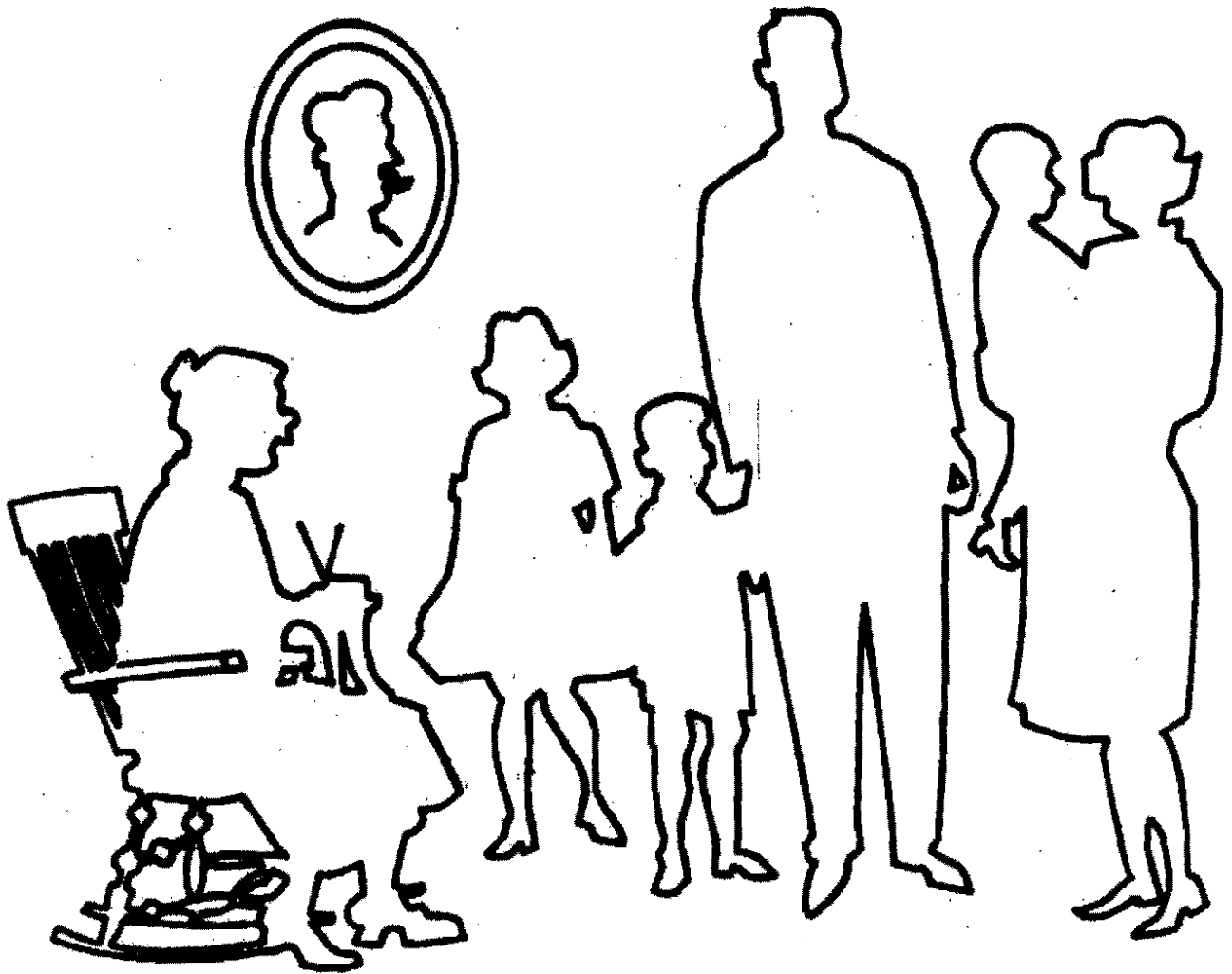

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION!

DEAR MEMBERS AND READERS OF OUR ARKANSAS FAMILY HISTORIAN:

We are beginning our TWENTIETH YEAR, publishing our ARKANSAS FAMILY HISTORIAN! Someone sent the above verse...and since not one of us can truthfully say, "it does NOT FIT ME!" and it really does, "FIT YOUR EDITOR!" (I do hope this brings a smile).

To this date (early February) our publication is right on time, part is printed, and the membership renewals have come in GREAT. Your EDITOR and MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN both really appreciate EARLY RENEWALS. Again many have renewed for several additional years, that does help (and they DO KNOW THEY ARE PAID UP and will not miss an issue!). REMEMBER IT IS NEVER TOO EARLY TO RENEW FOR THE NEXT YEAR. When you do renew early...the current fee is all you need to pay, then if the fee is increased, you need not worry, as you MEMBERSHIP is already paid.

For the NEW MEMBERS and others, who do not know...The private home of your EDITOR is and has been, since 1973 used as our HEADQUARTERS. All the mail is sent to this address & opened by Elaine Weir Cia (or some nice Volunteer, who has come in for a few hours). All our printing is done by Mario B. Cia, Sr., and Mario B. Cia, Jr. (husband and son, of your Editor). We work almost full time, trying to print the various forms, and our Quarterly, Ancestor Chart Volumes, and Family Group Sheet Volumes, etc. The mail is very heavy, as many do not know how to contact the various other Societies, where to contact (in Arkansas the many different County and State Groups...they just write us!!! Many people read our Quarterlies in many Libraries, Doctor and Dentist Offices, Beauty Parlors, Private Homes, only to mention a few. At present our Society exchanges with over 105 other Societies, in the United States and Canada. REMEMBER your Editor cannot (and will not) answer personal mail! Time and energy will not allow that service! Many many members, (and prospective members, and friends drop in from time to time just to exchange a kind word or drop some valuable article to be shared with our Group.

Our BOOKS, and EXCHANGE QUARTERLIES are placed with our other large collection of material (thru the 19 plus year, our Society has progressed) in the LITTLE ROCK PUBLIC LIBRARY, 8th and Louisiana, downtown Little Rock. (Open 9 to 4 on every day except Sunday and Monday. Second Floor (Genealogical Section)).

EDITOR'S NOTES (Con't page 2)

New members may wonder... "WHAT IS AN ANCESTOR CHART VOLUME?" Our BOARD OF DIRECTORS (in 1975) decided it would be a good project, if we sent blank charts (in our Arkansas Family Historian Magazine) for our members to fill out and return, for publication, and perhaps make contacts with others working on the same families. Everyone thought it was a super idea, but after 3 months only 17 had returned...the idea was dropped. After another 3 months, when the Board met again, a mountain of charts had been returned to us. The idea again was considered, and at the October Workshop in 1975 our First ANCESTOR CHART VOLUMES were released, and everyone thought that was a super super idea. For those who only send their our Chart, then have a hard time waiting until they are published, it is fine, but if you could only see the condition some of the Charts are, when they reach our office!!!! We do not have TYPING service, and that is a bad idea anyway, as so many errors might be made by someone not understanding Genealogy, and the Surnames (not to mention some of the given names). The first Volume we did photo-copy best we could, then volunteers offered to re-type (that is when we decided NOT TO DO THAT!). Look in the back of this Quarterly and if you do not know an Ancestor Chart, when you see one...that will help.

We do not publish more than 4 for any one person in any one Volume (a volume has about 65 or so charts, list of compilers and an index in each Volume). We are not publishing any one person's family history, etc., but trying to help many persons make contacts with others working on the same lineage. Number 1 (for instance, on the Chart should be your name, #2 should be your father, #3, your mother, and so on...working back as far on your own line as possible. If you have real brothers and sisters, the chart will be the same (just change the name for the #1 person). If there is a different father or mother (step-bro. or sisters another chart will need to be used, each time this happens.

FAMILY GROUP SHEET VOLUMES are gathered in the same manner. Look in the back of this Quarterly, and you will see the difference. Our BOARD OF DIRECTORS decided these charts are very simple and most everyone would know how they should be used...some few have not understood them...and if you live in an area, where there is not a Library or anyone with any knowledge of Genealogy, that is a problem. Our readers have expressed THANKS to our helpful hints, on many occasions, as some do live on a rural route, or 200 miles or so from a Library or (more than that from a good Archives). Many of the better (larger) Libraries are finally making their Genealogical Section better and adding micro-film readers and a nice place for researchers to work, etc. You might check your Library every now and then as more books, etc. are being added all the time. If your Library has a problem, tell them about our ARKANSAS FAMILY HISTORIAN, you possibly will be doing them a favor, if they have never seen one of our issues!

On the FAMILY GROUP SHEET CHART, we suggest, begin with grandfather (either side, but one at a time). The top part is for him, the section under that is for grandmother. Fill in as much as possible. Then begin with the oldest child, fill all possible inf. on that, then continue to the next child, and so on down the list. If the family was larger than the chart will hold, continue on another page, and mark the page (Con't page 2, etc.) Be sure to document (best you can...and that only means...the source, where did you get your information? If it was from the mother, or father, or tombstone, bible records, obituary, or newspaper clipping, etc.) Be sure also to record the sex of the children...this could be most confusing, in time, especially if the boy should be named DORA, OR MARY, or ELLA, or anyother female name (as was the custom at various times!) This could be grandfather's second marriage or her 4th or so on. Make a note, if possible, and list the other spouse's names, and whether 1st or 2nd, etc. Every marriage is to be recorded on a separate page, so if the couple had 10 children and 8 of them married, there should be 9 Charts. One for the couple and one for each of the married children. If a child lived one minute, record that (if still-born, and you want to record that, fine, but also record...still-born).

We would not like to have information after the 1920 date, that is rather new and we would not like to get into recent record, they should be easy to find. It is the old and hard to find information (and if you would like to share, this is a great way to make other contacts).

These Charts will be published as time and our finances will permit, and often that is the early part of the year (but not always). Takes a lot of doing to get them in alphabetical order, printed, index made, and compiler's list made, and a cover...to let us know which charts are in that particular volume, collated, stapled, etc. Your Editor can either supervise that, or work on the Mail or the Quarterly, and time does run out.

At this date, we are pretty well up to date with both the AC and FGS publication, at least by the end of March, that should be true. Write and be sure to include S.A.S.E. if you would like to know which volume your chart is in. Please write: Jeania Moore Burns, Box 353, Alma, AR 72921 - she will check for you (a few dollars would be in order, if you want very much checked).

1982 we have published Volume 12, 13, (and hope to publish 14) Family Group Sheet Volumes. And the Ancestor Chart Volumes published in 1982 are: 20, 21, and 22. These are still \$3. each Order those from: AGS, 4200 "A" Street, Little Rock, AR 72205

THE JAMES CAMPBELL FAMILY

JAMES CAMPBELL, is the name of our first known ancestor. According to a letter written by his son, Alexander Campbell, dated June 1, 1885 and post-marked Dover, Arkansas, this James Campbell, was born in 1786, in Eastern Tennessee and raised in Cocke and Grainger Counties, Tennessee. His father was brought to America from Scotland, by his father, at the age of five. The reason given for leaving their homeland, was because of religious persecution.

The above mentioned letter, further states that James Campbell's father died when James was a young boy, leaving a wife and two other sons, Alexander, who was lost during the Jackson War and John, who left home early to go to Indiana. Three daughters were mentioned, Jane, Elizabeth, and one other, name unknown. One of these daughters married a Mr. Gouch, but nothing else is known of them or the brothers.

Several items seem to indicate that John and Usley Campbell were the parents of our James Campbell, born 1786. They are as follows:

From Jefferson County, TN...Will Book "I", Page 172...John Campbell, deceased, with Usley Campbell as admatrix. Sale Bill: dated March 27, 1801, lists Usley Campbell, Alexander Campbell, Jeremiah Shelley, Wm Brazelton, and Joseph Turner, as buyers.

From Jefferson County, TN..Deed Book "E", Page 222.. Deed registered, December 28, 1801, between John Campbell, deceased, and John Glass. Usley Campbell, widow and executrix of John Campbell, deceased, signs a "deed of conveyance" to John Glass, July 12, 1801, for a 150 acre tract, which had been a "grant".

From Grainger County, TN..Marriage Records.. Usley Campbell to John Anderson, July 12, 1804; Bondsman, Alexander Campbell. James Campbell to Lucy Howard, December 15, 1804; Bondsman, John Anderson.

After their marriage, James and Lucy (Howard) Campbell, began their westerly trek and on May 8, 1806, their first child was born in Warren County, Tennessee. The tax list for Giles County, Tennessee in 1810, list a James Campbell. The 1820 Census for Wayne County, Tennessee, lists a James Campbell, which is in accord with the bible records of James Campbell's family, which are now in the hands of Eli Taylor Campbell, a descendant. In the 1830 Census for McNairy County, Tennessee, James Campbell and family are in accord with records, plus the fact that this is the very route mentioned in above mentioned letter, that James Campbell took.

Sometime before 1836, James Campbell and his son, James jr, made a trip to Missouri to visit Lucy's father, who had left Tennessee at a date unknown and had made his home there. James and son both became ill with chills and fever and returned to Tennessee.

It has repeatedly been reported that James and Lucy (Howard) Campbell left Tennessee in 1836 and made the long trip to the area in Arkansas, which is now Searcy County. With most of their children and their families living in close proximity, James and Lucy lived their last years here, with Lucy dying October 6, 1845 and James following in August of 1850.

Somehow during all of the traveling and resettling, James and Lucy managed to educate their family and to provide them with a strong religious background. At a time when they must have lived under the most primitive of conditions and moving so many times to undeveloped locations, it makes one wonder how did they accomplish this feat and what strength and character they had to possess to make it possible.

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Warrant No. 86, 171, for 120 acres, in favor of Solomon Rye, Private, Captain Nebletts Company, Tennessee Militia, War 1812, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the East Half of the North East Quarter and the North East Quarter of the South East quarter, of Section twenty six in Township Nine North, of Range twenty West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Clarksville, Arkansas, containing one hundred and twenty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor General the said Warrant having been assigned by the said Solomon Rye, to Joseph Cammel Adkins, and by him to Roof H. Howell, in whose favor the said tract has been located.

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Roof H. Howell, as assignee, as aforesaid, and to his heirs, the tract of land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Roof H. Howell, as assignee, as aforesaid, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

COWAN Ancestry: BORDEN - FOWLE

Many COWANs in Arkansas descend from Samuel COWAN, who was born a little more than 200 years ago in southern Colonial America. He married Sarah KEITH, and later served in the War of 1812 from Bladsoe County, TN. They lived in McNairy County, TN, before 1830, and later in Tishomingo County, Mississippi. Their children included: (1) Riley, who married Phoebe ACREE; (2) Samuel; (3) William, who m. Sarah \_\_\_\_\_; (4) Margaret, who m. Miles THOMAS; (5) James, who m. Louisa BLASSINGAME; (6) Eli, who m. Anna E. HAYS; (7) John Borden, who m. Rebecca HAYES; (8) Stephen, who m. Elizabeth LONG. Many of these children lived in Johnson County, Arkansas, after 1849. Some went to Titus County, TX. Riley died in Newton County, AR, in 1887. Eli died in Boone County, AR, after 1880. A book about the descendants of this COWAN family is in the process of being published by Mrs. Charlene FRUITT, Route 2 Box 418, Mineral Wells, TX 76067.

Sarah (KEITH) COWAN was the daughter of Nichodemus KEITH, a judge in Knoxville, TN, and Margaret (Peggy) BORDEN. Her BORDEN and FOWLE ancestry is presented here.

According to a book printed in Philadelphia in 1901, by Thomas Allen GLENN, about the "Pedigree of Richard BORDEN . . .," the earliest known ancestor was Henry BORDEN, born in England in the 1370's. Absolute proof for connections of the first four generations has not been found by other researchers. He is stated to be the father of Thomas BORDEN.

John BORDEN, of Headcorn, county Kent, England, wrote a will 26 Apr 1469. No date of probate exists. He was to be buried in the churchyard of St. Peter and St. Paul. The will mentions that his deceased parents were Thomas and Isabel. His wife was Benedicta. He had a son William.

William BORDEN, of Headcorn, left a will dated 10 Feb 1530 or 1531, which was proved 25 Sep 1531. He was to be buried at the Church of Our Lady between his wives Joan and Thamasine. This will mentions his living wife Rose. According to the above mentioned book, he was the father of Edmund.

Edmund BORDEN is an ancestor for which ample proof is available of connection to the American BORDEN family. He paid taxes to King Henry VIII. He died between the date his will was written, 13 Apr 1539, and date it was proved, 18 June 1539. He was buried in the Headcorn churchyard. His wife Margaret was pregnant, according to his will. He mentioned a son William.

William BORDEN left an undated will in Headcorn which was proved 8 June 1557. The will mentions wife Joan and a son Thomas.

Thomas BORDEN, yeoman, of Headcorn, wrote his will 13 Apr 1587. The name of his first wife is not known. He was buried at the parish church of Headcorn, 21 Apr 1592. The will lists a son Matthew.

Matthew BORDEN, yeoman, of Headcorn, was baptized at Frittenden, county Kent, on 30 Sep, about 1563. On 26 Sep 1620, he wrote a will which mentions wife Joan and a son Richard. Matthew owned land in Headcorn, Smarden, and Bletchenden, all in county Kent. He was buried at Headcorn 4 Oct 1620.

Richard BORDEN, son of Matthew, was baptized at Headcorn, county Kent, England, on 22 Feb 1595 or 1596. He was married in the Headcorn church on 28 Sep 1625 to Joane FOWLE. Her ancestry is included later in this article. They moved to Cranbrook, county Kent, in 1628, where she had relatives. In 1637 or 1638 they came to New England with five children and settled in Portsmouth, Rhode Island. Their son Matthew was born in May 1638, and said to be the first English child born on Rhode Island. They had six other children. He acquired large tracts of land in Rhode Island and East Jersey. Richard, also, held various public offices, including deputy from Portsmouth to the Rhode Island General Assembly. He died 25 May 1671 and was buried in the burial ground of the Society of Friends at Portsmouth, RI.

Benjamin BORDEN, the eleventh child of Richard and Joane, was born 16 May 1649, at Portsmouth, RI. After 1665 he settled on some of his father's land at Shrewsbury, Monmouth County, NJ. He married Abigail GROVER in Sep 1670. They lived many years at Middletown, then moved to Evesham, Burlington County, NJ, in 1713. Like his father, he became a large landowner and was elected to several public offices. Joseph, a son of Benjamin, was the founder of Bordentown, NJ. Abigail died 8 Jan 1720. Benjamin died about 1728.

James GROVER, the father of Abigail BORDEN and Hannah WINTER, settled at Gravesend, Long Island, in 1648. He married Rebecca \_\_\_\_\_, held various public offices, and died in 1686.

Benjamin BORDEN, son of the first Benjamin, was born 6 Apr 1675, in Monmouth County, NJ. He married his first cousin Zeruish WINTER, daughter of William WINTER and Hannah GROVER. Benjamin had ten children and moved to Virginia before 1734, when he was appointed one of the justices of Orange County. On 6 Nov 1739, King George II granted to him 92,100 acres in what later became Rockbridge County, VA. He died in 1743, near Winchester, shortly after his appointment as one of the original justices of Frederick County, VA.

John BORDEN, son of the second Benjamin, married Ann (?) HAWKINS. About 1770 they left Frederick County and moved to Bedford County, VA, then a few years later to Knox County, TN. Their daughter Margaret was the mother of Sarah (KEITH) COWAN, mentioned earlier.

Joane FOWLE, who married Richard BORDEN in 1625, was a great-granddaughter of Richard FOWLE, who was born in county Kent, England, probably about 1514. (He was probably the son of Thomas FOWLE, of Marden, county Kent, who died between 28 Sep and 7 Nov 1514. He stated in his will that his wife Johane was pregnant.) Richard lived in Frittenden, county Kent, and wrote a will 3 Sep 1570. He was buried at Frittenden 5 May 1572. His will gave to son Thomas his lands in Frittenden and Marden.

Thomas FOWLE, of Frittenden, wrote a will 20 Apr 1587. His second wife Joane was buried at Frittenden 21 May 1570. Thomas was buried at Frittenden on 25 Aug 1592. Most of his lands in Marden and Frittenden were given to son Richard.

Richard FOWLE, yeoman, was baptized at Frittenden on 18 Dec 1569. He married Mrs. Mary MILKES on 3 Sep 1601, at St. Margaret's in Canterbury, county Kent. She was buried at Headcorn, county Kent, on 1 Aug 1627. Richard was buried at Headcorn 2 Mar 1631 or 1632. His will, dated 20 Dec 1630, mentions his daughter Joane BORDEN.

Joane FOWLE was baptized 5 Jul 1612 at Headcorn. The wife of Richard BORDEN, she died 15 July 1688 at Portsmouth, Rhode Island.

The preceding information is not common knowledge among the COWAN clan. It is hoped that this record will be of much benefit to the descendants of Samuel and Sarah (KEITH) COWAN. This summary contains names of over 30 of her ancestors.

The Teel Cemetery is located about 5 miles south of Strong, Union County, Arkansas. 1/4 miles off the Strong-Huttig Highway. The oldest marked grave is William Jameson, June 20, 1861. There is one grave known to be older, the grave of Chambliss. This grave is the only brick covered grave in the cemetery and there is no name or date to be found.

This information has been compiled by Suzanne Caprio, her mother Opal McKinney Poe and her mother, Pearl Cobb McKinney. Mrs. McKinney has lived near or within five (5) miles of the cemetery all of her 86 years. She knows where many unmarked graves are located. We list these names in this index, also.

Mrs. Rebecca Jane Beall, 93, died Friday morning in Tyler County Hospital after an illness of several weeks.

Mrs. Beall was born in Missouri and was brought to Texas from Arkansas in a covered wagon after the death of her parents to live with her grandparents near Cleburne. At the age of 15 she was married to Henry L. Beall who preceded her in death in 1937. She made her home in Belton most of her life. After the death of her husband she has lived with her children, the past 18 months in Woodville with a daughter, Mrs. Robert A. Rotan. She was a member of the Baptist Church in Belton.

Surviving are two sons, Charles R. Beall of Galveston and Nelson Beall of Houston; three daughters, Mrs. Walter Johnson of Belton, Mrs. James B. Nixon of Houston and Mrs. Robert A. Rotan of Woodville; 22 grandchildren, 27 great grandchildren and three great great grandchildren.

The body was taken overland to Belton by Edwards Funeral Home of Woodville, where services were held in the First Baptist Church at 3 p.m. Saturday. Rev. Oliver Beall, a grandson, of Beaumont, was the officiating minister assisted by Rev. James Basden of First Baptist Church Belton. Burial was in North Belton cemetery under the direction of Phillips-Luckey funeral directors. Pallbearers were Ray Savage, Q. A. Ellis, William Soloman, Jack Tulloch, Marshall Mayes and William Utaler.

now record ten and nine generations with ALLIED FAMILIES; HARRIS, HAYNES and RAGSDALE as principal relations to the present day.

Much as in the construction of cloth its "interlacing of flexible yarns at right angles with the aid of a loom" a family lineage is woven by the inter-mingling of several families in each generation. It includes many families over a period of nine and ten generations. Thus a fascinating tapestry results.

The NOBLE family is perpetuated in memory by NOBLE LAKE in Jefferson County, Arkansas, on Highway 65 South from Pine Bluff.

It is not known when the NOBLES came to America nor from what part of France they left. The following Baptism Record of JOHN NOBLE (1798-1854) from the Catholic Diocese Records in Little Rock, Arkansas, documents their being in the Cumberland area of Tennessee in June 1798 and moving to Arkansas Post, Arkansas, before May 11, 1799. This document was written by a Spanish Priest and gives a Spanish spelling for French and English names:

"On this day Monday, May 11, 1799, I PEDRO JANIN, in charge of the District of Arkansas for his Most Lustrous Holiness, baptized and anointed with the other oils, a boy child born 3rd day of June 1798 in Tennessee, the legit son of MARCO NOBLE and CATHALENE ELET, both parishoners of the province of the Cumberland, the grandparents paternal JUAN NOBLE and ELISABETHA CARLE; great Grandparents JACOBA NOBLE and MAKERKLY CAROLA, maternal."

"God Father: Athenese Racine

God Mother: Maria Magdalena Vanois.

On that child I have ministered the sacred ceremony and prayers, and I put for a name JUAN, the Godparents to whom I advised of the spiritual kinship and I signed so that it might be sure.

(Signed) PEDRO JANIN, Parish Priest."

National language changes are: English: Mark Noble, Catherine Elliott, John Noble; to Spanish: Marco Noble, Cathalene Elet and Juan Noble; French: Marques Noble and Jean Noble.

The date the Noble family came to Noble Lake is not known. It has been told through the generations that they were on their way to Texas in a covered wagon and late one afternoon they passed "switch cane" for some time. John knew that where cane grew thick water was near. He stopped the team, took a butcher knife from the wagon and cut a trail until he came to the lake, and seeing plenty of water and feed (cane) for the stock he decided to camp for the night. The next morning he walked around looking the land over and was impressed with the virgin timber and rich soil and decided to make a home there.

The Noble family seems to have been settled a few years before he bought land. He was active in helping to improve living conditions in the community. On February 4, 1822, John Noble and a number of other residents of Phillips and Arkansas Counties (Jefferson County was not formed until November 2, 1829, from Arkansas and Pulaski Counties) sent a petition to Congress requesting mail service between the town of Arkansas Post, Territory of Arkansas, and the Post of Ouachita, Louisiana, a distance of 140 miles.1. On the 12th day of August, 1836, John Noble paid to Alexander Stephens, \$100 for 80 acres of land.2. On the 5th day of September 1842, John Noble paid \$125 an acre for 160 acres of land and got a land grant, Certificate No. 3666 signed by President John Tyler.3. In all he had 2400 acres of land.

As these two families are brought together it is necessary to go back in time and give the Gravier lineage.

### THE GRAVIERS FROM NORTHERN FRANCE

The Christian Gravier Family lived in Northern France near the German border. Christian Gravier (1671-1721) married Catherine Hencke and moved to Germany. He read the glowing accounts of the riches available to settlers in the French Province of LOUISIANA contained in pamphlets distributed by the Indies Company throughout Germany about 1791-1720. He decided to leave his strife-torn homeland "to seek his fortune". He departed from his home in the Prussian Province of Brandenburg in 1720 for a port of embarkation and sailed in 1721 for the Port of Biloxi, Mississippi. Accompanied by his wife and son Andrea and daughter, Core, his dreams were short lived for he died in 1721 soon after landing at Bi-(5) loxi. The remaining members of the family settled on "Primera Costa De Las Alamanes" (First German Coast). This was in the St. Charles and St. John the Baptist Parishes in Louisiana, which was a 40 mile stretch on the West bank of the Mississippi River, about 30 miles above New Orleans settled in 1719-1722 by Colonist from Europe sent by John Law. At this time another language change was given the French name of Gravier. Naturally the German clerks spelled the name in his own language and it became Grabert, etc. Just as naturally it did not change the French blood which flowed in their veins.

Andrea Christian Gravier, the son, took land adjacent to that of his mother who had the daughter Core with her. The mother was sick and did not long survive the hard life of trying to carve a productive farm from the wilderness. The last mention of the sister, Core, was made in 1726. The records in the "Little Red Church" of St. Charles parish were burned with the church in 1877, and such information about the Graviere will never be known.<sup>6</sup>

Listed below is the complete lineage of the Gravier Family from the first known members to the linking with the Noble Family. In 1777 Ambroise Gravier (2) sold land located about 24 miles above New Orleans. They arrived in Arkansas after June 1785 and before 1793.

The John Noble Family was included in the 1830 U. S. Census of Rich-

George as well as a granddaughter. Prior to 1830 John Noble helped with  
building of the Catholic Church, St. Peters of New Gascony. John Noble,  
Jr. was one of the first altar boys. Later St. Paul's Catholic Church  
was founded, built on the West bank of Noble Lake on land donated by Emma  
Kelley. The church was on the register of the diocese of Arkansas from  
1856 to 1871, served by Father Patrio McGowan from St. Peter's church.

together since these are the ones we are principally concerned with.

Two other stones found nearby were: A. L. Woodside Born Apr. 3, 1821 Died Apr. 22, 1864 and stone of J. O. Clark Born Feb. 18, 1818 Died---- broken off.

About 1/2 mi. south of Rohwer, on an Indian mound: To The Memory of Wm. Preston Born Nov. 6, 1843 Died Nov--1876 "Not gone from memory, not gone from love, but gone to our Father's home above."

Burnett Cem. located on landward side of Arkansas River levee, abt. halfway between Yancopin and Pendleton: Lou H. McDaniel B. Mar. 11, 1868 D. Dec. 1898; Sallie A. wife of Wm. Burnett B. June 24, 1864, D. Apr. 12, 1889; Wm. H. Burnett Jan. 29, 1857-Feb. 23, 1911; Florence C. wife of W. H. Burnett B. Nov. 18, 1860, D. Oct. 1885; Charles Wm. Burnett Aug 18, 1883-Sept 18, 1919 (This has Woodman of World marker); No name--Dau. of L.E and Fannie M. Burnett, B. Mar. 14, 1874 D. Feb. 3, 1896; Lemuel F. Son of L. P. Jr. and Fannie M. Burnett B. Jan. 27, 1887 D. Aug. 10, 1895; Fannie M. wife of L. P. Burnett Jr. B. Sept 2, 1864, M. Apr. 23, 1882, D. Aug 13, 1895; Elizabeth Burnett B. Sept. 28, 1820 D. Dec. 7, 1906 She died as she lived, a Christian; Lemuel Burnett, B. Aug. 4, 1810 D. June 30, 1894.

Parlton, b. Oct. 26, 1858, d. Dec. 9, 1915; R. N. Parlton b. Feb. 25, 1855 d. Jan. 15, 1912; Renzie Seagraves 1862-1941 (she was 1st m. to John W. Nolen.) Elizabeth Faulkner b. May 3, 1837 d. Nov 2, 1913; Worden Sullivan Harris 1880-1882; Persons and Carnleys--related to Simpsons or Pauleys? Another prob. of interest to my friend Mr. R. W. Dhonau---George W. Dhonau Oct. 10, 1847-Oct. 6, 1901.

An elderly lady of Dark Corner community told me that the Jardelas family's private cemetery had been destroyed by farming operations. Such a shame.

Now a query which I am not the least hopeful of having any results. My quest has been long and rather expensive and I am about ready to cry, "Timber!" This is hoping that someone, somewhere can tell me my grandmother Marguarite Simpson's REAL maiden name. Wm. L. Pauley was not her father, but m. her mother, also unkn. to me. I think her (Marguarite's) pts may have been Zeno Jardelas (Judlow) and Sarah? Jane? Smith. Lost records; no proof.

Bell, departed this life July ?, 1872, by drowning - age 36, 2 mos, 14 days." Date of birth, May? 1836. She was much older than James. "Aunt Lo" can tell you the story of how she died in the river. She and James were in an old house-boat taking some logs to the mill, or something like that - she got up early one morning and fell from the back porch of the boat into the river. All they ever found was her bonnet. I don't think her body was ever recovered. Apparently this woman had 3 children after she and James married; the Bible has entries of a marriage btw James and Janne Aug 18 1861; births: JOHN WILLIAM BELL: b 16 Mar 1862; md NANCY ALDERSON, who died Dec 8, 1891; no date of death for him; MARY ADALINE BELL b Dec. 7 1864; died?; GEORGE WASHINGTON BELL b July 6 1866; died 27 Apr 1867 (age 9 mos).

Appears these 3 children, were 1/2 bros & sisters to above children of James J. Bell and "Mollie" Fleming Bell;

LOUIS (LEWIS) BELL, b April 14 1882; d April 19 1882 (5 days old) this is the same birth date for EDWARD FRANKLIN BELL; I wonder if this was a twin & the day of birth was the 16th instead of 14th?? Or could this have been the baby born to JOHN WILLIAM BELL & NANCY ALDERSON BELL?? John W Bell & Nancy A. Bell were married Sept 19 1881; Nancy died Dec 8 1891 at which time John was 29 yrs. of age. I have not located a date of death for him.

WELCH Clifford R. Knowles, P. O. Box 271, Standard, CA 95373 - The WELCH families arrived in Arkansas about 1853 and settled in Western Arkansas where Clark, Pike, and Montgomery Counties join. Around 1900 most of the WELCH (in my genealogical families) moved into Texas. The WELCH originally settled in the Colonias about 1685. Thomas Samuel WELCH in North Carolina, Walter WELCH in South Carolina, and Newton WELCH in Pennsylvania. From those areas they migrated into Overton County, TN (1800), then to Harde-man Co., TN (1834).

My 5th g. grandfather, Thomas Samuel WELCH (11 May 1749-2 March 1846) fought in the Revolutionary War. A resident of White Co., TN he applied for a pension in 1833 at age 84 and collected it, all \$50. for the next 13 years.

My g. g. grandfather, Thomas Franklin WELCH, b. 27 April 1812, Overton Co., TN married to Elizabeth OLIVER, 28 Feb. 1831. He died 22 August 1871, and was buried at Glenwood, Seb. Co AR.

Elizabeth OLIVER WELCH was born 12 Feb. 1810 in Georgia (I would like to find out where?), died 20 July 1883 and is buried at Glenwood, Sebastain Co., AR.

Thomas Franklin WELCH is said to have been a great Baptist prescher in TN and Arkansas. He and his 5 sons are said to have organized many of the early churches in Southwest Arkansas.

Thomas F. WELCH was a Royal Arch Mason and Moderator of the Caddo River Association (Baptist) in Montgomery Co., AR., from 1854-1871. Could anyone please help me in finding records of Arkansas Baptist Churches? He was also connected with the churches of Mt. Ida, Montgomery Co., Alpine, Clark Co., AR., Oerosch, Hot Spring Co., and in Nashville, Howard Co., Arkansas. The WELCH History says he signed an "AMNESTY OATH" 25 Nov. 1865, but the Arkansas History Commission cannot find a record. I am very interested in finding records of my great grandfather, Thomas Jefferson WELCH (1843-1920) and his wife, Mary Fernetta DILLARD (1846, Alabama, d. 1920 New Mexico). Was Fernetta or Elizabeth her middle name? & what was her mother's maiden name? What is know about her father, Green DILLARD of Alabama? NOTE: Is there any way I could purchase printed records of the Glenwood, Sebastain Co., AR Cemeteries? Or Old cemetery records of Clark, Pike and Montgomery Counties????

INFORMATION TO BE SHARED - Mr. SCOTT from near Little Rock

"I am a family historian and while researching newspapers for information on one of my branches, I ran across the following article which may be of interest and/or value to someone searching for a SCOTT in Arkansas. The item reads as follows:

'The following was found in a tightly corked bottle (sic) that was picked up on a sandbar of the Brasos river in Texas: January 6, 1881.--Dear Nancy: I am permitted by those who are about to take my life, for nothing on earth that I have done, to write a few lines. I trust to kind Providence to guard this until it will reach the hands of some one who will have it published, and then you may find out what has become of me. I have not time to tell you how I came here, and they would not permit me to say anything about it; so I will just say I will die in a few minutes. So good-bye. May God take care of you and my little children. Kiss them for me. My name is Aaron Scott, and I live near Little Rock, Arkansas.'

Published in the WARREN SHEAF newspaper, Warren, Minnesota - May 25, 1881; Vol. I. No. 26, Back Page (comes before title pg.) Col. 1. Newspaper is on microfilm with the Minnesota Historical Society, St. Paul, MN, and is available through Interlibrary Loan.

Since the name SCOTT is not in my family, nor am I currently researching in your state, I have not followed up on this rather interesting piece of History. However, I do admit to a great feeling of curiosity as to whether Mr. Scott really did meet a mysterious death or if perhaps this was his unusual way of opting out of his current life and into a new one. The possibility that the whole thing is a hoax also exists. In any event, if anyone should ever hear anything about the above, I would really like to know.

JOHNSON Mrs. James M. Shipp, 2895 Spring Ridge Dr., Memphis, TN 38127 - J. W. Johnson mentioned in the following article is my g. g. grandfather. I have done some research on him, and found his wife's name to be Emily, but have been unable to find her maiden name. Since her father was in the Revolutionary War, I am most anxious to know his name. Perhaps someone else has done research on this family can help me.

" W. M. Johnson is a Mississippian, born 5 Oct 1835, a son of J. W. Johnson, who was also born in that State, but inherits Irish blood of his father and mother, who were born in the Emerald Isle, but the former was of Scotch-Irish descent. The maternal grandfather was of Dutch descent, and was a participant in the Revolutionary War. J. W. Johnson was a farmer by occupation, and died in Nov. 1876. W.M. Johnson's advantages for acquiring an education were very poor, but in 1859 he started out in life for himself as a farmer, about two miles from where his father had purchased land at an early day at the time of his settlement there being only about six families in the entire settlement. Panthers, wolves, deer and other wild game abounded, and the streams were filled with fish, ready and willing to snap at the hook of the angler. Mr. Johnson settled on his present farm in 1869, it comprising of 160 acres, and he has about forty acres in cultivation, on which he raises cotton and corn, the yield of each being fair. In March 1862, he put aside his farming implement to join the Confederate Army, becoming a member of the First Arkansas Battalion, and was on hospital duty during his service, but was discharged in June, 1863 returned home and resumed farming, managing his own and neighboring farms and supplying the army with corn and hogs and beef cattle. He was married March 16, 1863 to Mrs. Rebecca J. Sullivant, the widow of J. M. Sullivant. To them five children were born: Susan Emily (who died on August 30, 1867, at the age of three years); Edward T. (born February 18, 1868); Kernellier (who died at infancy); Amanda L. Johnson (born March 6, 1866, now the wife of J. R. Roger of Ashley Co.); and John H. (born Feb. 26, 1871). Mr. Johnson and his wife are members of the Missionary Baptist Church, and he is a Democrat, politically. A short history of Mr. Johnson's father's career will here be of considerable interest and it speaks for itself. The latter was left an orphan in early boyhood, but being of a very enterprising and energetic disposition he succeeded in accumulating a handsome fortune, which was subsequently swept away by security debts which he was compelled to pay. During this time he was a resident of Yalobusha Co., Mississippi, and the men for whom he went security were Magic and Skipper, wealthy men of Western Texas at the present time, who were then cotton and general merchants of Grenada, Mississippi. They saw a chance to take advantage of Mr. Johnson for a debt of \$41,000.00; did so and the magnificent estate which the latter owned together with eighteen slaves and other valuable property went to satisfy the creditors of the notorious firm of Magic and Skipper. Mr. Johnson then took up a timber claim and he and his family lived in a rude board structure throughout one winter, then sold out and moved to Warren Co., near Vicksburg, Mississippi, where they made their home for seven years. Their family consisted of six children, the oldest son being now the Postmaster of Ain, Grant Co., AR; the third son was killed at Cane Hill, Arkansas during the Civil War; the fourth died at Hernando, Mississippi of measles, and of the second, who is the subject of sketch, we have a short history. His oldest sister is now the widow of Thomas Chambers, of Drew Co., AR and the second is the wife of J.J. Bain. Until he was nine years of age, W.M. Johnson was a stout, healthy lad, but about this time he became afflicted with dropsy, for which he obtained no cure for nine years; and to make matters worse, he was stricken with paralysis during this time, and for a long time had no use of his right side. His cure was finally effected by his father and mother, who tried the water-cure, and also gave white mustard seed and Dr. John Bull's Saraparilla. After a time he was sent with his eldest brother on horseback to Arkansas, where his health returned to him, and he remained (con't on next page)

JOHNSON (con't)

until twenty-seven years of age. He then joined the Confederate Army but was soon after taken with typhoid fever, which kept him in the hospital six weeks; then nervous fever. After passing through a seige of the yellow jaundice and the mumps, he became so reduced in health that on July 15, 1862, he started for home which place he reached July 23. The most of the time since, he has been in the enjoyment of fair health, with one exception, and his career as a farmer has been given above.

EDITOR'S NOTE: This was copied from "Goodspeed's History of South Arkansas". If you have not searched in these "Goodspeed Histories", you may have missed much family history which has already been recorded. However like many other published records, you may not find all printed matter is true, but it is a good record to prove or disprove, it is the best we have of our early records. Most Libraries have copies (at least of their own states).

ARKANSIANS IN THE MOUNTAIN MEADOW MASSACRE

by R. P. Baker

In the Summer of 1857, a group of Mormons and Indians under the direction of Elder John D. Lee, attacked a wagon train of 137 people at Mountain Meadow in Southern Utah. All were killed except 17 small children, who were taken captive by the Mormons. This caravan, known as the Fancher Train, was made up of some thirty families mostly from Northern Arkansas and Southern Missouri. The following list gives the names of the Arkansians who perished, the children who survived and these families from the 1850 U.S. Census of Arkansas. For a full description of this incident, see Juanita Brooks' The Mountain Meadows Massacre.

He was stationed at Little Rock, AR before going to Camp Chaffee, AR 1943 to 1946, and knew many people in Arkansas." Copied from "The Citizen" 6 Aug. 1981, Mansfield, AR

David Leander "Lee" Pyles, died suddenly in Memorial Gen. Hospital at Las Cruces, N. M. He was stricken with an apparent heart attack while enroute to Ft. Bliss, Wm. Beaumont Hos. in El Paso, TX., where he had undergone routine surgery on July 9. He was b. 12 Oct. 1906, Savannah, MO., ant the oldest and only son b. to Wm. Freston and Fannie Moe Burns Pyles. Joined the US Army in July 1923 and served aboard the USS Selfridge, two yrs. He joined the US Army in 1926 and completed 31 yrs. 8 mo. and 5 days of active military service. He began his long army career in the old Horse Calvary at Ft. Riley and Ft. Leavenworth, KS. He served in the 15th Inf. Division in China in the early 1930's. He was stationed with the Ft. From a picture in my possession, made in 1908 at the last reunion of Indian Territory Deputy U. S. Marshals, in front of the pioneer Historical U. S. Criminal Courthouse located at Fort Smith, Sebastian Co., Arkansas, and showing the building in the rear, of the famous jail, where about 100 men were taken and hanged. Judge Isaac Parker the greatest Criminal judge was over this court 1875-1896, during this time 13,480 cases were docketed, 344 capitol cases tried punishable by death, 174 convicted, 168 sentenced to be hanged.

The famous Deputy Marshals cover Indian Territory from this Court, and about 200 deputies all told, performed this task, traveling by wagon, horse-back, or foot, covering 75,000 square miles. Often a trip of 1,000 miles took 2 or 3 months, 65 of this number were slain in the performance of duty.

At the reunion a Memorial Service was held for the 65 slain comrades. These were the men that prepared Indian Territory for Oklahoma Statehood. My father John CONROY, was married in St Mary's Vhurch, Clennell, Ireland in 1904 and I got his marriage certificate. I have no record of his birth and there is no record of his birth in the official records in Dublin or in London, or in Irish Parish Records (of him or his family). My father, John CONROY was a Catholic as was his father, but his mother was a Protestant. We need the full connecting Records from 1800 and we do know the family had a period of years in Arkansas.

In 1776 John Conroy was born of an Irish mother with lands in County Cork, Ireland, of the old DUCAL Family called, Ponsobny CONROY. John CONROY inherited these lands in County Cork, Ireland. John CONROY became controller of the Duchess of Kent Household at Buckingham Palace, London. John CONROY had a well known relationship with the Princess of the Royal House of Hanover Saxe - Coburg from Germany. Through family traditional History we understand that a secret marriage was contracted when they were both 22 years of age in 1808. This marriage was not approved of because of religious differences prevailing at the time in the British Isles. It is most important to obtain this marriage certificate and birth certificates of their children. John CONROY's wife's name was (HSH) Victoria Mary Louise SAALSFIELD COBERG. John CONROY was knighted Sir John and his wife had six children. Eldest child, Sir Edward CONROY, born 1809, died 1869 with issue; Elizabeth Jane, born 1811, died 1855 unmarried (no issue); Arthur CONROY, born and died in childhood 1817 (no issue); Stephen Rowley CONROY, born 1815? died 1841 unmarried (no issue); Henry George CONROY, born 1817? died 1890, married twice (no issue); Marie Louise Victoire? bor 1819 died 1864. Sir Edward CONROY (I understand) died in 1869? Sir Edward had a son, Sir John Conroy. This Sir John CONROY had five children: (uncertain of birth dates), Grace, Anne, John (direct inheritance) Micheal, Thomas. Aunt Grace remembers Arkansas. She died 1933 in England. My father is the above underlined. I will appreciate any help, on the above people, while in Arkansas. My Aunt Grace CONROY had Deeds of land left to her in an old legacy from the family, in Arkansas. My daughter is Dorothy Pritchard and is helping me.

My reconstruction: John is John Wesley ROBERTS, b. 1760/1780, and is father to some or all of the above, who seem to have been born in Tennessee. He seems to have married a 2nd time in Arkansas. He died between 1840-1850 in Carroll Co., AR. Brown C. ROBERTS, b. 1790-1800, in Marion Co., in 1840. Wesley ROBERTS died between 1832-1834, leaving sons: John Wesley ROBERTS, b. 1827, GA., and James M. ROBERTS, b. 1832, AR, and his widow, Elizabeth, who thereafter married Peter SNEED. Aaron moved from Carroll Co., to Pope Co., Arkansas 1837-38. Richard remained in Carroll Co., AR married twice, had two large families. Joseph went back to TN ca 1836, but returned to Carroll Co., before 1860. Around 1844, another John ROBERTS, born KY and family moved to Carroll Co., from Kentucky. His sons had names like John W., Aaa, etc., similar to those named above. I have no knowledge of counties in Tenn., Ga., or Kentucky, nor any proof of relationships between any of these people. I will appreciate any information and will gladly share with others working on any of these lines.

The Rancho Santa Ana Del Chino, owned by Issac Williams, was located in what was later to become the San Bernardino Valley of Southern California. Because of its location adjacent to the trail to the Yuma crossing of the Colorado River and also at the foot of Cajon Pass on the route to Salt Lake City, it became a stopping place for many of the gold rush emigrants. Issac Williams opened his large hacienda to the sick and hungry and offered the facilities of his rancho to rest the desert weary stock and repair the wagons of the travelers.

Issac Williams was born in Wyoming Valley, Pennsylvania on 19 Sept 1799, and arrived in Los Angeles in April 1832 with Ewing Young's trappers. He married Maria de Jesus Lugo, daughter of Don Antonio Maria Lugo and he bought the Rancho Santa Ana del Chino from his father-in-law and lived the rest of his life on it. He died on 13 Sept 1856.

A record book was maintained at the Rancho in which many of the travelers recorded their arrivals and experiences en route to California. Messages to friends who would be following, livestock lost or found, and animals supplied and loaned the emigrants by Williams were also noted. The original book is preserved in the Huntington Library in San Marino, California. A transcription of the original by Lindley Bynum appeared in the quarterly of the Historical Society of Southern California in 1934. From this article Ted Rischard, of the Orange County Calif genealogical society abstracted the names and I abstracted the Arkansas people.

VARIANCE IN CENSUS RECORDS

As an example of variance in census records we look at the case of Cardwell B.R. Smith. From Goodspeed's Southern Arkansas, Pub. 1890, page 167, the younger brother of Cardwell B.R. Smith, Willis S. Smith, was born 10 Aug 1810 in Todd County, Kentucky (then Logan County.) This article says that the parents of Willis moved from Stewart Co., Tenn. to Todd Co., Ky. in 1808. Rev. James Richard Hilton, grandson of C.B.R. Smith, stated that his grandfather was born in 1808 in Stewart Co., Tenn., his grandmother, Hettie (Riffe) Smith was born 1 Feb 1822, Jackson Co., Alabama.

BOOK REVIEWS

"HISTORY OF JOHNSON COUNTY, ARKANSAS" - The First Hundred Years, by Ella Malloy Langford - Third reprint 1981 of 1921 original publication, by Johnson County Historical Society, P. O. Box 505, Clarksville, Ark., 72830. 210 pages plus full-name index, 8 1/2 x 11", Hard Cover.

This history begins with the movement of Indian tribes and 1812 grant which permitted formation of the Cherokee Nation West from land which had previously been used by the Osage Indians. In 1819, following the formation of the Arkansas Territory, this land was declared as Crawford County. In 1820 two white men entered this county who were leaders in the development of the land by people settling it. One was Col. Matthew Lyon, the U. S. Indian Commissioner, who established his post on Sprada Bluff, and the other was Rev. Cephas Washburn, with a party of Presbyterian missionaries, located five miles upstream from the Arkansas River on Illinois Bayou that is now in Pope County.

This history traces the events that took place in the development of this territory. It is most skillfully related and the early stories are most interesting. Early pioneers came in larger numbers after 1828 and Johnson County was formed in 1833.

"RECORDS OF CRAWFORD COUNTY, ARKANSAS - MARRIAGE BOOK "C", 1900-1906", compiled by Oma Cole, Rt. 3, Box 1, Alma, Ark., 72921 and Lucille Pound, 14028 Sardis Rd., Mabelvale, Ark., 72103, 1981. 121 pages with surname index, 8 1/2 x 11", soft, cover.

In the body of this book last names of both brides and grooms are all capitalised, which makes for quick recognition. Marriages are listed in the order they were recorded with the county clerk. The date of the wedding ceremony is clearly shown but the page number of the marriage book in which it was listed is not shown.

The information is neatly recorded and easy to read. Addition information should be obtained from one of the compilers. We appreciate the receipt of this book on Crawford County donated by the compilers.

"STATUE OF MOTHER JOSEPH (Eather Pariseau), a Sister of Providence" as presented by the State of Washington in the Rotunda of the United States Capitol. 90 pages, 6x9", published 1980 by U.S. Government Printing Office.

Each state is allowed to put statues of two persons in the Hall of Statuary at the U. S. Capitol. These persons must have contributed to the development of the state and its citizens. This publication is about the public ceremonies of acceptance of the statue of Mother Joseph.

A short biography tells that she was born on April 17, 1823 in Montreal Canada. She went with four other sisters of Providence to Fort Vancouver in December 1856. She performed many outstanding acts in the State of Washington. Among these were: care for orphans, care for the aged, care for the mentally ill, the first to establish a permanent Catholic school and first to establish a hospital in the state as well as being the first architect in the Pacific Northwest.

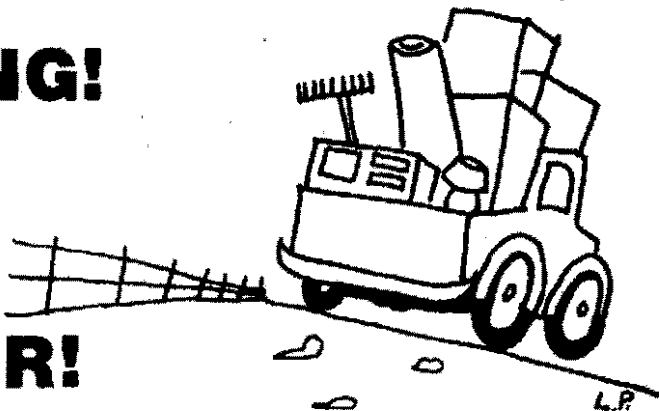

**MAKING A FAMILY RECORD** may be up to you! If someone in your family has already worked on the records, fine! but you might like to recheck the information before you begin. Document your records as you progress. That means, be sure to record where you found the record (courthouse, census, bible, personal interview, newspaper clippings, cemetery markers, etc.) Date your notes, and please write the name of the book and page number. Many books are now published (many in the last 5 or so years) by individuals or family groups, who have had an interest in preserving their family history.

**START WITH YOURSELF** - You are the beginning "twig" on your family tree, & work toward your unknown "roots". Find out the vital information about your parents, write it down, then look for data about your grandparents, greatgrandparents, etc.

**NAMES, DATES, PLACES, RELATIONSHIPS** - You will be concerned with pulling from the many and varied documents of recorded history four key items: names, dates, places, and relationships. These are the tools of the family searcher. People can be identified in records by their names, the dates of events in their lives (birth, marriage, death), the places they lived, and by relationship to others either stated or implied in the records.

**HOME SOURCES** - The place to begin is at home. Here you will find much information in family Bibles, newspaper clippings, military certificates, birth and death certificates, marriage licenses, diaries, letters, scrapbooks, backs of pictures (we hope they have been identified) baby books, confirmation certificates, etc.

**RELATIVES AS SOURCE** - Visit or write those in your family who may have information particularly older relatives. (Do not forget the in-laws). More often than not others before you have already gathered family data. You should write a letter, make a personal visit, or telephone survey to find out about such persons and what information is already collected.

**FINDING DISTANT RELATIVES** - Before launching your research program in Libraries and Archives, search for distant relatives who may have already performed research. Advertise in the local genealogical bulletins (city, county, or state) where your ancestors lived. The most widely circulated genealogical magazine (which also specializes in getting people together who are working on the same families).

**CHURCH RECORDS** - A few churches have records of important events in the lives of members, but many do not. Investigate the possibility of finding genealogical data in the records of the church to which your ancestors belonged. Even if the church no longer exists, some neighboring church may have the first records (often the last secretary - it is well worth the search).

**BIRTH, MARRIAGE, and DEATH RECORDS** - Some States began to keep records of birth and death earlier than others, but for most of the United States birth and death registration became a requirement around the turn of the century, about 1890-1915. NOTE: Arkansas began keeping these records about 1914 (but many are not found, until much later). Write: Bureau of Vital Statistics - State Health Department, 4815 W. Markham, Little Rock, AR 72205 - ONLY if you know the month and year! then you will possibly receive a CANNOT FIND notice! Also there is a fee for the search (and they keep that fee, for the search - about \$3.) Before that time these events may be found recorded generally only in church records, family Bibles (some time in newspapers, along with the other news items, often hidden). Marriages will be found recorded in most counties, dating often as early as the establishment of the county. NOTICE - remember the counties were not all established at the same time (you might also look in the next county, and for sure the county - the present county was established from!)

**DEEDS & WILLS** - Records of property acquisition and disposition can be good sources of genealogical data. Such records are normally in the county courthouses. DEEDS are in the Circuit Clerk's office. WILLS are in the County Clerk's office. Often the earliest county records or copies of them are also available in State Archives.

**FEDERAL RECORDS** - The National Archives in Washington, D. C., has records of use in genealogical research. The Federal census made every 10 years since 1790 is a good source. (1790, 1800, 1810, 1820, 1830, 1840, 1850, 1860, 1870, 1880, (1890 was burned, and is not available) and 1900). The census records are also available on microfilm in the National Archives' regional archives branches located in 11 metropolitan areas throughout the county. Write: General Services Administration, National Archives & Records Service, Washington, D. C. 20408 for descriptive leaflet available, upon request. The National Archives also has military service and related records, passenger arrival records (again, a near date is necessary to search here!) and others.

**CONFEDERATE RECORDS** - Will not be found in the Washington office. They were not Federal Records. Look for these in the State Archives. Arkansas has many records (but you will need to search these, or hire a professional researcher). History Commission Office, 2nd Floor (in the large building directly back of the present Arkansas State Capitol Building, in Little Rock).

**LIBRARIES, SOCIETIES, ARCHIVES** - Visit the State, Regional, and local institutions in your area. Libraries, historical and genealogical societies, and archival depositories are all good sources for genealogical and family history data. In Arkansas - start at the History Commission FIRST. (please find address under CONFEDERATE RECORDS). The old newspapers are on microfilm, card file on various subjects, all Census records for the entire United States from - 1790 to 1880 are on microfilm, Census of 1890 - 97% of the schedules were destroyed by fire in 1921 (one entire wing of a building in Washington, D.C. was destroyed). Content was similar to that for 1900 census. 1900 census for Arkansas, is on microfilm: Address (street & house numbers in large cities) relationship to head of family: color or race (W-white, B-black (negro or negro descent), Ch-Chinese, Jp-Japanese, and In-Indian); month & year of birth; age at last birthday; marital status (single, married, divorced, widowed); number of years married to present husband; number of children of wife; number of children living; place of birth of person and parents (state or country only); citizenship; if foreign born, year of immigration, and number of years in United States; citizenship status if over 21 (A1-alien, Pa-declaration of intent has been filed, Na-naturalized); occupation; education - can read, write, and speak English; ownership of home, (O-owned, R-rented); whether a home (H) or a farm (F); and whether free (F) or mortgage (M). Separate schedules were prepared for institutions, military establishments, and Indian reservations.

**COURTHOUSE RECORDS** - Please hesitate to ask the people in the various offices anything about Genealogical problems you may have. Those people are not paid to know about genealogy! They are paid to take care of the present day records, and there are many different records today! Between the phone calls they have about (?????) and the people who seem to always have the wrong office, then to try to record the important information from very young, nervous couples (who are making arrangements to marry) etc. We are very lucky here in Arkansas (thus far) most of the records are still available and may be searched, by researchers. Some few Courthouses have burned, but then many times all is not lost, and requests were often made to "please come and record your records, again", after many early courthouse fires.

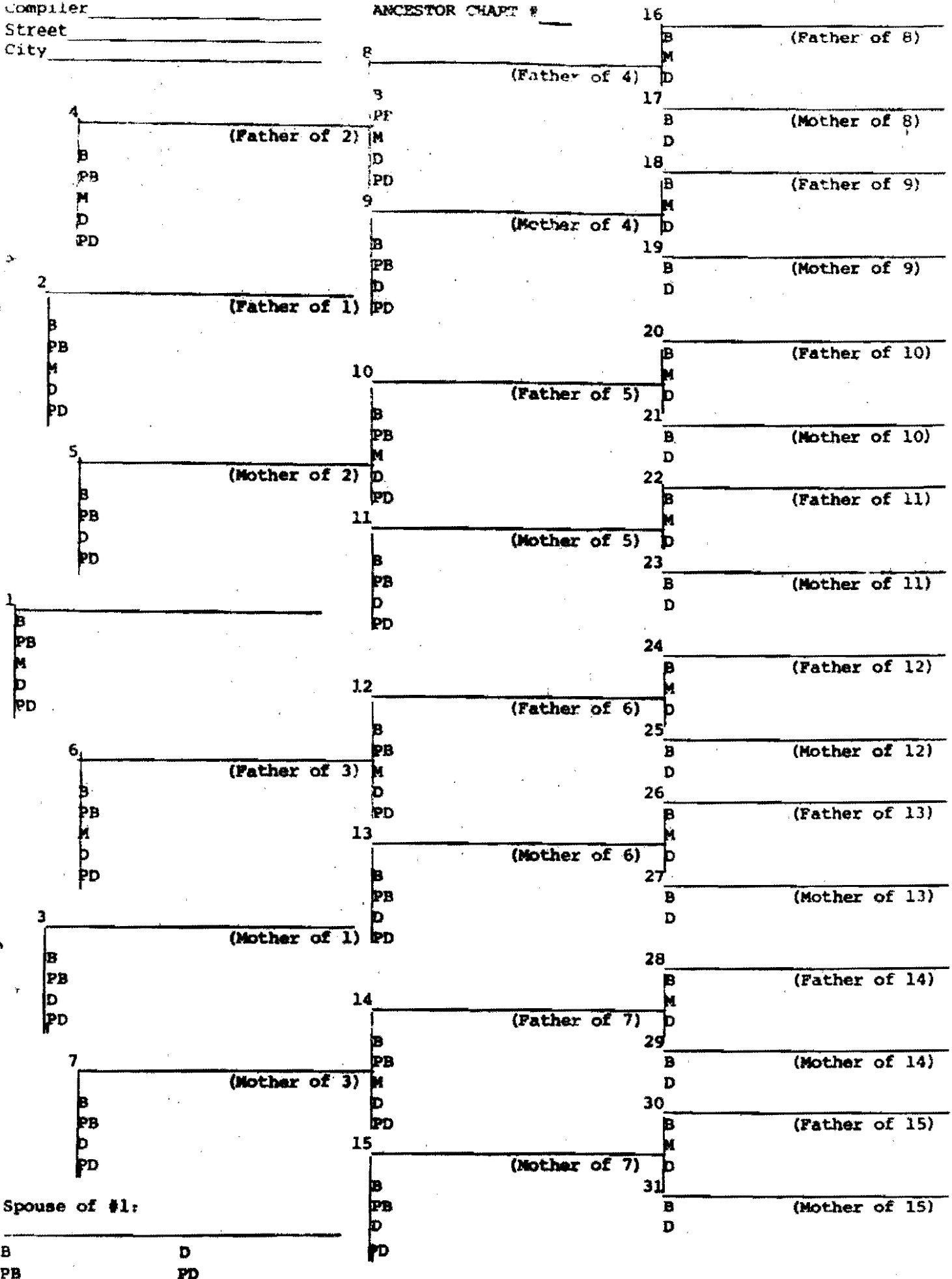

**BEGIN WITH NUMBER ONE** and continue as far as possible. Use only the information you know is correct (genealogical researchers document everything possible, a guess could cause a great many mistakes for many years).

**SEND YOUR CHARTS TYPED** ready to photo-copy. There is a great chance of error, when Charts are re-typed by anyone not familiar with your line. We do not have enough volunteers to furnish a typing service.

**REMEMBER THIS IS AN ADDITIONAL PROJECT!** Great contacts are made thru these published ANCESTOR CHART VOLUMES. Others working on these same surnames may contact you. Others may have more information in their files (many have researched genealogical records for many years. Everyone is encouraged to write, even if you can only offer a tiny clue - might help a break-thru to several more generations.

**WE CANNOT SEARCH** other ANCESTOR CHART VOLUMES FOR YOUR SURNAMES. We can furnish a list of researchers, who will search (for a fee) for you.

**YOU MIGHT ENCLOSE** A Self addressed stamped envelope, with your Charts (we will notify you when your Chart is published). **REMEMBER** not more than 4 Charts are published in any one Volume. (Often only one - we are trying to make contacts for many - not publish the records for only one family). So more than one S.A.S.E. may be necessary. Also **REMEMBER** the ANCESTOR CHARTS and the FAMILY GROUP SHEET VOLUMES are published in separate volumes.

We do not have enough volunteers to furnish typing service. Also, please do not write , and request a change be made, on your chart.

REMEMBER, this is an additional project! The idea is - great contacts are made thru these published Family Group Sheet Volumes. Others, researching these same SURNAMES may contact you with more information on various lines, you might be helped in various ways. Everyone is encouraged to contact others, working on the same SURNAME (just a small clue, may link several generations).

FILL all spaces as completely as possible. Your original will be photo-copied. Send us the original (you keep the copy). Originals make better photo-copies, and these will be valuable for many years. A poor copy will not reproduce well.

DO NOT USE A MARRIAGE DATE LATER THAN 1920 (we would like to publish our earlier records first).
