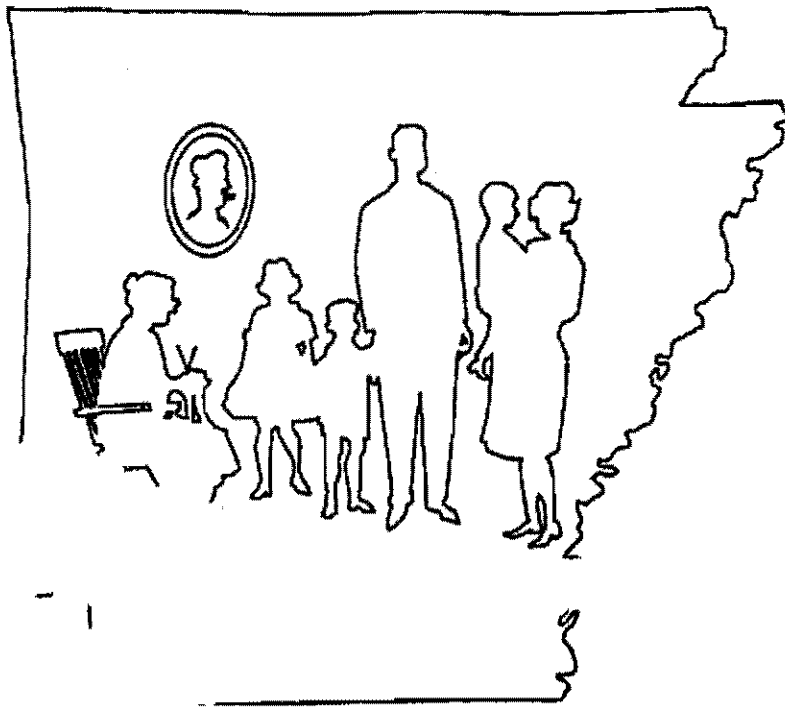

Caveat Emptor

A news release sent by J. Carlyle Parker, Chair, Genealogy Committee of the History Section of the Reference and Adult Services Division of the American Library Association, 2116 N. Denair Ave., Turlock, CA 95380, indicates a series of family newsletters being published by The Family News Network, 250 Coolidge St., Midvale, UT 84047; or at 3129 S. Dayton Ct., Denver, CO 80231; or at 1181 S. Parker Rd. #102, Denver, CO; and some using mailing permits from Greenwood Village, CO; or Englewood, CO, at \$7.00 per year, eight and a half by eleven inches, stapled in one corner, containing about 12 pages, half of which are so general they could apply to any family. A family name is inserted here and there to appear to relate to a specific family. The only specific relation to one family is a brief quote referenced to Eldon [sic] Smith's New Dictionary of American Family Names (Harper and Row, 1973). Elsdon Coles Smith was an authority on American names. One issue contained an unauthorized duplicated map from a Harvard University Press 1980 publication. One surname used is Vandeventer, i.e. Vandeventers Since The Civil War; Who's Who in the Vandeventer [or other family name]. Mr.Parker quotes a genealogist's letter to the publisher: "I am interested in learning more about my family, not a 'generic' newsletter telling how to do genealogy."

Certificates of Arkansas Ancestry Report

The following people have been issued Certificates of Arkansas Ancestry since publication of *The Arkansas Family Historian*, June 1992. Listed are the recipients' name, ancestor's name, county in which the ancestor lived, and the earliest date of Arkansas residence.

Application blanks are still available from me, Desmond Walls Allen, 99 Lawrence Landing Road, Conway, AR 72032 -- send 52 cents postage to cover mailing costs. An application booklet may be photocopied, so it's only necessary to order one. This is an on-going project -- there is no "expiration date."

I am very pleased with the quality of the applications we have received. They are very well done, sources are carefully noted, and usually more documentation is submitted than just the document that proves Arkansas residency. All of the material submitted is being filed and we hope someday to make the information available to researchers in some form.

From the letters received, these certificates are being used to honor special folks at family reunions, as birthday and Christmas gifts, for grandchildren's scrapbooks, and for other reasons than just personal satisfaction.

If you have already ordered your application booklet, take another look at it -- it isn't as difficult as you think.

Excerpts From The 1881 Acts of Arkansas

Genealogists are always seeking new research sources and knowledgeable researchers know there is no end to the possible sources one can use in genealogy. The Acts of Arkansas are a source that few genealogists use.

The Arkansas General Assembly has created a lot of data over the past couple of centuries, and, although much of that data is pretty much devoid of interest, the General Assembly occasionally addressed issues of interest to genealogists. Conveniently, the acts were printed after each session and are generally accessible to the genealogist. Some large libraries in Arkansas have a set of these acts, and the Supreme Court Library in Little Rock, Arkansas is an excellent place to examine the entire set. (Genealogists in other states should be able to locate the acts for their state in a large library or legal library in that state.)

Even the entries not specifically genealogical in nature can be of use to the genealogist. For example, one can find the acts revising or creating county boundary lines, setting forth the laws pertaining to marriage or taxes for each time period, and acts and resolutions of general interest that add to your cultural knowledge of the times.

I purchased the Arkansas volume for 1881 a few years ago at a used book sale. [Full citation: Acts and Resolutions of the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas, Passed at the Session held at the Capitol, in the City of Little Rock, Ark., commencing on the 10th day of January 1881, and ending on the 19th day of March 1881 (Little Rock: Mitchell & Bettis, State Printers, 1881.)] In the interests of exciting interest among genealogists not familiar with this source, I have extracted a few of the interesting entries from this one volume. Each volume has items of similar interest.

Concurrent Resolutions of the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas, Passed at the Session Held at the Capitol, in the City of Little Rock, 1881; No. IV, pp. 216-217.

Concurrent Resolution Declaring the Proper Pronunciation of the name of the State.

Preamble.

Whereas, Confusion of practice has arisen in the pronunciation of the name of our State; and it is deemed important that the true pronunciation should be determined for use in oral official proceedings.

And Whereas, The matter has been thoroughly investigated by the State Historical Society, and the Eclectic Society of Little Rock, which have agreed upon the correct pronunciation, as derived from history, and the early usage of the American immigrants.

Be it therefore resolved by both houses of the General Assembly, That the only true pronunciation of the name of the State, in the opinion of this body, is that received by the French from the native Indians, and committed to writing in the French word representing the sound; and that it should be pronounced in three syllables, with the final "s" silent, the "a" in each syllable with the Italian sound, and the accent on the first and last syllables—being the pronunciation formerly, universally, and now still most commonly used; and that the pronunciation with the accent on the second syllable with the sound of "a" in man, and the sounding of the terminal "s," is an innovation, to be discouraged.

Private Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas, Passed at the Session Held at the Capitol, in the City of Little Rock, 1881; No. VII., pp. 205-206.

An Act for the benefit of Charles Lewis and Rachel W. Hervey.

Preamble.

Section

- 1 Vests property of the late Jane Lewis in Charles Lewis and Rachel W. Hervey.
- 2 Administrator to turn over property after payment of debts.
- 3 When in force.

Whereas, Jane Lewis, of Conway county, died in the year 1880, leaving no heirs;

And Whereas, For several years before her death she declared her intention to will all her property to her step-son, Charles Lewis, and her step-daughter, Rachel W. Hervey, as a reward for their fidelity and dutiful behavior;

And Whereas, The said Jane Lewis was prevented, by her sudden and unexpected death, from making a will; and therefore,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas:

Section 1. That all the property and estate of the said Jane Lewis, which belonged to her at the time of her death, both real and personal, and the proceeds thereof, be vested absolutely in Charles Lewis and Rachel W. Hervey, of Pope county.

Sec. 2. That the administrator of the said Jane Lewis, after the payment of the debts probated against her estate, and the expenses and costs of administration, be and he is hereby required to deliver said estate to Charles Lewis and Rachel W. Hervey, of Pope county, and take the receipts of the said Charles Lewis and Rachel W. Hervey, which shall be taken as valid and sufficient vouchers in the settlement of said estate.

Sec. 3. That this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved, March 23rd, 1881.

Private Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas, Passed at the Session Held at the Capitol, in the City of Little Rock, 1881; No. I., p. 197.

An Act to appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars to pay for the expenses of the last sickness and burial and marking of the grave of Hon. John S. Williams, Senator from the 5th Senatorial District.

Preamble.

Section

1 Appropriates \$500, Funeral Expenses.

2 When in force.

Whereas, The Hon. John S. Williams, of Washington county, departed this life, in the service of the State; And whereas, It was his request to have his remains interred at the State capital, if he

should die in the State's service; And whereas, It is but just for the State to pay the expenses attending the last sickness of her servants, in active discharge of their duty, and to decently inter them; therefore,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas:

Section 1. That the sum of five hundred dollars, be appropriated out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the last illness, burial and marking the grave of the Hon. John S. Williams, of the county of Washington, Senator from the 5th Senatorial District; and that Hon. Jacob Frolich, Secretary of State, is hereby authorized to draw and disburse the said sum of money for the said purpose.

Sec. 2. That this act shall take effect from and after its passage.

Approved, January 29th, 1881.

Private Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas, Passed at the Session Held at the Capitol, in the City of Little Rock, 1881; No. II., p. 198.

An Act for the Relief of E. T. McConnell, as Sheriff and Collector of Johnson county, Arkansas, and the Securities [Sureties] on his Official Bond.

Preamble.

Section

1 Relieved from payment of certain moneys.

2 Takes effect from passage.

Whereas, E. T. McConnell, late sheriff and ex-officio collector of the State and county revenues of Johnson county, Arkansas, did, on the 21st day of November, 1879, execute his bond as such collector, with Jordan E. Cravens, J. P. Mitchell, Jno. C. Hill, William W. Floyd, Robert R. Mourland, William Allen, Wm. R. Rogers, H. M. Jackson, Jno. F. Hill, R. D. Pennington, A. M. McKennon, Wm. Whittle and H. W. West, as his securities thereon; and,

Whereas, On the 12th day of March, 1880, he had collected several thousand dollars of the revenue of said county and State, and had placed one thousand dollars of the same in the fire-proof

safe of Capt. J. C. Hill, of Clarksville, Arkansas, for safe keeping; and,

Whereas, On the 12th night of March, 1880, the said safe was broken open and robbed of several thousand dollars, together with said thousand dollars deposited by the said E. T. McConnell, sheriff as aforesaid, which said money belonged at the time to the sinking fund of the State of Arkansas; therefore,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas:

Section 1. That the said E. T. McConnell, sheriff as aforesaid, and his securities [sureties], be and they are hereby relieved from the payment to the Treasurer of the State of Arkansas the said sum of one thousand dollars.

Sec. 6 [sic]. That this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved, March 3rd, 1881.

Private Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas, Passed at the Session Held at the Capitol, in the City of Little Rock, 1881; No. III., p. 199.

An Act For the Relief of Lewis Amis, As Treasurer of Dallas county, Arkansas.

Preamble.

Section

1 Treasurer of State directed to re-issue certain State scrip.

2 In force from passage.

Whereas, On the night of the fourth of April, 1880, the safe of Lewis Amis, as Treasurer of Dallas county, Arkansas, was blown open by burglars, and the sum of one thousand and ninety-seven dollars in State scrip, belonging to the school fund of Dallas county, was stolen therefrom,

And Whereas, The original package containing said State scrip has been recovered by said Lewis Amis, in such a defaced and mutilated condition as to render it unfit for circulation;

And Whereas, Said package, in its defaced and mutilated condition, has been surrendered to the Treasurer of the State; therefore,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas:

Section 1. That the Treasurer of the State of Arkansas is hereby authorized and directed to re-issue to Lewis Amis, as Treasurer of Dallas county, the sum of one thousand and ninety-seven dollars, for the benefit of the school fund of Dallas county.

Section 2. That this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved, March 5th, 1881.

Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas; Passed at the Session Held at the Capitol, in the City of Little Rock, A.D. 1881; Public Law No. XXVIII, p. 45.

An Act to Change the Boundary Line between Marion and Baxter counties.

Section

1 Changes line between counties.

2 Conflicting laws repealed; act in force from passage.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas:

Section 1. That the boundary line between Marion and Baxter counties, be, and the same are hereby changed, and that all that territory embraced in section one, township seventeen north, of range fourteen west, be detached from Marion county, and attached to Baxter county, and become and form a part of the territory of said Baxter county.

Sec. 2. That all laws or parts of laws, in conflict with this act, be repealed, and this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved, March 9th, 1881.

The Christian Church at Porteau [Poteau?] sends Christian salutation, Greeting:

At a regular Meeting of the Church at Pro-teau on the 22d day of August AD 1858 The case of our beloved brother Thomas Crenshaw was called and ordained to the work of the ministry, and --- is --- (marked through) therefore by us recommended to the Christian fellowship, and regard of all the holy brethern.

Sylvania Cemetery

Sylvania Cemetery is located in NW 1/4 Section, Township 4? N, Range 9 West, in Lonoke County, Arkansas. It is six miles east of Cabot on Hwy 321 adjacent to the Sylvania Presbyterian Church.

Research into this cemetery reveals the richness of early Arkansas history with birth dates on tombstones dating from the 1770s. Founders are noted for the Sylvania Presbyterian Church, the second oldest Presbyterian church in Arkansas.

Many of the older tombstones are deteriorated or have been destroyed. Some of the information on the following lists has been taken from the gravestones, while other information has been given by family members or secured from Bible records.

This list is divided into two parts: an alphabetical listing to facilitate finding the name of the person; then a listing that has been organized according to location and row in the cemetery. Note the map on the following page to clarify cemetery sections A, B, C and D.

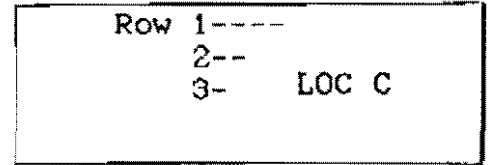
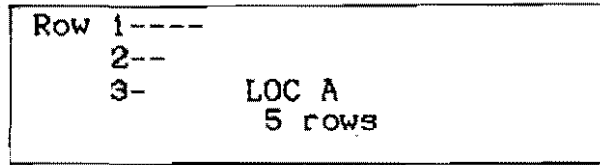
One of the saddest stories we have ever had to relate is the one which occurred east of Des Arc last Sunday evening when Mr. Will Crutcher, one of Prairie County's best farmers, drowned himself and four of his small children in Colotche Bay. The children, two boys and two girls, ages 2, 4, 7, and 9, wee drowned at their father's hand. He then buried himself into the water. His wife and two older children were at church when the tragedy occurred. The father and his children were buried together in the family burial grounds in that vicinity. Mr. Crutcher had been in ill health, it was reported, and concerned about what would happen to his children at his death.

Marais Des Cygnes Massacre Prairie County, AR

Great Grand-daughter of Charles C. Snider

Charles Cooper H. Snider and his wife, Matilda Osteen Snider, left their home in Effingham, Illinois, some time between 1856 and 1858 to travel west in hopes of getting a land grant. The cost of farm land in Illinois was too expensive. Snider had a friend, Michael Robertson, who had gone west to Kansas. So Snider decided to visit Robertson to learn more about Kansas farm land.

Kansas (from 1854-1861) was the scene of a bitter struggle to determine whether the territory should enter the union as a slave or free state. Numerous instances of lawlessness occurred. Men were attacked, beaten, and some were killed, often for no reason except their view on slavery.

The leader of one pro-slavery band was Charles A. Hamilton, a native of Georgia who came to Kansas as a border ruffian to make the territory a slave state. On May 19, 1858, some 30 men under Hamilton's leadership crossed into Kansas, arriving at Trading Post about 9:00 a.m. going from house to house taking men prisoner. Among the eleven men taken were Michael Robertson and Charles Snider. They were forced into a ravine where they were lined up and shot. Five men were killed, including Snider's friend Robertson. Snider was one of the five injured, and one man was not hurt but feigned death until the ruffians rode away. Hamilton's men rode back across the Kansas-Missouri border. Only one of Hamilton's men was caught and hanged for this crime. His name was William Griffith of Bates County, Missouri.

The victims of the Marais Des Cynges Massacre became martyrs and the incident made people all over the country more aware of the inevitability of war. The State would be called "bleeding Kansas."

Charles Snider recovered from his wounds and went back to Illinois. Later he and his family moved to Arkansas by wagon, steamboat, and train. They settled north of Carlisle in Prairie County.

Charles Snider died in 1896 and Matilda in 1887. They are buried in the Center Point Cemetery near Hazen, AR. They had ten children. Three of them died very young, and the others are listed here.

At the site of the Marais Des Cynes Massacre (Trading Post Kansas) a memorial park was built and there is a large monument in honor of the victims of the massacre. Also a museum is nearby showing the relationship between this incident and John Brown's involvement in the pre-war struggle.

On May 19, 1990, the Massacre was re-enacted and a memorial service was held to honor the victims and their families. Descendants of each of the eleven families was recognized and asked to speak.

A FIRE! !

Destruction Unprecedented!
Four Houses Destroyed and a Loss of \$62,640

A most destructive fire occurred at this place this morning. The fire alarm was sounded at 4:30, and all rushed to the scene of action. It was found to be the store of E. W. Clapp & Co. The fire soon communicated to Cowan & Co, and from that to Taylor & Hickerson. The fire then communicated to the Institute building occupied by Mrs. Maxwell, milliner, the Guard printing office, the Masonic, Off-Fellows and Knights of Honor Lodges, and by Simon Adler. The Institute building, being of brick, was the last to catch, although next to Clapp & Co's. every effort was made to save the Institute building, but water seemed to have no effect upon the raging demon. The flames lit up the whole earth, and scattered destruction in its wake. The south side of Main street was at one time in imminent danger. Attention was next directed to H. C. Smith's. It was only by almost super-human efforts the building was saved from the flame. As soon as the floors had burned out in the Institute building the east wall fell in, crushing in the side room of H. C. Smith's.

Here we have the saddest and most heart-rending part to tell. Messrs. C. L. Gorsuch, Jo. Price, Ed. Maxfield, Dick Kinman, Tom Joblin and a negro man were in the room when the wall fell on it. Mr. Gorsuch was

BURIED IN THE DEBRIS,

and killed instantly!. John Joblin was knocked insensible and is now lying at the point of death, while the rest were badly hurt. Mr. Gorsuch must have been dead nearly an hour before it was discovered.

His death sent a thrill of sorrow into the heart of every one. He was one of our best and most substantial citizens. His loss is irreparable.

The fire was the

WORK OF AN INCENDIARY,

as it originated about the middle of E. W. Clapp & Co.'s house and was set from under the floor. The devil incarnate, whoever he may be, deserves the severest punishment known to humans.

THE LOSS,

so far as we have been able to learn, was: E. W. Clapp & Co., entire stock and books, \$14,000; insured in Memphis companies for \$4,000. Cowan & Co. - a good deal of the stock was saved; loss about \$1800; insured for \$3500. M. A. Wycough, building occupied by E. W. Clapp & Co., \$1500; insured in Phoenix for \$500. Wycough & Long, building occupied by Cowan & Co, \$1500; insured in Phoenix for \$500. Taylor & Hickerson, stock and building, \$7200 (a good portion of the stock saved); insured in Phoenix for \$3800; T. R. Taylor, dwelling, \$800; no insurance. Masonic Lodge \$500; Odd-Fellows Lodge \$500; Knights of Honor, loss small. Simon Adler, stock and building, \$32,000; a good portion of the stock was saved; insured in St. Louis and New York companies for \$10,000. H. C. Smith, loss about \$2500; insured in the Phoenix \$1000, Aetna \$4500. Guard office \$1000; no insurance. Mrs. Maxwell, about \$40. John McDowell, household furniture, about \$300.

Everybody worked like Trojans, and it is only due to this that more of the town was not burned.

The funeral of Mr. C. L. Gorsuch will take place tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock.

German-English Genealogical Dictionary by Ernest

Thode, 318 pp., paperback, 1992, \$29.95, plus \$3.00 s/h. Published by Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc. 1001 N. Calvert St., Baltimore, MD 21202. This book is designed for the family researcher who has little or no knowledge of German but who nevertheless needs to make a translation of German language documents. The dictionary covers thousands of German terms and defines them in single words or brief phrases. All words, symbols, and abbreviations in the dictionary were chosen on the basis of their association with genealogy, having been noted in church records, civil registration records, family correspondence, journals, ships' passenger lists, and emigration records. In conjunction with a standard German-English dictionary, the user of this work should be able to make a word-by-word translation of any German document and understand it. (BJM)

Royalty for Commoners by Roderick W. Stuart, 412 pp., indexed, cloth binding, 2nd ed. 1992, \$30.00 plus \$3.00 s/h. Published by Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1001 N. Calvert St., Baltimore, MD 21202. This book documents the complete known genealogy of John of Gaunt, son of King Edward III and Queen Philippa. Any commoner who can connect their own family lineage to that of John of Gaunt can now be shown to share the same basic royal heritage as the most noble knight - the complete heritage, not just the Plantagenet ascent. This is the usual lineage through which a commoner can enter the domain of European royalty. The amateur genealogist interested in his own royal and noble ancestry will doubtless find many new and interesting names to add to his pedigree charts. The book represents some of the finest scholarship of the last century. (BJM)

These invaluable records are listed alphabetically by the name of the deceased, listing death and birth dates, spouse and parent, when given, and place of interment. There are 172 pages listing 12,362 records. This follows Volume 1 of Gross Funeral Home Records, covering 18 April 1874 to 30 May 1921 (\$16.00) also published by Stephens. (BJM)

[Hot Springs, AR: the authors 1992] A tremendous amount of genealogical information is found in these early newspaper accounts which are a boon to Arkansas researchers, particularly those in the Southwestern part of the State. These people lived primarily in Clark County, although there are frequent mentions of people from surrounding areas. In addition to the names of the deceased, the entries also include in many cases, the birthdate and former residence of the deceased, names of survivors, parents, and children, names of ministers, places of death and interment; citations to the date, page and column number are given for those who wish to search the original notice. Allen Syler has made a significant contribution to genealogical research in the Clark County area by placing these marvelous records in a single source for researchers and Bobbie McLane has added greatly to her ever-growing, exceptional listing of Arkansas research materials. They are Brushy Creek, Clear Spring, Fork Shoals, Gowensville (Cross Roads), Milford, Mountain Creek, Reedy River (Head of Enoree) Standing Springs, Tyger (Concord, Head of Tyger River), and Washington. The index has almost 18,000 entries covering some 5,500 names. Blacks as well as whites attended these churches and some slave/owner relationships were recorded. There are deaths, spousal identities, maiden names, etc. Considering the relative scarcity of personal data available to genealogists prior to the 1850 census, this book provides access to a large amount of source material heretofore little known. (BJM)

Index of Obituaries and Death Reports Appearing in The Arkansas Gazette 1923 by Oscar G. Russell, CAE, 506 Loop Road, North Little Rock, AR 72116. 8,165 entries, spiral binding \$45, hardbound \$60. [No. Little Rock, AR: the author, 1992] With no access to any sort of index for Arkansas death records, Mr. Russell's continuing efforts in abstracting this data from newspapers are very important for family historians. The books present the material both in alpha order by name and by city name. The ages of the deceased persons are given and the *Gazette* citation. (BJM)

Searcy County, Arkansas Cemeteries, Book I by Bobbie June Cash Mays, PO Box 149, Marshall, AR 72650; \$22.50 plus \$2.50 p/h; spiral-bound, 170 pages. [Marshall, AR: the author, 1992] Through the years, Bobby Mays and her mother, Ira Nix Cash, have inventoried most of the cemeteries in Searcy County so we welcome publication of these valuable records. Some cemeteries have been abandoned, some stones lost, since these records were made -- these may be the only records available. Book I contains Bear Creek, Pleasant Grove, Sulphur Springs, Jones-Sims, Kilburn or Chinquapin, Grandview, Rambo or Mainord, Cane Branch, Slay, Holder Creek, Turney, Mt. Hersey, McNair, Hamilton, Narrows, Nubbin Hill or Caid, Cedar Creek - Rose Family, Love, Silver Hill, Glenco, McMahan, Whiseant, Hall, Chinquapin, Old Leslie, Stone-Keeling, Gilbert, Henley, Lawrence, and Watts Cemeteries. Two additional volumes are in preparation. Much to Bobby's credit, the lists for each cemetery are not alphabetized - an index follows each cemetery. (DWA)

Index to the Tract Books for Searcy County, Arkansas 1836-1900 by Bobbie June Cash Mays, PO Box 149, Marshall, AR 72650; \$10.00 plus \$1.50 p/h; spiral-bound, 34 pages. [Marshall, AR: the author, 1991] Land records are especially valuable to genealogists and one segment of those records is the tract books, large volumes recording land sales by the federal government in geographic order. This index lists full name, year, section, range, and township, and makes using the tract books much easier. (See review of *PGA Newsletter* on same topic.) (DWA)

Searcy County Bibliography, by James J. Johnston, 2333 Oaks Drive, Fayetteville, AR 72703; \$5.00 plus \$1.25 p/h, Arkansas residents please add 4 1/2% sales tax; softbound, 33 pages. [Fayetteville, AR: the author, 1992] Attention Searcy County researchers: have you wished for a compilation of everything of interest to genealogists listed in scholarly fashion and even indexed? It's available! This handy book lists books in and out of print, arranged by topic, for Searcy County with some helpful resources for surrounding counties. We are fortunate a competent, respected historian such as Mr. Johnston has taken time to compile and organize this material. (DWA)

PGA Newsletter - Special Issue on Tract Books, available from Professional Genealogists of Arkansas, PO Box 1807, Conway, AR 72032, \$3.00 postpaid. The July 1992 issue of the *PGA Newsletter* provides explicit instructions for using the segment of land records called the tract books. There are two sets of tract books for Arkansas - one available at the Arkansas History Commission and through the LDS Library System; the other available at the Bureau of Land Management and through the LDS Library. A tract book worksheet form, sample page, land office map, tract book coverage map, and a bibliography will assist researchers in understanding and using these records. (Subscription to the *PGA Newsletter* is \$12 per six bi-monthly issues.) (BJM)

Sullivan County, Tennessee, Cemeteries by Karen L. Sherman; published by Heritage Books [1991], 1540-E Pointer Ridge Place, Ste. 300, Bowie, MD 20716; \$32.00 plus \$3.00 p/h; 219 pages, softbound. Seventy-nine cemeteries are included providing valuable records on former residents of this northeastern Tennessee county. There is an alphabetical list of the cemeter-

ies and a surname index in the book. Directions are given to about half the cemeteries. (DWA)

Old Land Records of Lawrence County, Alabama by Margaret Matthews Cowart, 7801 Tea Garden Road SE, Huntsville, AL 35802; \$23.00 postpaid; 444 pages, perfect bound. [Huntsville, AL: the author, 1991] Researchers interested in Alabama, origin of many of our Arkansas settlers, are indebted to Margaret Cowart for her excellent series on land records. This volume on Lawrence County is added to her volumes on Madison, Jackson, Morgan, Limestone, Colbert, Franklin and Marshall Counties. The federal tract books are faithfully transcribed in this excellent resource listing original entryman, land description, date of sale, certificate or warrant number, military act (if applicable), assignees, and other notations. Both the state set of tract books, the federal set, and a local set were used to compile this information. Maps, a full-name index and helpful explanatory material make this a valuable tool. An index search of the book is available for \$3.00 (applicable toward the purchase price of the book) plus a self-addressed, stamped envelope. (DWA)

Yellar Rag Boys: the Arkansas Peace Society of 1861 and Other Events in Northern Arkansas 1861-1865 by Luther E. Warren; published by Sandra L. Weaver, HC 75, Box 255, Witts Springs, AR 72686; 168 pages, \$12.00 plus \$2.00 p/h, softbound (\$27.00 plus \$2.00 p/h hardbound). [Witts Springs, AR: Sandra L. Weaver, 1992] Luther Warren was an interesting character, a newspaperman by trade, who collected information about the Peace Society which operated in north central Arkansas during the War Between the States. [See "Arkansas' 1861 Peace Society" by James J. Johnston, *Arkansas Family Historian*, 29 (March 1991): 13-29.] The materials collected by Mr. Warren include correspondence, maps, interview notes, news items, and other bits of information from official and unofficial sources. His manuscript, reflecting years of research, has finally been published by his great-granddaughter and represents an important contribution to the knowledge of this subject. Also included in the book are a photographic section on the Warren family and a list of Warren descendants. Surname index. (DWA)

Davidson County, Tennessee, County Court Records, 1799-1803 by Carol Wells; published [1991] by Heritage Books, 1540E Pointer Ridge

Place, Ste. 300, Bowie, MD 20716; \$20.00 plus \$3.00 p/h, 223 pages, softbound. This is the third in a series and represents an interesting body of information dealing with disputes, orphans, poverty, estates, wills, sales, apprentices, licenses, and other matters. The index to the book lists surnames, places, and organizations. (DWA)

Historic Districts of America: Region One - the South by Ralph W. Richardson; published [1987] by Heritage Books, 1540E Pointer Ridge Place, Ste. 300, Bowie, MD 20716; \$12.50 plus \$3.00 p/h, 239 pages, softbound. If you're planning a trip, this book will alert you to areas of historical, architectural, or cultural significance. Each listing gives a brief summary and the agency to contact for more information. (DWA)

From the Carolina Frontier to the Ozarks Bloody Ground, by B. G. Templeman, Route 2, Box 508, Terrell, TX 75160; \$15.95 plus \$2.50 p/h; 162 pages, softbound. [Terrell, TX: the author, 1992] This book is a historical novel based on a true story of the Templeman and Bruce families of South Carolina, Tennessee, and Arkansas. It chronicles their westward migration and almost total destruction. The story is a culmination of many years of historical research by the author - he visited the sites described in the book, examined public and private records, and interviewed historians and descendants. He wove the information into a highly-readable, touching novel. This isn't a traditional, scholarly family history - it's something altogether different and very interesting. (DWA)

Better Than Jewels by Jane Cox Farmer, PO Box 21292, Little Rock, AR 72221-1292; \$9.50, 120 pages, 28 photographs, softbound. An index of more than 170 families includes: Bridwell, Brockman, Bushnell, Cox, Hammond, Maxwell, Miller, Nunn, Packwood, Syberry/Sibray, Smith and Turner. This volume includes biographical sketches describing the life and times of the author's parents and ancestors, the result of twelve years research with some unusual techniques described. (BJM)

Cherokee By Blood: Records of Eastern Cherokee Ancestry in the U. S. Court of Claims, 1906-1910, Volume 8, Applications No. 20101 to 23800, by Jerry Wright Jordan, [1992], published by Heritage Books, 1540-E Pointer Ridge Place, Suite 300, Bowie, MD 20716, 489 pages, indexed, paper, \$25.00 plus \$3.00 p/h per order. Continuing this series, this is the 8th volume, listing

over 46,000 people who filed claims, detailed abstracts of application including verbatim transcriptions of affidavits by the applicants, their families and friends. The claims resulted from a 1904 million dollar judgment won by the Eastern Cherokees against the U. S. because of its violations of the treaties of 1835-36 and 1845. Since most of the applicants were descendants, who had to prove their descent, the quantity of genealogical data in these volumes is impressive. There are a number of applications, many rejected, filed from applicants, living in Arkansas, among them Jane Poindexter Clingman, Amity; Mary B. Wier, Greenfield; Andrew J. Wise, Lake City; James M. Burnett, Carley; H. T. Dillahunt, Burnville; & George Howard, Excelsior, AR, and others. (BJM)

Choctaw Claimants and Their Heirs by Oldbuck Press, 1025 Watkins St., Conway, AR 72032; 193 pages, fully indexed, \$26.00, softbound, \$34.00 hardbound. Over 16,000 names of all recorded claimants prior to 1889. Originally published by Robert D. Patterson Stationary Co., St. Louis, Missouri, in 1889. This work is very hard to locate in the original edition. Included is a complete alphabetical listing of all names, selected bibliography, listing of all treaties made between the United States and the Choctaw Nation, as well as instructions on how to locate the original records within the National Archives.

The Choctaw Academy by Oldbuck Press, 1025 Watkins St., Conway, AR 729032; 189 pages, fully indexed, \$24.00 softbound, \$32.00 hardbound. Established in 1825, this early Indian school, located in Scott Co., Kentucky, was the first major effort on the part of the Choctaw Nation to give the future leaders of the Nation a higher education. In existence for 15 years, the school was surrounded in controversy. A short history of the Academy is included in this work. These official government, individual and Indian Nation documents are a hidden treasure for most historical and genealogical researchers. Difficult to locate and not indexed in their original condition, this work is fully indexed and now made accessible to even the novice researcher.
