist, Arkansas History Commission Office, Little Rock, Arkansas, 72201 (One Capitol Mall). The Arkansas History Commission has recently microfilmed a collection of Little Rock birth and death records which were kept by the old city health department. The death records are on two rolls of microfilm and date from 1871 to 1903. Each volume beginning in 1881 has a more or less complete index. The first volume, which dates from 1871 to 1881, has recently been indexed by the History Commission staff. The birth records are on one roll of microfilm and date from 1881 to 1892, plus several months of 1898. No index is available. These records contain vital statistic information for only that area which was contained within the corporate limits of the City of Little Rock at that time. They do not contain information for Pulaski County as a whole. Information on Pulaski County deaths may be obtained from the Pulaski County Probate Records, a partial index to which is available at the History Commission.

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following was enumerated by Julia (Grubb) Outland and Cloe (Grubb) Everett, December 1979. From Julia, "This cemetery is the Old Alabam Cemetery, located about 5 miles east of Huntsville, Madison Co., Arkansas on highway #68. We have been told that in 1856 there were 5 graves. Three black people who drowned in War Eagle at McMurray Ford (before there was a bridge) another was supposed to have been a Denny lady and one believed to be an infant. John M. Denny and wife Carolyn (Parks) Denney are believed to be buried there - later. There is a new Cemetery across the road from the old one, which is by the Old School House. We plan to enumerate it also. The Old School House is being restored.

Cloe and I grew up at Alabam. We are first cousins and have lived within 5 miles of this Old School all out life.

I received som information after I had finished this copy (after W.M. Ray-Cathy Jo Yent - Clarence Joseph Yent and then Dale Eugene Kelley. I had found the 2 Yent graves and tried several times to read the Mortuary Markers but could not. I just happened to ask a lady about these graves and she gave me a telephone number that proved to be the mother! I was so happy to get the information." Julia Outland

The Division of Vital Records was established on February 1, 1914 and is responsible for maintaining all original certificates of Arkansas birth and death and coupons for marriages and divorces. Their records in each category started as follows: 1. Births: February 1, 1914 - Fee \$2.00 per copy. Submit Full Name at Birth, place & date of Birth, parents' names (including maiden name of mother).

2. Deaths: February 1, 1914, Fee \$3.00 per copy. Submit: Full Name of Deceased, Place and Date of Death.
3. Marriages: January 1, 1917. Fee \$2.00 per copy. Submit: Name of Groom, Name of Bride (maiden name), Date of Marriage, County of License Issuance.
4. Divorces: January 1, 1923. Fee \$2.00 per copy. Submit: Name of Plaintiff Name of Defendant, date of divorce, County in which Divorce Granted.

NOTE: If no record is located, fee is kept as a search fee per Arkansas law.

NOTE: Certain birth records of individuals born before February 1, 1914 have been filed as delayed certificates by that individual or his parents (mostly between 1900 and 1913.)

EDITOR'S NOTE: These records are closed to researchers, and can only be gotten from the Department of Vital Records, etc.

He was born near Eutaw, Green Co., Alabama, 2 May 1818. Studied law & was admitted to the bar in 1843. He began to practice law in Clinton, Hinds Co., Mississippi, and was a member of the Miss. House of Representatives in 1845-1846. In 1847 he moved to Ark., and settled in Camden, where he practiced law. He was also a judge of the circuit court of the Sixth District, Ark. In 1859 resumed his law practice. Edward died in Prescott Co., AR., 2 July 1875 and was interred in the Moscow Cemetery near Prescott, AR. (Biographical Directory of the Am. Congress 1774-1961, Washington: GPO, 1961)

Edward A. WARREN married Mary E. WARREN, a daughter of Edward & Elizabeth (Dabney) WARREN, in Marshall Co., Miss, 9 October 1838. Marriages in Marshall Co., Miss, 1836-1841 in the Miss Dept. of Archives & History. No doubt Edward Allen and Mary E. (WARREN) WARREN were cousins of some degree.

Co., N.C. married James L. STROED in N.C. and went to Van Buren Co., AR 1847  
and Captain Abner MORGAN, b. 1824 in McDowell Co.; N.C. went to Van Buren  
Co., AR 1839 & married (Polly) Mary AIKEN in Van Buren Co., AR & in 1846 had  
9 children & some descendants still live near Scotland, Van Buren Co., AR.

#10 Elizabeth, b. 1828 in McDowell Co., N. C. married Marian KOAN in Ark.,  
to a brother of Rebecca's husband. Elizabeth came to Arkansas as Rebecca &  
Captain Abner MORGAN, 1839.

#12 Jane, b. 15 May 1835 in McDowell Co., N. C. came to Arkansas in 1847.  
There is more data in Morrilton, Conway Co., AR (I have been told).

Most of my data has come from Queries, as I am not physically able to  
travel. I would be glad to pay anyone to do some research for me, either in  
Arkansas or North Carolina on the MORGAN & MILLS lines & refund postage. I  
am sure my ancestors came from North Carolina to Arkansas. Also I think  
Captain Abner MORGAN & my grandfather Alfred MORGAN were 1st cousins, but  
need proof. I am sure about Nancy Jane MILLS, for I saw her youngest sister  
in 1929 & over the years, the notes I had were lost, so I began again from  
scratch. Nancy Jane's sister was Nettie A. MILLS, b. 20 Dec. 1849 in Van  
Buren Co., Arkansas & married ... Shipp in 1929 she lived near Formosa, Van  
Buren Co., AR., with her daughter Almeda SHIPP, who married Harvey LEDFORD.  
Can anyone help with any additional information on any of these people, I  
will appreciate and share with others working on these lines, and return  
postage & pay for additional research. An interested genealogical searcher  
in need of help.

I was born 24 Nov. 1910 in Taney Co., MO have been in Yakima since 1937,  
retired on a disability 10 years ago, and started my research in the fall of  
1977 by going to Van Buren Co., Arkansas, but none of the older people could  
remember my grandparents so I joined the ARKANSAS FAMILY HISTORIAN and have  
learned a lot! (ARKANSAS FAMILY HISTORIAN is the place to start! It is a  
wonderful publication. I have my mother's ancestors well established to

ETIERE/ ETHIER searching for the names (or any inf.) parents of Bennett  
ETIER (ETIE, ETIERE, ETHIER) b. Feb. 1842, Arkansas. I have  
been unable to locate him on the 1850 census. They probably lived near  
other French speaking people. Can anyone please help! I will gladly refund  
postage, etc.

GOFORTHS My husband's family - BARNES; GOFORTH; HILL; RANKIN; WILSON;

stopped over and stayed for from one to four or five genera-  
tions in Northwestern and North Central Arkansas - per usual they were out

HOGGATT not Want to thank all who helped (or tried to help) with my Query  
HOGGART in the 1979 Dec. AFH! From it I had one inquiry on the YERBY  
- (RO(D)GERS surnames that proved to be a 2nd cousin of my  
mother. Was sorry I couldn't connect MAXWELLS, when Mr. E. H. MAXWELL called  
long distance, but we can keep each other in mind as we research our  
MAXWELL surname. One member just wrote asking if I could help her on a  
couple of her surnames that I wasn't researching and I hope to be able to  
help her. Could find no connection to a RAY searcher nor the HARTMANN  
searcher but maybe we can all be of help to each other in the future, who  
knows. Was really grateful for the response thus far, and all this during  
the holiday preparations everyone was into! Just think what it might be  
later on after people recover from the holidays.

A terrific job of indexing surnames being searched, but one of mine was  
left out of index, BERGERON, my French Huguenots, and one surname was mis-  
spelled in index, HOGGATT not HOGGART though I may find it spelled that way  
sometimes as a variant spelling. HOGGATT BIBLE Record is recorded on separate  
page.

BARR Can anyone help me with descendants of Andrew Washington  
BARR and his wives and possibly sort out which children are  
by which wife? Andrew was born in June 1823 (what day?) in Elbert Co., GA.  
He served in Co. B of the 6th Arkansas Infantry as a Private; discharged as  
being over age. Enlisted in Camden, AR. He died after 1900 census (when?)  
of Nevada Co., AR and is buried in Mt. Moriah Cemetery there. In 1900 cen-  
sus his wife was Mary E., born July 1843 and they had been married 22 years,  
and still had children at home. In 1880 census Nevada Co., would have been  
same wife and there were step-children in household named LIVINGSTONE as  
well as a baby that would have been theirs and some children by Andrew's  
previous wife. My Great grandmother was a daughter of Andrew's and the wife  
he had at the time Mary Jane BARR was born in June 1853. I cannot find  
Andrew and family in 1860 & 1870 census but they were in 1850 census of  
Ouachita Co., Ark. (a parent county of Nevada). In 1850 his wife was Mary  
J., and they had two sons, one born in Miss., and the youngest born in AR.  
Believe wife in 1850 and the mother of Mary Jane BARR in 1853 was Mary Jane

BALLIENT, said to be half-French and half-Indian, born near Oxford, Miss., circa 1823 when it was Chickasaw Indian land but have no proof. Was the widow LIVINGSTONE a CALLICOAT? Where was this family in 1860-70 census? When did wife of 1850 die and where? Did Andrew have still another wife between 1850 and 1878? He was supposedly always in the general Arkansas area after coming to Ark. Had a nephew TUBBS in 1880 household as did a brother, John BARR, have a relative named TUBBS in his 1880 household in Nevada Co. I can find no marriage or other records on BARR in several Southern Arkansas counties, written to for probate, death, or marriage records. I know he owned property for I found some deed records in Archives and distant cousins and my mother know of the "old" homeplace. This line is frustrating and I know someone of our Arkansas Family Historian readers may be able to help or direct me to someone who might. I sure need help!

Also wish to point out that not all census information is correct! Either the census taker (enumerator) misunderstands information given or the one giving the information did not know the information, or did not speak clearly for the following was recently discovered in 1900 census of Nevada Co., AR., in my Grandmother's family:

ROGERS, Elie as head of household with wife, Mary (This is the Mary Jane BARR of the Query (on page before this one) Children: Mollie; Catherine, Emma, Eva, Lillie - my grandmother (Sarah) was already married and in the next household - of their own.

I had never heard of grandmother having a sister named EVA and asked my mother about this. I had already surmised that it should have been a boy named EAGLE for grandmother's only brother had the same birthdate as EVA. My mother verified the fact that grandmother had, indeed, never had a sister named EVA and since the birthdate is EAGLE's, either someone's hearing was poor or someone's enunciation was poor or misunderstood. EAGLE died in his late teens and I have his obituary and his death date. Incidentally, please note: anyone clipping an obituary from the newspaper should include the date, for most of the old obits I have do not have any date, at all included in the portion that was clipped nor do they have it written in long-hand as pertains to name of newspaper or the date. Most people would not give this a thought, when clipping an obit or any other item but it can prove to be a real stumbling block in the distant future for someone else to only make a guess. I had no help whatsoever from the Nevada County Picayune when requesting obits from them from many years back so still have to sort of guess at some dates on these old obits, and may never have time and opportunity to check this out at Archives (if they have the film of these particular issues).

EDITOR'S NOTE: The Newspaper people, like your Editor and the people at the Courthouses...there is no time for research...if todays work is ever to be finished!!!!!!

Another thing concerning census. It just all depends on how much "accurate" information one has to give the census taker. For instance...in 1850 census my Andrew BARR was said to have been born in Atlanta (his CSA records shows Elbert County). In 1880 it shows his birthplace Georgia, with his father born South Carolina and mother born Georgia. In 1900 it shows, Andrew was born in GA, but his father was born in Ireland and they didn't know where his mother was born. His brother, John, in 1880 census (or whoever gave information said John was born in GA., his father, S.C., and yet his mother, S.C. It is possible that John and Andrew could have had different mothers and one was born in GA and one S.C. for there was 7 years difference in their birthdates but I sure would like to know how the father could have been the same and been born in both S.C. and Ireland!!! John's mother, Nancy A. was age 79 and a widow living in John's household in 1880 and she said she was born in S.C. and her parents were both born in Virginia

I really do believe John and Andrew were brothers so it would seem the census information could be wrong in some instances because of human error so to speak.

Also cemetery records can be wrong or stones in such a poor condition information cannot be read. On Andrew's stone it gave CSA service as being Company H - 19th Ark. and after I was unable to get anything in records on this I was able to spend a few minutes at Archives in Little Rock once and checked index and found the correct information and then was able to get copy of his military papers which included his discharge, which gave correct birthplace inf. and also gave the bonus of a physical description, and verified the birth year.

The HOGGATT family for the most part lived around the Behale Baptist Church and Heuck's Retreat, Lincoln County, Mississippi.

May SMITH was born about 1905, she does not know where, or the exact date. Her earliest recollection is of living in a farmhouse close to an Indian reservation and she played with the Indian children. She had a sister, possibly a twin; they were both playing in a wood pile and something bit or stung the sister and she died; some women came out of the house, picked them both up & carried them into the house. May was too young then to remember where it was or the name of the little sister who died. She believes she had older brothers: Howard; Ernest; & William, the older sister Lena (or Leona) and still another sister who had 5 children. She does not remember the circumstances of why she knows, but she thinks Lena's husband was a bank employee. She recalls one of her brothers was kicked in the stomach by a pair of young mules and once she was pushed out of an apple tree by a brother and broke her shoulder; a doctor, name not known, came to the house to treat her. May has a mental picture of her father as a big, blue-eyes, red-faced man; and her mother a tall thin, black-headed woman. She herself was tall as a child, blond, blue-eyes and has a large white mole between her eyebrows, and May's three children were all tall. She believes her father was killed somehow when she was (continued on next page)

(continued) young, or died of asthma. The family was together, camped in wagon yard, in Little Rock, Arkansas. When?

The orphanage added "Agnes" to her name, so she has used the name Agnes May SMITH on whatever documents there may have been since 1918. This added name may have confused anyone searching for her. She thinks her mother may have been Mary COOK or Mary COX and that her father may have been John SMITH.

#### INFORMATION TO BE SHARED

My great great grandfather, Frederick LINCKS, was born 1795 in Baden-  
Baden, Germany, raised in Alsace-Lorraine France-Germany border area. He  
was a rather wild and eventurous young man from a wealthy German family.

Young Frederick served in Napoleon Bonapart's Army, when about 15 years  
of age. How he came from Germany to Clay Co., Kentucky was without a doubt  
one of that area's more colorful early pioneers. In Clay Co., KY, he marr-  
ied four times, fathered seventeen children and died at the venerable old age  
of ninty two (92). This can be read in the following item from the Diary of  
the Reverend John Gay Dickey, as told to him by his #10 child, Robert LINCKS,  
28 June 1898, who lived at the town of Lynx, Laurel Co., KY.

In 1898 Robert was quoted as saying: "My father was Frederick LINCKS.  
He was born 1795 in Germany. Before he reached his majority he ran from home  
and joined the army of Napoleon Bonaparte. He was a wild boy. I have seen  
his body, it was all covered with scars, showing that he had many conflicts  
in his young days.

His father was a great friend of Napoleon and though this intimacy he  
got his son released. He then sent him to Amsterdam to school. After the  
close of the term \$80. was necessary to pay board and tuition. His father  
sent him the money to pay the bill, but he took the money and paid his pass-  
age to America. Eighty other students did the same. The ship was anchored  
about a mile from the shore. The boys were taken out in a schooner, several  
trips being necessary. The ship lost her course and many died of over-eating  
when a friendly ship found them. Many were lost by sickness. His time with  
Napoleon was 7 or 9 months, the voyage was 9 months. When they landed in  
America, the ship's captain sold them for their passage, denying that they  
had paid him. James Garrard, Govenor, bought him. He did not know how to  
talk English. He learned somehow, that he was a slave and he made his case  
known to a lawyer, who could talk German. He looked in his trunk and found  
his free papers. He was about to leave the Governor, but he hired for a year  
when David Garrard brought him to Clay County, KY., to oversee negroes at the  
salt works. He promised the Governor to return, but he never did. He worked  
for the Garrards, whom he greatly loved.

He married 1st to Nancy Hays, 11 November 1820, and they had 2 children:  
Eliza, who married a Parker); and Nancy who married "Smiling" David Bengé,  
son of John and Philedelphia Bengé. He then married 2nd to Mary "Polly"  
Cornett, 25 November 1822 (daughter of old Robert "Robin" Cornett of Bengé,  
KY. They had 9 children: John who married Susannah Stivers, 10 Janauary  
1848; Susan who married a Stivers; Margaret who married Green Parker; Lottie  
who married to Phil Wilson; Lucinda married to Lee Chestnut; Patsy married to  
Preacher Hiram Johnson; 9 Selpa married to Charles Parsley; Robert married  
to Eliza Chestnut; and James married Jane Bailey.

His third marriage was to Louisa Robinson and they had 3 children:  
Susan; Hiram; and Thomas.

His fourth marriage was to a widow by the name of Black (nee Patsy  
Young) and they were the parents of: Frederick; Henry; and Germany Frances,  
(the last was a daughter). Henry married to Molly Houston of Bengé & he died  
at Bengé, Kentucky in 1887, at the age of 92 years. He had at that time 113  
descendants. My father was soon lost from his countrymen, who came over with  
him and never saw or heard from any of them, nor did his father ever know  
anything of them.

Jess Wilson, of McKee, KY wrote a feature story in an issues called  
"It Happened Here" said, "To the above information, he could add the follow-  
ing:

"Frederick Lincks, could have served in Napoleon's Army. Frederick was  
nine years old when Napoleon crowned himself Emperor of France in 1814. He

went on to conquer most of Europe by 1814 when he was first eciled. By this time Frederick was 19 years old and probably already in America.

James Garrand was governor of Knetucky, two terms 1796 to 1804. He lived in Bourbon County and his son Daniel came to Clay County, Ky before 1810. The 1810 Census of Clay Co., KY shows him owning 21 slaves at that time. Frederick Lincks is buried in the Lincks cemetery in Clay Co., Ky.

My linage is from Frederick Lincks' marriage to Mary Cornett, daughter of Robert "Robin" Cornett, born. 11 Jan. 1780 and died 11 Nov. 1862, married Charlotte Callahan, born 4 July 1778, died 7 May 1864. His brother married Zekoha Callahan. The Callahan girls were sisters and their brother Isaac Callahan married 10 July 1810 to Mahala Wilson, a sister to Jess Wilson's great great grandfather, John Wilson. Other information was gleaned from Clay Co., Ky., Census of 1850; & compiled by the late James F. Bowman of Travelers Rest and marriages in Clay Co., Ky., 1807 to 1853, Compiled by Anna Walker Burns. The different spellings of the same Lincks, include: Links; Lynks; Linds; or Linckes in the same era may be contributed to the national-ity of the county clerks and census takers.

My great grandmother was Margaret, the daughter of Frederick and Mary "Polly" Cornett Lincks & was born in 1824. She married to Green Parker, 17 May 1845. 1850 Census shows they had one son, age 4. My grandfather Frederick Parker, according to Family Records, Green Parker, deserted Margaret and her father had to support them so she changed his name to Frederick Lincks.

My grandfather Frederick Lincks, son of Margaret was born 13 Feb. 1846. Enlisted in the Civil War, 4 Nov. 1863 (Co. B-7, KY., Co 2-118 Pa. Co., H 91st Pa. Lived in Ky., and So. Easton, Pa., prior to enlistment.

Discharged at Crumenfield, VA 15 July 1865. Frederick Lincks applied for Civil War Pension, 21 Mar 1907. Listed his places of residence after discharge, as Kentucky till 1866, went to Spring Valley, Colorado till 1872, was a Prescott, Arizona, and came to Washington Co., Arkansas in spring of 1872, from 1872 to 1877 in Franklin Co., Arkansas (then Crawford County, AR) in 1893 till time of application for pension in 1907.

Frederick Lincks, born 13 Feb. 1844, Clay Co., KY., married Josephine Pauline Dougan, born 13 Dec., Grant Co., Arkansas. They were married on 16 Feb. 1873 at Alma, Crawford Co., AR. The marriage was solemnized by Isaac S. Pound, M.G.

Children of this union were: Leilah, b. 13 Nov. 1873, died 6 April 1970; Laura Olive, b. 12 June 1875; Finis, b. 18 June 1877, died 28 Aug. 1966; Julia Ann, b. 7 July 1879 (buried at Muldrow, OK); John Rixhard, b. 30 Nov. 1880 (Buried at Roland, OK); Nelly Mae, b. 25 Dec. 1882, buried died as small child; George Frederick, b. 8 Nov. 1884; Robert, b. 25 June 1887; Thomas Frank, b. 16 Dec. 1889, died 8 Feb. 1958; Charles Virgil, b. 2 May 1892, died 8 June 1974; Ella, b. 8 Jan. 1894, died 8 March 1958. All are buried at Grace Lawn Cemetery in Crawford Co., Arkansas except the places mentioned here. Also the father Frederick Lincks, died 13 Dec. 1920 and is buried in Forrest Park Cemetery, Ft. Smith, Sebastain Co., AR. His wife Josephine Pauline (Dougan) Lincks, died 17 Feb. 1942 and is buried in Grace Lawn Cemetery, Van Buren, Crawford Co., Arkansas.

Charles Virgil Lincks b. 2 May 1882 and died 8 June 1974 was my father. He was born in Franklin Co., Arkansas and died in Van Buren, Crawford Co., AR. He married Jessie Mae Crawford (b. 8 May 1899, Johnson Co., AR and died 7 April 1959, Van Buren, Crawford Co., AR) 12 January 1916 in Crawford Co., AR. They were the parents of: Charles Truman Licks, b. 4 June 1917; Virgil Frank Lincks, b. 21 April 1920; Inez Mae Lincks, b. 10 March 1922; Billy Jack Lincks, b. 22 Oct. 1924; Dorothy Ann Lincks, b. 25 Feb. 1926; Max Ben Lincks, b. 10 Nov. 1935. Jessie Mae Crawford Lincks was the daughter of William Joseph Crawford and Ariel Cater Crawford.

Prior to the War the Federal Census for 1860 locates William, age 24 and Susannah, age 23 along with daughter: Josephine, age 2, in Fulton Co., AR., near Wild Cherry. Their farm was in Bennet's Bayou Township and was valued at \$130.00. In 1881, William and Susannah moved to Wright Co., MO. I have gone into detail about William, because I have so little inf. on the others. ### Engineers To Plat Cemetery, Ask That Graves Be Marked

A permanent plat will be made immediately of North Sawba Cemetery, it was announced today by Widmer Engineering Company, architect-engineers for the new Army Advanced Flying School to be built on a 2761-acre tract which includes the cemetery site. All persons having relatives buried in this cemetery, whose graves are not now marked, are urged to place cards or some form of identification on the graves so that the plat may be complete for historic value. Because work of preparing the land must progress swiftly, relatives of persons buried there are asked

to mark all graves at once. A number of graves are being moved by relatives to private lots in other cemeteries. It is understood that the three-acre burial ground will be flattened and the graves left undisturbed, although no official announcement has been made. North Sawba Cemetery is the oldest burial ground in this section having been established there 67 years ago and later deeded to the New Hope Methodist Church, now dissolved. The free cemetery is believed to have as many as 6000 graves.
